What is Mindful Wellness?

The Mental Health Initiative started in 2019 with a Mental Wellness Survey created by Dr. Caroline Harker-McDonald and her research team at Mount Royal University. The survey was distributed among OMHA and OOAA players to assess the players overall well-being. From there, the OMHA welcomed Amy Snyder (Parallel Youth Connections) to add a Mental Wellness component to their safety program.

The goal of the now "Mindful Wellness" Initiative, in addition to the physical component provided by the safety program, is to support both social and emotional well-being, and to ensure players have both physical and mental health balance to perform their best.

What is Mental Health?

Mental Health or Mental Wellness, refers to: "A person's condition with regard to their psychological, social and emotional well-being. It affects how we think, feel and act. It also helps us determine how we handle stress, relate to others and make choices. Mental health is important at every stage in life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood."

What can Mindful Wellness look like for your association or team?

Amy is currently primarily working with teams within OMHA, but has had some involvement with OOAA. To date for the 2022/2023 hockey season she has responded to over 60 reach outs from parents, coaches and players. Her involvement consists of individual and team session that are mindful, strength-based and empowering. These sessions address current themes or concerns while providing a safe, positive team environment. Some examples of these sessions are: Mental Health, Sports & Mental Health, Stigma, Social Media, Decision Making, Resilience, Perspectives, Team Positivity and Goal Setting.

Players have access to Amy's services whenever they need it, in accordance to the players preferred method of communication, and can book one to one sessions as well. All sessions are confidential.

"Any was an Integral component to our hockey season last year. It was no secret that our young players were struggling with their mental well-being after their return from COVID-19. As a coaching staff, we felt the necessary to bring in Amy as a resource to ensure our players mental health was looked after. Our players loved meeting with her as a team every two weeks, often feeling refreshed, supported, and ready to continue on with their busy week. We were pleased to find out that once our sessions with Amy started, our players felt like they could better manage this stress, while also feeling validated in their emotional responses. Additionally, the coaching staff could not ask for a better mental health lialson throughout the season. Amy always gave us 24-hour access to her, should we need to call from the road, set up an emergency session or individual meeting, or give us strategles on how to mediate our players overall mental well-being for that week, she was always easy to get into contact with. It was a tough season on all of us; however, Amy's unwavering support, knowledge, and guidance, allowed us to confidently continue forward, even in the toughest times. As a coaching staff, we belleve that mental health is a large aspect of the game and therefore, we could not be more excited to bring Amy back for her second season with the Radders!"

CHALLENGES

- Retention/Recruitment of Senior Officials (18+ U15/U18 officials)
- Retention of 3rd and 4th Year officials NEED MORE 16+ aged officials and more Moms & Dads to take up officiating to help with the UI5 & UI8 Age Groups
- Retention and recruitment of Female Officials (17 in total)
- Lack of 3 & 4 official games, due to low numbers majority of the hockey is going with only 2 officials. Impacts development
- Lack of funding for development of officials from Central Region & Hockey Alberta. ORA receives no funding from the CRRC for operations
- Hockey Alberta examining utilization of a "provincial assignor" for AEHL; implies higher costs as officials will travel from out of region
- Lack of officials to help with the Mentoring & Supervision officiating programs, restricting the development of officials
- Official Burnout is happening earlier due to increased number of games officials are working every week
- Spectator and Coach verbal abuse
 - Affects retention of younger Officials and creates burnout of senior officials

2023/24 Season

- 65% of this years players will be moving on to U9 next year. Okotoks demographics suggest that there will be a drop in younger players coming into junior U7 so registration will likely be down.
- Tim Hortons is moving towards a national jersey program where players will keep their jersey at the end of each season. This means they will be supplying brand new jerseys every year and it will eliminate the need for a U7 jersey return date.

Hello, my name is Jenn Gauthier and I have been nominated for Vice President of Player Development. I want to take a moment and thank those who nominated me for the position.

I have 2 kids in hockey, one in U9 and one moving into U13. We moved here a year and a bit ago from Tofield, which is east of Edmonton. My boys have been in hockey since they were 4 years old, and I have been volunteering within the associations since then.

I have over 7.5 years of volunteer experience in Minor Hockey. I started my volunteering journey as manager of my eldest's U7 team, the very first year he played. I soon became director for 3 years and then moved into the position of Vice President Off Ice for Tofield Minor Hockey (TMHA) for 2.5 years, until I moved to Okotoks.
