Season Outlook

U13AA

- U13AA Raiders is a draw zone team open to players from Blackie, Chestermere, High Country, Hussar, Foothills, Indus, Nanton, Okotoks, Rockyford, Siksika, Strathmore, Standard
- U13AA Conditioning Camp and Fall team Evaluations will take place early September
- G/W game early September
- Pre-Season Tournament September 12th – 14th in Okotoks
- Final Team Formation at conclusion of tournament
 - 15 skaters, 2 goalies
- 2-3 Full Ice 1.25 Hour Practices per Week
- U13AA Raiders play in the Alberta Female Hockey League in the South Division. This includes 3 – Calgary Fire teams, Central Alberta Twins (Red Deer), Airdrie Lightning, Southern Express, and joining for the 2025 season Cochrane.
- 24 Regular Season Games in AFHL
- Showcase weekend for cross over games with the Northern AFHL teams hosted in one location. Limiting team travel. Last year this event was hosted in Red Deer December 6th – 8th.
- Weekly Dryland Training Sessions
- Tournaments
 - Thanksgiving Classic Calgary October 10th - 13th
 - Okotoks Female Classic November 14th -16th
 - Edmonton Tournament – December 2025
 - 10 Skills and Goalie Development sessions throughout the season provided by OOAA
- Video review sessions for players and goalies. Individual and Team sessions.



Team Budget

U13AA budgets have averaged from \$3,000-\$5,000 per player

Each team's budget will depend on various factors:

- Tournaments, Apparel, Training, Ice costs, Referees, Team Travel, Video Review Deposits and Administration fees.
- Sponsorship and Fundraising to offset expenses.
- OOAA has a Cash Call Policy min of \$3,000 per AA player to be paid by October 15th
 - Second cash call depend on team budget. Collected by November 15th
 - Third cash call dependent on team budget. Collected by December 15th



Player Commitments

- HA is permitting Player Commitments for the U13AA Raiders team
- OOAA has agreed that U13AA Raiders will have the ability to commit up to 10 players at Spring Evaluations.
- Commitments are Coach's staff decision

- Player Commitment Terms:
 - 48 hours to sign agreement once provided by OOAA
 - \$1,500 non-refundable deposit which will go towards First Cash Call

- Deposit is refunded if:
 - Player suffers season-ending injury prior to team formation
 - Family relocates out of draw zone for work purposes.

- Committed Players will be announced online by August 1st, and through social media.
