- 92% felt the coach is knowledgeable for the position

Fiscal year end May 31, 2021

- Registration will opened on June 20 and closes July 24. Any registrations after July 24th are subject to a \$100 late registration fee.
- U18 jerseys will be replaced this coming season.
- Able to secure a Casino which will take place September 12th & 13th.
- No Jersey's & Jeans again this year, but we were able to run a Rafflebox 50/50 which brought in income of \$7660 less fees to Rafflebox.
- Small increase in registration fees for the coming season. Fees for 2021 / 2022 was a large increase in an effort to help cover some of the deficit from the season shut down the year before due to Covid
- Huge thank you to our tournament organizers and their committee members! Great tournaments hosted this year with funds to teams for development and funds to the association.

- Male and Female Showcases in April – lots of feedback coming in to improve for next year
- Coach Selection process underway

CHALLENGES

- Retention/Recruitment of Senior Officials (18+ U15/U18 officials)

- Lack of 3 & 4 official games, due to low numbers majority of the hockey is going with only 2 officials. Impacts development
- Lack of funding for development of officials from Central Region & Hockey Alberta
- Lack of officials to help with the Mentoring & Supervision officiating - programs, slowing down the development of officials
- Official Burnout is happening earlier due to increased number of games officials are working every week
- Spectator and Coach verbal abuse
 - Worse this year in the lower levels- need to achieve zero tolerance (U13/ U11 Levels)
 - Affects retention of younger Officials and creates burnout of senior officials
