



OMHA COVID-19 Policy

All minor hockey players are required to complete the Health Check questionnaire prior to any team function. This process can be set to be completed no less than 1 hour prior to the start of the scheduled activity. OMHA will use the Teamsnap which has the Health Check questions already on the app. **THIS MUST BE DONE FOR EACH AND EVERY TEAM ACTIVITY. Managers and coaches will be tasked with monitoring the Health Checks.**

Any player or coach which has not completed this process will be asked to leave the team function. The Health Check cannot be completed at the start of the activity.

If spectators are permitted, currently only at the younger levels (U7, U9, U11) with the expectations that the older divisions (U13, U15, U16, U18) will have the same benefits in the near future, they add their names to the Teamsnap availability list.

How to add your spectator:

- Press on the scheduled activity for that team and day
- Fill in the Health Check app for the child if the child cannot do it themselves
- A little blue "add" button pops up at the bottom of the screen, press that
- Add the name of the person who will be attending that activity

Concerning AHS, and as per Hockey Alberta updates to COVID reporting:

An individual is under no obligation to inform sport organization (OMHA) or other participants, coaches, officials, volunteers, etc.,

- Reason for missing practice or games
- If they are pursuing COVID test
- Or results of COVID test
- We have to respect privacy laws under the Alberta Health Information Act

AHS will conduct all investigations, and individuals are legally obligated to follow all AHS recommendations, and will be handled case by case.

AHS isolation guidelines change frequently so OMHA advises you to refer to AHS website for further information. We cannot stress enough how important it is to make decisions with the association in mind. Our coaches have been told to be lenient when it comes to kids missing because of symptoms. We all need to be flexible and work together to get through this.
