### Tryout Session Policies & Process - Important things to know:

- Players should report to check-in table **(at Cour #1)** 15 minutes prior to tryout/evaluation session.
- All players attending tryouts or evaluations **must be officially registered (with registration paid)** in the Northwest RAMP Registration System.
- Players must bring indoor shoes, **their own basketball** and water bottle to their session(s).
- Only select players will be invited back for Session 2.
- After Session 1, players will be told if they have been invited back for Session 2.
- After Session 2, final selections are made for placement on a Tier 1/2 team (13U & 15U only). Final selections will be posted online 24-48 hours after final session at **northwestbasketball.ca**
- Players that are not invited to Session 2 (or not selected for a Tier 1/2 team after Session 2) will be placed on a Northwest Community Team (Tier 3 and lower).
- Session 2 may or may not be needed in all categories. This will depend on the number and skill level of players attending Session 1.
- There is no Session 2 for 11U Boys & Girls. Evaluations are for the sole purpose of identifying and grouping players of similar skill levels.
- Northwest Basketball reserves the right to create (or not create) Tier 1/Tier 2 competitive teams based on the number and skill levels of players attending tryouts and evaluations.
- Players that may not be able to attend tryouts are still eligible for selection to play on Tier 1 or Tier 2 teams—provided they have been vetted or evaluated by Northwest Basketball. Northwest Basketball reserves the right to create and enter teams in the league seeding tournament to determine the skill level of teams using this process as an alternative to tryouts.
