- Provided over 200+ hours of skill, strength and mental development over the course of the season

Registration Highlights

- 3% admin fee will continue to be added to credit card purchases to offset the credit card processing charges
- Registration opens June 22 and closes July 19, Any registration received after registration closes are subject to a \$100 late administration fee, and only as space allows
- Payment on the deferral plan will be permitted with credit card only registration, 1/3 will be due on registration, 1/3 due Aug 1, remaining 1/3 due Sept 1
- Any payments not cleared by the credit card company will be subject to an additional administrative fee.

2026/2027 season

- The U11/U13 jerseys were replaced for the 2025/26 season and the U15 and U18 jerseys will be replaced during next season
- We participated in a Casino in September 2025 at the Ace Casino. This provided \$60,000 in income that is used to offset registration fees for the next several years. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped during this 2 day period. Unfortunately, our next casino is not due until 2029
- Changes are being made to the U11 and U13 program relating to practice ice, which is reflected in the price difference on registration fees. During registration, the mixed players will pay the house registration fee. Once selected to the team, they will be given 72 hours to pay the additional fee. All fees for female programs in U11 and U13 will be assessed the travel fee which will be collected at registration.

Proposed Bylaw Change

Proposed Change - The amendment of Bylaw 13.1 (B) to read “The Association shall transfer the operation of the ‘AA’ and ‘AAA’ programs to the OAAA for the **U13-U18 divisions.”**

- This will help keep the costs down for families with players 10 and under
- The purpose of this proposed bylaw amendment is to formally clarify that the U7 and U11 divisions remain under the governance and operational oversight of the Okotoks Minor Hockey Association (OMHA) mainstream structure and are not to be incorporated into Elite Stream management.
- This proposal recognizes the unique developmental needs, operational priorities, and long term athlete development principles associated with the U7 to U11 age categories. While elite hockey pathways play an important role within the broader hockey system, these younger divisions serve as foundational stages of player growth and should remain focused on development and accessibility.
- The proposed amendment would help preserve a consistent and “development first” environment for players and families during the most critical stages of hockey participation and retention.



Resolution

- **BE IT RESOLVED** that the Okotoks Minor Hockey Association Bylaws be amended to include the following provision: the current bylaw 13.1 (B) which reads, “The Association shall transfer the operation of the ‘AA’ and ‘AAA’ programs to the OOAA.”, be changes to read “The Association shall transfer the operation of the ‘AA’ and ‘AAA’ programs to the OOAA for the U13-U18 divisions.”



Proposed Bylaw Addition

Proposed Addition- The purpose of this proposed bylaw amendment is to formally establish the position of Referee in Chief within the governance structure of the Okotoks Minor Hockey Association (OMHA). This addition reflects the evolving expectations and requirements being implemented across Alberta hockey associations under the direction and governance standards of Hockey Alberta.

Over the past several years, Hockey Alberta has increasingly emphasized the importance of direct association oversight, accountability, and administration of officiating programs within Minor Hockey Associations. As part of this provincial shift, many associations that previously operated under independent or semi-independent referee associations have transitioned officiating governance directly under the umbrella of their local minor hockey organizations.

This change is intended to create stronger alignment between officiating development, player development, coach accountability, risk management, and association governance standards. Hockey Alberta's direction has focused on ensuring that officiating programs operate consistently with the association's bylaws, policies, codes of conduct, and safety initiatives.



Resolution

- **BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Okotoks Minor Hockey Association Bylaws be amended to add the following Section 11.7:**



Resolution

11.7. Referee in Chief

- (a) The Executive Committee shall appoint the Referee in Chief, who shall be responsible for all matters relating to the referees needed for the Association.
- (b) The Referee in Chief shall be responsible for the following:
 - (i) Referee recruitment and retention
 - (ii) Referee development and certification
 - (iii) Officiating assignments
 - (iv) Discipline matters relating not officials
- (c) The Referee in Chief has the ability to recommend to the Executive Committee for their approval, additional members of a referee committee, which may include, without limitation the following:
 - (i) Assistant Referee in Chief
 - (ii) Assignor(s)
 - (iii) Development Coordinator
- (d) For greater certainty, the Executive Committee may create new roles/positions for the referee committee and may also amend/remove roles/positions for said committee.
