- **Intro to Hockey was introduced – ½ hockey**
 - **Year started out rough, no rules but more guidelines used**
 - **Difficulty for our teams based on mixing of ages**
 - **Year's end, I would say that we saw tremendous development in this age group**
- **Implemented Head Check as a means for injury follow through – couple guidelines surrounding Return to Play protocol.**
- **Fair Play Policy re-done. Incorporates all levels of play.**
- **By-Laws > at board level for approval before going to Hockey Alberta. One step closer.**
- **New Bus Travel Policy – more teams using buses than expected. Minor bugs but worked well.**

PLAYER MENTAL HEALTH & WELL-BEING

INITIATIVE

Okotoks Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) in collaboration with Dr. Caroline McDonald-Harker, Sociologist and Professor from Mount Royal University (MRU), will be implementing a player mental health and well-being initiative in the 2018-2019 season.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the player mental health and well-being initiative is to strengthen the physical, psychological, emotional and social health and well-being of OMHA players. The initiative will help: 1) identify the needs of players, 2) promote and support the healthy development of players, both physically and mentally, and 3) contribute to the development and implementation of resources, strategies, and best practices to support the positive and long-term health, well-being, and resilience of players.

The initiative will be piloted with all players in the Pee wee and Bantam Divisions (both male and female divisions), according to the following timeline:

TREASURER – AMANDA GERMAIN

Fiscal year end May 31, 2019

We started the process for jersey replacement with the Midget jerseys for the 2016/2017 season and continued with the replacement of the Bantam jerseys. The Novice Division was able to secure a new Sponsor for the division in the year 2018/2019 to help offset the jersey costs for the division and these were replaced this past 2018/2019 season. The Peeewe jerseys will be replaced for the 2019/2020 season and the atom division will be the last one to be replaced as needed and as funds allow.

We are proposing a \$5 fee increase for most divisions next year. Some highlights for registration this year:

- **There will be a 3% administrative fee added to the registration fee to offset the credit card processing charge**
- **Registration opens June 17 and closes July 21. Any registrations after registration closes are subject to a \$100 late registration fee, and only as space in the division allows.**
- **The payment deferral plan will continue as last year (50% of the registration fee will be due at the time of registration, additional 25% payment due on July 31, final 25% will be due August 31). Payment arrangements will be made through RAMP at the time of registration.**
- **Any payments that are not cleared by the credit card company will be subject to an Admin fee.**
