



Finding or Creating Your HCR Number

*A step-by-step guide for Hockey Alberta
members*

What is a HCR Number?

- A unique number assigned to every player, coach, official, or volunteer in the Hockey Canada Registry (HCR) system.
 - Follows you for life – even if you move to another association or province.
 - Used for registration, certifications, and tracking your hockey history.
- 

Why You Need Your HCR Number

- Required for rostering to a team each season.
 - Needed for coaching or officiating courses.
 - Helps verify your hockey history and eligibility.
 - Link Respect in Sport to the proper profile
 - Register with Minor Hockey Association (possibly)

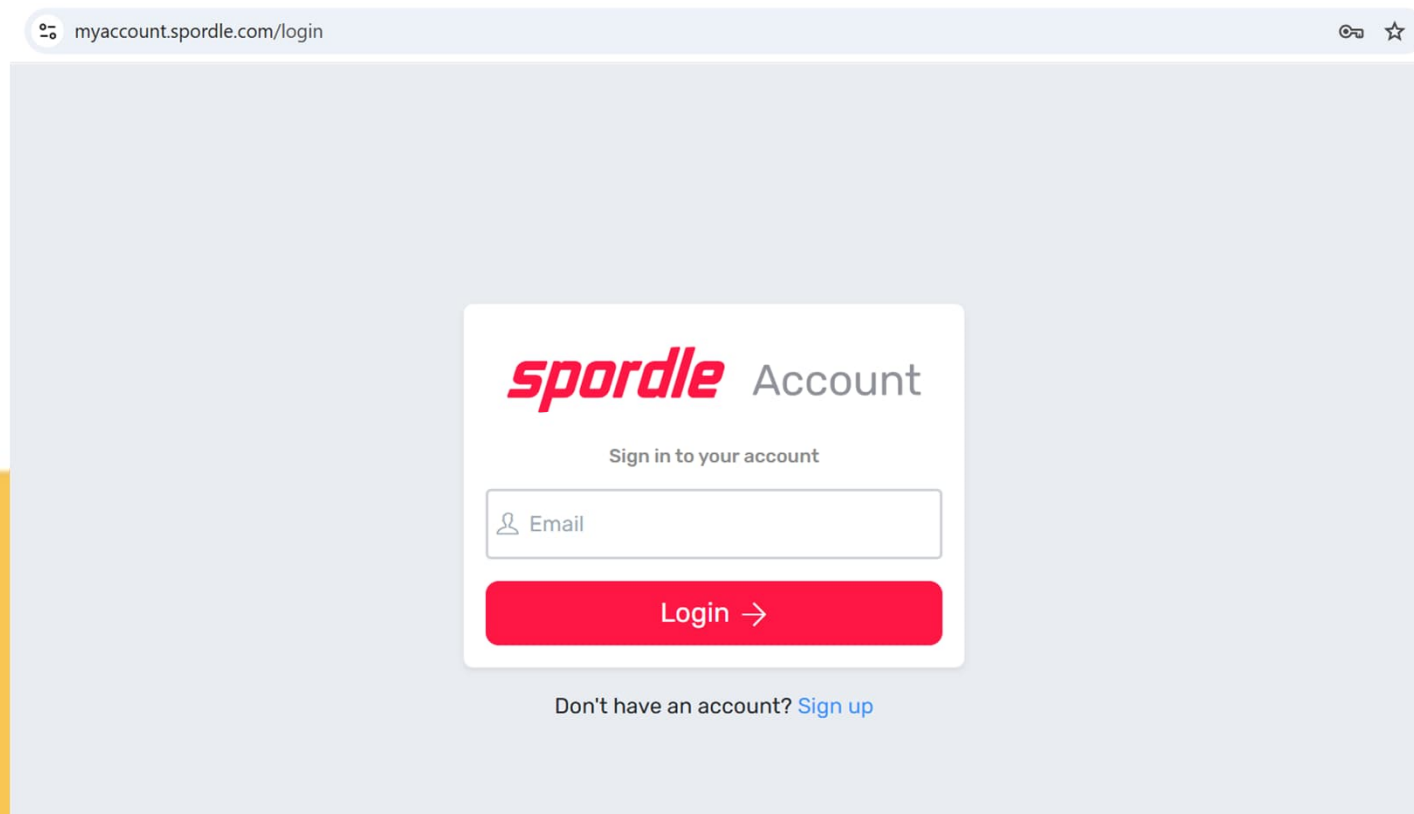
IMPORTANT

- If a participant has been involved with sanctioned hockey at any point in their lives, they will have a HCR Number. Creating a duplicate ID can/will create delays in registration.
- Ensure all the information entered is accurate
- If your HCR Number is with another Association, please reach out to your current association to work on requesting a transfer of your file, do not create a new HCR Number.

Finding Your HCR Number– Step 1

for those who have participated in hockey previously

- Log in with your existing account credentials.

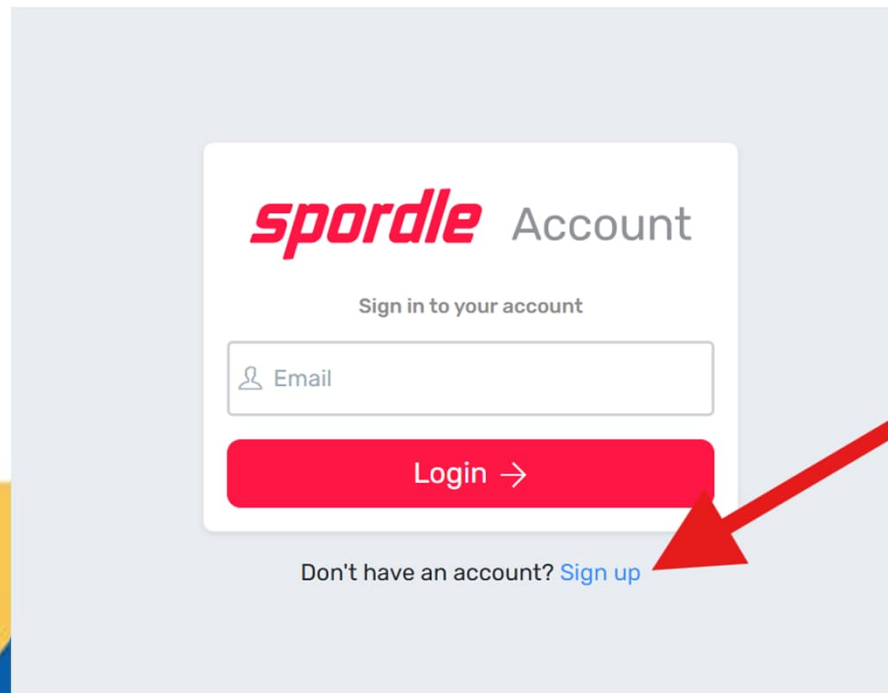

- If you don't have an account – choose “Sign up” and follow the prompts

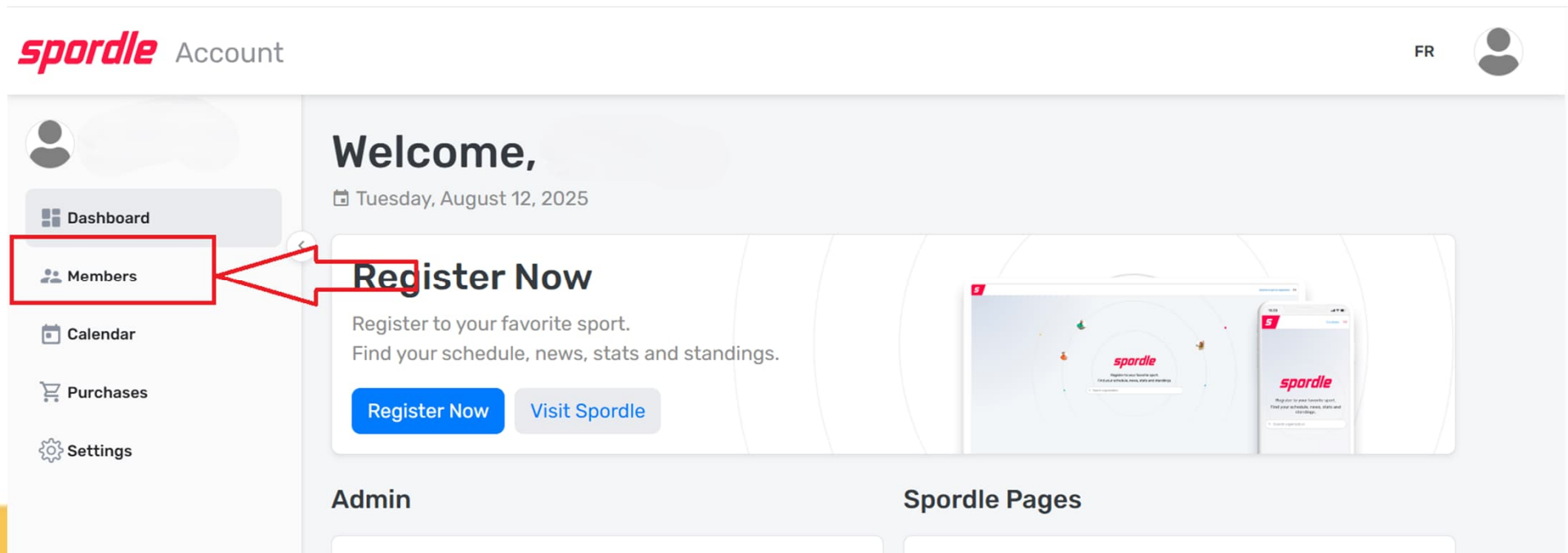

Finding Your HCR Number– Step 4

adding a new participant to your account with an existing HCR Number

Anyone who is participating in hockey in your household can be added to your account as a participant. The 'owner' of the account will need to add themselves.

1. Select the circle with the '+'
2. Follow the prompts – the 'Let's link your profile' will open

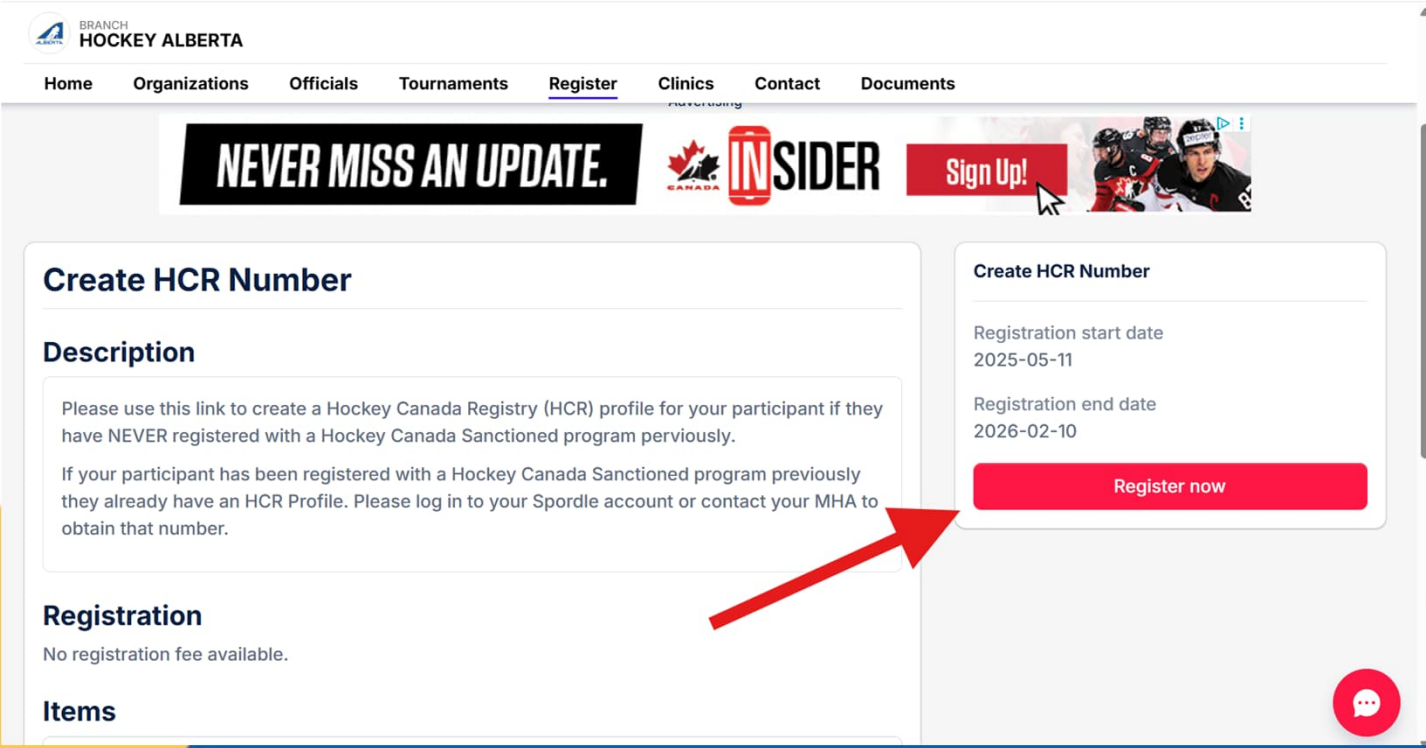

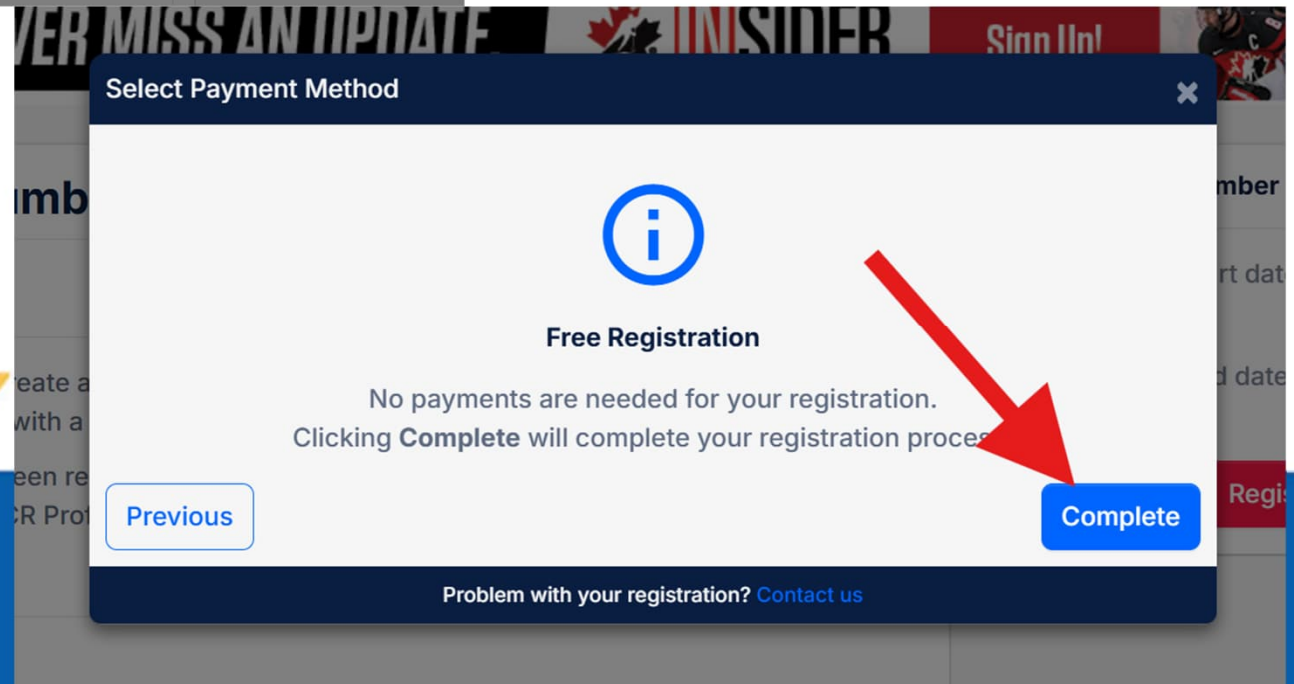
