OOAA Ongoing Challenges Dan Laplante

Spring Tryouts

- 2025/26 Season Hockey Alberta moved to allow Minor Hockey Associations to run Spring tryouts with commitments to compete directly with CSSHL, HSL, PHL, FSL and JPHL etc.
- HA mandated that the tryouts be open to all players and not by invite only.
- This decision was made in February 2025. OOAA had to commit to Spring ice in late October 2024 with the Town of Okotoks.
- When this decision was announced OOAA picked up what little ice was available.
- The Town of Okotoks simply did not have enough available ice.
- Decisions by HA need to be in 3rd quarter of the calendar year to allow associations the opportunity to react and plan





OOAA Ongoing Challenges Dan Laplante

lce

- Critical ice shortages with the Town of Okotoks
- Multiple new user groups wanting access to prime-time ice which is putting pressure on the Town of Okotoks.
- The Town of Okotoks is focused on local youth being a priority
- 8 out of 11 OOAA teams are either draw zone or open borders.
- 3 daytime teams are supported by the local High Schools and billets
- Billeted players are not recognized as local youth by our Town
- OOAA has approached all of the draw zone associations requesting ice
- Foothills stepped up with one practice ice slot / week for U16AA in Blackie
- To support OOAA for the 2025-2026 season
- Hard internet line will need to be installed at the Murray if the leagues mandate Flo tv at the AA divisons

Tryout Details Lindsay Graw

- Tryout fees include jerseys, ice, trainers, referees, potential for green and white game, practices before final roster if applicable*
- Players do not have to tryout for AAA if they do not want to. Please register for the AA tryout in your division if you want your player to go straight to AA.
- All Okotoks players must register with OMHA prior to registering with OOAA. The only exception is signed AAA players. All signed AA players must register with OMHA.





Team Formation Fee Breakdown Lindsay Graw

- The fees vary between each team based on how many ice times the teams receive before final team formation.
- Items that are covered under team formation fees are:
- All practices
- Exhibition games
- Transportation if required.
- Tournament entry fees
- Trainer fees
- Referees if required are included
- Any additional oversized roster events





Ice Scheduling-Jamie Steer

- Jamie is entering 6th season as OOAA ice scheduler.
- Ice scheduling for next season is started and currently working through September with our main arenas (SSSR and the 3 town arenas, Centennial Green/Gold and Murray)
- AEHL/AFHL Game scheduling will be commencing shortly as they are looking for ice as soon as we can submit it.
- Full Conditioning and evaluation schedule has not officially been released but the dates are
- U15 Checking clinic August 11th and 12th
- Conditioning Camps August 14th to 27th
- Evaluations Starting August 20th and going until September 23rd (tentatively). U18/U16 AA Mixed can sometimes delay this finish.



OOAA Voting Procedure

Tryout and Schedule

Q- When are the tryouts we need to know to plan the final summer vacation days Q- What is happening with try outs? when are the dates for U18AA Raiders?

A- OOAA had to attend an ice user meeting with the Town of Okotoks on June 11, 2025. At this meeting the Town allocates ice and ice contracts to ALL user groups in Okotoks.

The OOAA ice scheduler could not start working on the CC and Tryout schedule until the ice contacts were released. Once the schedule has been completed, the Town must review and approve before OOAA can release the schedule to the public.

Registration will open on June 25th. The schedule will be posted prior to this date.





AGM Format

Q- Why are these meetings virtual and not in person?

For example, in 2024-2025 there was 213 players in our association. Represented by 196 families. 121 families have registered for this AGM. That is 62% of the membership.





Skills, Video and Academic

The skills, goalie development and academic support rooms are paid for by the association using revenue from CC and Tryouts. These costs are shared using all players that register for CC and Tryouts, not only the payers that make an OOAA teams.

Feedback

Q- Outline how all players (not just top 5-7) will receive feedback from OOAA coaches in 2025/2026?

A- Currently feedback is only given to the last 5-7 releases per team due to the shear number of players trying out and the time required to meet with everyone.

For example, at U17AAA/U18AAA we had 175 athlete's tryout during the Spring. If each player received a 5 minute exit interview the Coaching Staff would need to allocate 14.5 hours for exit interviews alone.

A-There are no long ID skates. Hockey Alberta has allowed association associations to run Spring Tryouts and offer commitments. The new board will be able to review this process going forward.

The 2025 Spring tryouts were challenged by the lack of ice available due to OOAA having to submit their ice to the Town in October. Hockey Alberta made the decision in February to add Spring tryouts. The Town did not enough additional available ice at this time that OOAA could purchase.

HA added Spring tryouts to compete with players leaving to alternative leagues, sanctioned and non sanctioned.

Association have to host an "open tryout" as per HA guidelines.
