## Season Outlook

- UI3AA Raiders is a draw zone team open to players from Blackie, Chestermere, High Country, Hussar, Foothills, Indus, Nanton, Okotoks, Rockyford, Siksika, Strathmore, Standard
- Pre-Season Tournament September 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> in Okotoks
- Final Team Formation at conclusion of tournament
  - 15 skaters, 2 goalies
- 2-3 Full Ice 1.25 Hour Practices per Week
  - Tuesday and Thursday 6:45pm-8:00pm VRC and every other Wednesday
- UI3AA Raiders play in the Alberta Female Hockey League in the South Division. This includes 3 – Calgary Fire teams, Central Alberta Twins (Red Deer), Airdrie Lightning, Southern Express, and joining for the 2025 season Cochrane.
- 24 Regular Season Games in AFHL
- Team will record their games and upload into Hudl for video review sessions with players.
- Showcase to qualify to attend Alberta Winter Games dates will be announced.
- This year is Alberta Winter Games February 13-16<sup>th</sup> Bonnyville, Cold Lake and Glendon.

# Team Budget

UI3AA budgets have averaged from \$3,000-\$5,000 per player

Each team's budget will depend on various factors:

- League fee's, Tournaments, Apparel, Training, Ice costs, Referees, Team Travel, Hudl Assist, Video Review, Equipment deposits and Administration fees.
- Sponsorship and Fundraising can be used to offset expenses.
- OOAA has a Cash Call Policy min of \$3,000 per AA player to be paid by October 15<sup>th</sup>
  - Committed players pay \$1500 for the remainder of first cash call
  - Second cash call depend on team budget. Collected by November 15<sup>th</sup>
  - Third cash call dependent on team budget. Collected by December 15<sup>th</sup>
