Ted Minnis - Harvard Water Polo Head Coach

Ted Minnis enters his 12th year as The Friends of Harvard Water Polo Head Coach in 2021-22. Minnis is the 10th coach in Harvard men's and women's water polo history, and the first individual to serve in the role since the position was endowed in May 2013. Returning to competition in 2021, Minnis led the men's team to its third-highest win total in program history, amassing 26 wins. The Crimson was ranked as high as No. 11 in the CWPA National Rankings during the season, as Minnis guided a trio of All-America honorees in Noah Hodge, Alex Tsotadze, and Gabe Putnam. Tsotadze, meanwhile, was named NWPC Most Valuable Player at the conclusion of the season. Due to COVID-19, the 2020 men's water polo and 2021 women's water polo seasons were canceled by the Ivy League. In a shortened 2020 season, Minnis guided the women's program to a 12-2 overall record, including victories over three ranked opponents. The team saw three players win CWPA weekly honors over four separate occasions and reached a season-high national rank of No. 17. Minnis guided the Crimson to a historic season in 2019, earning an undefeated 27-0 record through regular season play and breaking program records for best start to a season and most consecutive wins. In its sixth consecutive 20 or more win season, Harvard defeated Princeton to become the new NWPC Champion. Four members of the Crimson seniors Charlie Owens and Austin Sechrest, junior Dennis Blyashov and sophomore Noah Hodge earned First Team All-NWPC honors while Owens was named MVP of the conference. Minnis was named NWPC Coach of the Year as well as NWPC Coach of the Tournament. He earned his 200th career victory with the men's program in the NWPC championship match. Minnis led the men's program to its fifth consecutive season with 20 or more wins, completing the year with a 22-8 overall record and a second-place finish in the Northeast Water Polo Conference for the 2018 season



Beth Harberts - San Jose State Water Polo Head Coach Women's

A two-time San José State University All-American, Beth Harberts is in her third season as the Spartans' women's water polo head coach.

In her first two seasons as the Spartans head coach, San José State was ranked No. 14 in the final national coaches poll in 2020 and #16 in 2021. The 2020 season was highlighted by a win over #6-Cal on the Berkeley campus and a #14-ranking in the final national coaches poll.

Each season, one Spartan was named an honorable mention All-America player by the Association of Collegiate Water Polo Coaches (ACWPC). In 2021, it was Lili Urvari and Olga Descalzi received the same recognition in 2020. Academically, San José State ranks with the top women's water polo teams nationally and in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) - the No. 1 conference nationally in the sport. In 2020 and 2021, the Spartans earned two ACWPC team awards, 26 ACWPC individual honors, and 25 MPSF academic awards. Only UCLA can match San José State for the number of MPSF allacademic awards the last two seasons.

Harberts was appointed the head coach in August 2019 after three seasons on the San Jose State men's and women's water polo coaching staff as an assistant coach. She was a volunteer assistant for the men's team in 2015.

The Spartan women's water polo head coach has a vast array of club and community college coaching experience since she finished her San Jose State playing career in 2008.

She was the West Valley College women's water polo head coach for six seasons (2009-14). The 2014 Vikings team was her best, posting a 12-10 winloss record, a second-place finish in the regular season Coast Conference standings, second place in the conference tournament and an invitation to the NorCal Championship.

As the 2015 San Jose State men's club team head coach, Harberts led the club to a 16th-place ranking in the final national poll and was named the Sierra Pacific Conference Coach of the Year.



Nikola Maric- Technical Director and Head Coach Pacific Storm Water Polo Club

Nikola, or Nik as he's usually known, has a history rich in water polo and is absolutely passionate about the sport. Nik has a long term vision for the players, and the teams of Pacific Storm!

Nik has been recognized as NDPL coach of the year and the Most Valuable Coach (MVC) at NCC tournaments! His goals are to promote the development of players of all ages to ensure they are well positioned to compete successfully at NDPL tournaments and eventually capture positions on Canada's National Team. He was the Men's U16, U18 and U20 NT Coach from 2011-2017. Winning Gold at the Pan Am's in 2016 with the U20 Team which had only happened once before in the history of Canadian Water Polo. He also placed top 10 in the Worlds in 2017. Coach Nik currently has 7 athletes both Men and Women on the Senior National Teams as well as helping athletes obtain NCAA Scholarships.

Cassie Churnside-Assistant Coach Harvard



Cassie Churnside joined Harvard's men's and women's water polo coaching staff in June 2014. Churnside will enter her seventh season with the Crimson in 2021-22.
