President Report - 2012

The sport of soccer and the PEI Soccer Association have experienced another successful year. The highlight being the Women's National team play at the Olympics and their Bronze medals. We have been to maintain our player base and the Association is on sound financial footing.

The Leagues operating under our sanction are strong. The Indoor programs and winter leagues continue to develop and are positive. Sponsorship arrangements with Subway and Umbro remain strong. The GOALLINE network continues to develop and provide The Association with the tools to administer registration and scheduling. Key to success is clear communication with all members.

The U12 program had great season and I had the great pleasure to watch the Year end competitions in at Eastern Eagles Complex with great representation from across the Province. As with change, there is room for tweaks and improvement but overall reviews were favourable. Our job now is to insure that the LTPD plan is strengthened at that level and successfully implemented at the lower levels so that we attract players to the sport and keep them.

Grassroots plan appears to being implemented by our clubs and being viewed in a positive light with the majority of clubs accessing the funding. The importance of the first years of soccer cannot be emphasized enough and we have to supply coaches with the knowledge and tools to make it challenging, interesting, and fun. Changes to funding from the Province may create some challenges in the upcoming year.

The Provincial Team Program will continue to undergo significant change with all players competing in an Atlantic competition and then, some chosen to compete nationally on a regional team. This upcoming year is likely the last for National All Star program. Regional cooperation will ensure this avenue for developing our sport will continue. This Program is needed for player development, coaching development as well referee development. This program feeds the Canada Games program which will be featured in August 2013 in Sherbrooke, Quebec.

Our Association hosted a successful U16 BMO Club Championships in Charlottetown area in October 2012. The volunteers are to be commended for their efforts headed by Bill MacKinnon. The teams representing our Association at Regional and Nationals this season had varying levels of success. These Club championships are a test of endurance as well as skill. If, for example, you have a bye on day one, you play 5 days in a row. Teams have gained an insight into the level of preparation necessary to compete at these competitions.

Changes in CSA governance have begun with Gerald MacDonald being elected to the new Board and the development of structure is ongoing. CSA fees will increase 2% each year for 3 more years based on 2008 registration numbers.

Again this year, the Annual Awards Banquet at the Rodd Royalty was a huge success. Special thanks go to Peter Wolters and Nick Murray for their roles. The support from the membership has been phenomenal making it a very worthwhile endeavour. The Award of Life Memberships to George Barna and Waldron Leard add to the special night.

Thank you to Peter Wolters and Jonathan Vos for your work on behalf of the Association. Working for a volunteer organization is never an easy task and both have handled it very well. Thank you to my fellow Executive members: Fred Foster, Tammy Wall, Kirk McAleer, Rachel Coldwill, Mike Goeseels, John O'Brien, Bruce Norton, & Jim Chandler for your support. Opinions may vary on any topic but as long as we remember who we are here for, the correct decision gets made.

In the First Division, Boston Pizza Master and Sam's had a rematch for the final. Boston Pizza Masters again came out on top to repeat as Provincial Cup Champions.

In the Second Division, first place Sportmans FC beat out Hils to claim the Diamond Shield.

Both United Panthers and Sportsmans FC have won their respective relegation games to earn the right to play in higher leagues for the 2013 season.

The Senior Men's League continues to prove itself as a highly competitive league creating some fantastic games of soccer.

Senior Women's Director Report

It has been another great year of soccer on PEI!

Registration for senior women's soccer was up five percent for the Summer 2012 Season. During the regular season, eight senior teams and one U18 team participated in first division; five senior teams and the Canada Games team competed at the premier level. The Provincial Cup title was captured by the Stratford Cougars after going 13-2-1 in the regular season. At the premier level, four of the five senior teams competed for the Chuck Matheson Memorial Cup which was claimed by WCRFC Avema.

Unfortunately, PEI was not represented at the 2012 CSA National Championships in Winnipeg, Manitoba due to a lack of interest from senior women's teams. As a result, the Prince Edward Island Soccer Association was fined and must meet specific requirements before being accepted into the 2013 competition. The PEISA is committed to sending a team to compete for the 2013 Jubilee Trophy in Halifax, Nova Scotia. Planning meetings were held in December 2012 and January 2013 to address this issue and three teams have already expressed interest in challenging for the chance to represent PEI in 2013. We are confident that we will be able to send a strong and capable team to the CSA National Championships this coming October.

The annual PEISA Awards Banquet was held on Tuesday, November 27th at the Rodd Royalty Inn & Suites. It was another wonderful opportunity to celebrate the many accomplishments of PEI's outstanding soccer players, coaches, officials, administrators, and volunteers. Hannah Roche (Eliot River Ramblers & UPEI Panthers) and Emily MacPhee (Eliot River Ramblers & Holland College Hurricanes) were deserving finalists for the *Senior Female Player of the Year* award. Hannah Roche was awarded the title.

A personal highlight of the past year: I am very excited to be part of a new committee that was struck at the 2012 PEISA Fall Board Meeting. Our goal is to explore issues connected to player retention and develop strategies and programs to increase retention. We are launching a set of surveys on February 1st, 2013 to begin gathering feedback from current and former soccer players as well as parents. Stay tuned in 2013 for more news!

It has been my pleasure to serve on the PEISA Executive Committee for another year. I have truly enjoyed collaborating with the other members of the Executive Committee, the Association Members, and the Senior Women's League. I know that the beautiful game will continue to thrive on PEI because so many wonderful people are working tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure that players of all ages have positive experiences.

Youth Director Report

(1) Registration in the U12 through U18 age groups for 2012 declined by 100 (4.7%) players from 2011 and resulted in the following differences in the number of teams in the Youth League from the previous year:

(* 2011 – first year of LTPD at U12 level means fewer players on each team, therefore more teams.)

By comparison, youth registration for these age groups declined 35 players (1.6%) from 2010 to 2011. Since 2000, youth registration in U12 to U18 has declined from 2,980 to 2,030 players, a reduction of 950 players or 32.4% over the period.

Anecdotally, baseball and football registrations are up over this same period which has detracted from soccer. In addition, the population to draw from is reduced.

- (2) A table is attached identifying the top four teams in each U12 Youth League Division and the top two teams in the other age groups at the Challenge and Provincial Cup competitions for the 2012 season along with each team's placing during league play for the summer. Congratulations to the six Provincial Champions who represented PEI at Nationals, as well as the Winsloe Charlottetown Royals U16 Girls who participated as the host team for the championships held on PEI. The record, including goals for and against, and final placing for each team that travelled to/participated in Nationals is also indicated.
- (3) For 2013, the Youth League will be holding its annual meeting prior to the PEISA AGM for the first time. A number of items will be dealt with, some of which are relevant to and will be reported at the PEISA AGM.
- (4) 2012 was the first year of the "field monitor" program at the youth level. Overall, the program ran well, but will require some refinement for the coming season:

There were some issues with witnesses to events (including field monitors) not being willing to come forward to provide details.

Teams were to provide the names of monitors on game sheets, but often failed to do so.

The Youth League is examining the possibility of fines for teams persisting in not identifying monitors and not providing the information on each game sheet.

(5) Congratulations to the following youth related PEISA award winners who received their trophies at the annual awards banquet on Tuesday, November 27th:

Junior Female Player of the Year: Jacqulyn Sudsbury (Winsloe Charlottetown Royals U15 Premier Girls, PEI U15 All Stars, Team Atlantic U15 All Stars)

Junior Male Player of the Year: Jessie Cameron (RC United U16 Premier Boys, PEI U16 All-Stars, Team Atlantic U16 All-Stars)

Team of the Year: RC United U16 Premier Boys

Coach of the Year: Derek MacEwen (Stratford SC – U12 Premier Girls)

- (6) The issue was raised during the past season regarding teams "taking a knee" for an injury. This seems particularly prevalent at the U12 age. While this acknowledgement of an injury does demonstrate sportsmanship, it is not required. In fact, during an extended player injury, teams are encouraged to go to the sidelines for a water break and to receive any additional instruction from their coaches.
- (7) There continue to be challenges ahead. We have already seen some consolidation at the Premier level in some districts. For example, with the U16 Boys this past season, we had teams from Winsloe Charlottetown (two clubs that have formally merged), RC United (a co-operative effort on a trial basis between Eliot River and Central Queens), and a Sherwood/Stratford team (an informal arrangement for the season when Stratford was unable to field a team of their own). If registration numbers continue to decline, some formalizing of the district arrangement that was presented some years back may make more sense.

In addition, there is a need to consider three levels of play at some age groups. There is continued demand for Premier Division soccer, but we are also seeing a need for a competitive First Division to enable players who aspire to Premier to develop further. There is also some call for a Second Division to provide the recreational player with a place to play.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the PEISA and the soccer community for allowing me the honour to serve as Youth Director for the past 4 years. My thanks to the various members of the Executive and of the Board with whom I have had the pleasure to serve during this time.

Director of Officials Report

This past year saw four major tournaments held on the Island. We ran the gambit from regional All Star and University competitions to National Club and College events. .Our referees were able to work with and observe some of the top officials in the country as well as get feedback from top assessors as well.

In July we hosted the Female and Male Atlantic U-14 All Star competition. This as a training ground for players and coaches as well as referees. We had some of our up and coming officials referee, line and be fourth officials at this competition. Three local assessors were available to assess all games and provide feedback to these officials. This tournament was looked after completely by local referees and assessors.

Over the Thanksgiving week we played host to the U-16 Club Nationals for both Female and Male teams. We had National Referee Program officials and assessors assigned by CSA come in and work with our local officials to put on this event. This being such a large event with many games over a short period we called on both New Brunswick and Nova Scotia to send some referees over to help shore up the numbers. With up to 11 games in one day their attendance was greatly appreciated! The national assessors were very pleased with not only the hard work but quality of work as well from the local officials. Kevin Jones, the Supervisor of Officials for this event, said he is always likes coming to the Island for a tournament because of the quality and commitment of our local officials.

November was a very busy month. We hosted the AUS Men's Championships using only one referee from off Island. The remaining officials were from PEI. These games were also assessed by local assessors. Later in the month we played host to the country again as Holland College hosted the CCAA Women's National Championships. The referees were assigned by CSA and were supported by local referees for lines and fourths. Again we called on New Brunswick for a bit of support as many of the games were played during the work week and this had us scrambling for numbers. The final two days were refereed by the National appointees and Island officials. The Supervisor of Officials for the tournament was very pleased with the quality of officials that we were able to put on the pitch for this event and even appointed Cory Deagle to middle on the final day.

Our registration numbers remain pretty consistent. Even though we had 32 new referees we still ended up with 97 registered referees by the end of the summer. The breakdown by class is 77 District, 10 Regional and 6 Provincial referees. Of the 77 District there were 14 second year officials returning from a class of 44 that took their first clinic last year and refereed. The majority of higher level games (U-16 and above) are being refereed by about 30 referees. And this pool is both aging and shrinking! We continue to lose referees to life changes, be that off Island jobs or off Island marriages.

Referee fees will be looked at this coming year. A new schedule of fees should be available for the fall board meeting giving clubs lots of time to play. I have been in discussions with my counterparts in the Atlantic region on this and other topics. We will be at national meetings in Ottawa in March and will set a meeting for the Atlantic reps to discuss this and other topics including retention.

In 2013, we will implement the 3 officials system for all U-16 premier games. We will work with the schedulers and assigners to make this happen. This level of game is very difficult to referee alone because of the speed of play and the high level of competitiveness.

I would like to thank both the PEISA and PEISRA for their time and effort in working towards a better environment for referees on the Island. The Youth League Field Monitor Program was very successful this year. There was a very good buy in by the parents to get involved. This helps raise the level of understanding towards young officials. We all hope this will help keep more of our young referees in the game!

With the Atlantic Cup boys competitions held in Moncton for the U15 and U16 age groups, and the U15 and U16 girls held in Halifax the Atlantic All Star teams were selected to compete in the summer National All Star Championships, held in St John's (Boys) and Halifax (Girls). PEI was well represented at these Nationals with Jordan Dejong and Alex Obrien on the U15 boys team and Jacquiline Sudsbury and Emma Clark on the U15 Girls team. On the U16 boys team Sam Smiley, Jessie Cameron and Cameron O'Hanley and Jody Gerus represented PEI on the U16 girls Atlantic team. Congratulations also to PEI coaches Ashley McKenna, and Jonathan Vos who were coaches on the Team Atlantic U16 Boys and girls teams at the Nationals. At the U13 age group, played in St. John's, the girls finished 4th while the boys finished 3rd. At the U14 age group played in Charlottetown, the girls also finished 4th while the boys finished 3rd. Our All Star Program continues to develop fine soccer players.

At the club nationals held in October, PEI teams were off all across the country competing at their various age groups. The U14 Club Nationals were held in Vaughan with the Sherwood Parkdale Rangers 8th in a 12 team competition, while the West Prince Storm girls finished in 11th in a 12 team competition. The U16 Nationals were held in Charlottetown with RC United boys finishing 5th in a 10 team competition and Winsloe Charlottetown Royals SC finishing 10th in a 12 team competition and Sherwood Parkdale Rangers finishing 11th in the 12 team competition. The U18 Nationals were held in St John's with the Winsloe Charlottetown Royals FC boys finishing 7th of 10 teams and the Sherwood Parkdale Rangers finished 10th in a 10 team competition. In the senior men's held in Winnipeg, the PEI FC men finished 4th of 12 teams competing while the women's seniors did not field a team. St John's hosted the Eastern Masters in 2012 with the Boston Pizza Masters finishing 3rd of 6 teams competing. Many thanks to all those who were Provincial reps in 2012, I hope you enjoyed the experience.

As a part of my position as the Vice President of PEISA, I also sit on the CSA Competitions Committee. As a committee, it is our role to approve the locations of the National Championships, report on the events, approve changes to the rules and levy fines as a follow up to the competitions. Members from this committee are also assigned the responsibility of being the CSA Rep at each National Competition. In 2012, I was given the opportunity of being the CSA Rep at the National U15/U16 Boys All Star Championships held in St John's, NL and the

U14 National Club Championships in Vaughan, ON. It was a great experience being in charge of both of these Championships and I look forward to doing this again in the future.

Domestically, our provincials worked well again and will be covered under separate cover by our Youth and Senior Directors. It was encouraging to see the limited amount of call-ups requested by the respective Challenge Cup Champions. Teams are finally now realizing that Club Nationals are just that and requests for call-ups from other clubs will be kept to a minimum.

I would like to thank everyone who has supported me in this sometimes demanding position.

I want to thank Kelsey O'Donnell for her efforts as the referee assignor. Thank you to Nimna Ekanayaka for his work with us during the summer.

I want to thank all our members and volunteers who work hard each and every year to make sure all kids had a place to play the game and have fun doing it.

I look forward to my continued work with the members in 2013. The door is always open to discuss any concerns or issues.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Board of Directors of The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated,

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated which is comprised of the statement of financial position as at December 31, 2012 and the statements of operations, changes in net assets and cash flow for the year then ended and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations and for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the organization's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the organization's internal controls. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for a qualified audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

In common with many not for profit organizations, the The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated derives revenues from donations and fundraising which are not susceptible to complete verification by audit procedures. Accordingly, our verification of these revenues was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to revenue, assets and net assets. Our audit opinion on the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2012 was modified accordingly because of the possible effects of this limitation in scope.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, these financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated as at December 31, 2012 and the results of its operations and cash flow for the year then ended in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations.

Comparative Information

Without modifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 2 to the financial statements which describes that the organization adopted Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations on January 1, 2012 with a transition date of January 1, 2011. These standards were applied retrospectively by management to the comparative information in these financial statements, including statement of financial position as at December 31, 2011 and January 1, 2011, and the statements of operations, changes in net assets, and cash flow for the year ended December 31, 2011 and related disclosures. We were not engaged to report on the restated comparative information, and as such, it is unaudited.

1. NATURE OF OPERATIONS

The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated was incorporated without share capital under Part II of the Prince Edward Island Companies Act as a non-profit entity. The objectives of the organization are to support and promote the sport of soccer in Prince Edward Island. The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association is exempt from income taxes under the Income Tax Act.

2. ADOPTION OF ACCOUNTING STANDARDS FOR NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS

Effective January 1, 2012, the organization adopted the requirements of the Canadian Institute of Chartered Accountants (CICA) Handbook - Accounting, electing to adopt the new accounting framework: Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. These are the organization's first financial statements prepared in accordance with the accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations (ASNFPO) which has been applied retrospectively. The accounting polices set out in Note 3 have been applied in preparing the financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2012, the comparative information presented in these financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2011 and the preparation of an opening ASNFPO statement of financial position at January 1, 2011, (the organization's date of transition).

The organization issued financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2011 using generally accepted accounting principles prescribed by CICA Handbook - Accounting XFI. The adoption of ASNFPO had no impact on the previously reported assets, liabilities and net assets of the organization, and accordingly; no adjustments have been recorded in the comparative statement of financial position, statement of operations and statement of cash flow. Certain of the organization's disclosures included in these financial statements reflect the new disclosure of ASNFPO.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations and include the following significant accounting policies:

TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS

Tangible capital assets are recorded at cost, less any government assistance received. Contributed equipment is recorded at fair value at the date of contribution, if the value can be readily determined. Depreciation is provided for on the declining balance method at the rates shown in Note 5. In the year of acquisition depreciation is provided for at one half the stated rate. No deprecation is provided for in the year of disposal.

NET ASSETS INVESTED IN TANGIBLE CAPITAL ASSETS

Net assets invested in tangible capital assets are stated at the cost of the equipment, net of accumulated depreciation.

INTERNALLY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

Net assets that are internally restricted are stated at the original allocation, increased each year by any interest income earned in the year and applicable allocations made by the board of directors and reduced by any withdrawals which have been approved by the board of directors.

REVENUE RECOGNITION

The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expense occurs. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when the amount can be reasonably estimated and collection is relatively assured.

CONTRIBUTED GOODS AND SERVICES

Volunteers contribute significant hours each year to assist the association in carrying out its service delivery activities. Organizations contribute equipment and other supplies to be used by the teams. Because of the difficulty of determining their fair value, contributed goods and services are not recognized in the financial statements.

MANAGEMENT ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements as well as the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. These estimates are reviewed periodically, and as adjustments become necessary, they are reported in earnings in the period in which they become known.

Depreciation requires an estimate by management in regards to the estimated useful life of the tangible capital asset and as such the expense may be based on these estimates.

4. FINANCIAL ASSETS AND LIABILITIES

The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated's financial assets measured at cost consist of cash, short term investments, receivables, and note receivable. Financial liabilities measured at amortized cost consist of payables. Unless otherwise noted, it is management's opinion that the Prince Edward Island Soccer Association is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments.

6. NOTE RECEIVABLE

The Prince Edward Island Soccer Association Incorporated has advanced \$710,159 (2011 - \$590,159) to the PEI Indoor Soccer Complex Inc. to finance the debt repayment of the facility to the Province of Prince Edward Island. The advance is non-interest bearing and there are no set terms of repayment. This advance is secured by the PEI Indoor Soccer Complex Inc. with a \$1,000,000 second mortgage over the facility in Stratford, Prince Edward Island.

7. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED - ALL STAR FUND

The Board of Directors has internally restricted the use of funds representing profits generated from the 2004 - 2012 All Star seasons. These funds are to be used only to fund All Star program activities as specifically approved by the Board of Directors.

8. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED - SECURITY

The Board of Directors has internally restricted use of funds as security for the credit card of The PEI Soccer Association Incorporated.

9. COMPARATIVE AMOUNTS

Certain of prior year figures have been restated to conform with the current year's financial statement presentation.
