

NDRA Jersey Policy

The newmarket Ringette Association (herein referred to as RA) has made a significant investment in team jerseys in order to ensure players have a univerom that reflects the quality of the organization. Team Jerseys held by players run the risk of being misplaced, damaged or otherwise neglected. Each year the NRA assesses the condition of existing jerseys and assumes the expense of replacing damaged, misplaced or neglected uniforms. As such, the NRA must take steps to protect its investment.

The following policy is in place with regards to NRA jerseys:

- 1. Each team will be issued two (where appropriate) NRA approved sets of jerseys (one home and one away).
- 2. Each player will be issued specific jersey numbers to be worn for the entire season.
- 3. All players will wear only NRA approved jerseys during games.
- 4. The Head Coach (or designated alternate) of each team will distribute jerseys for games and/or practices.
- 5. The Head Coach (or designated alternate) of each team will ensure jerseys are laundered only as necessary jerseys should be turned inside out and washed in cold water.
- 6. Jerseys will be stored on hangers, in open air (so they breathe) after each use.
- 7. At the end of the season, jerseys must be collected by each team, and laundered, before being returned to the association.
- 8. All jerseys and other supplied equipment (i.e. first aid kits, goalie equipment, ring, pylons, etc.) remain the properly of the NRA.
- The Head Coach (or designated alternate) will return all equipment and jerseys supplied by the NRA to the NRA Equipment Coordinator at or before the Annual General Meeting. Failure to do so may result in a team being liable up to the full replacement cost of any missing or damaged jerseys.
- 10. It is recommended that all players obtain a practice jersey, preferably in NRA color schemes, to wear during practices and special courses (i.e. Power Skating) in order to prolong the life of an NRA jersey. Head coaches can require this in an individual team policy.
- 11. Ultimately the Head Coach is responsible for the collection and return of all jerseys in "good repair".
- 12. Name badges cannot be added to jerseys without the jerseys being purchased first.
