- Game cancellations/postponements (in conjunction w/ league executive)

Game Sheet & Reporting

<u>Step 1</u>: Each team will use a game sheet from the <u>RAMP System</u>, team logins are provided from PEI Soccer. It is the **home team's** responsibility to provide the game sheet. Game sheets must be generated using the RAMP System and include the names of all Players and Team Officials on the bench except affiliated players (APs), who will be handwritten on the game sheet.

<u>Step 2</u>: At the beginning of the game, the Coach/Manager of each team will confirm all player names and jersey numbers are correct. If a player is not present or has received a suspension, they must be crossed off of the game sheet. All players and Team Officials whose names appear on the game sheet and are not crossed out will be deemed to have participated in the game. The Coach/Manager will sign the game sheet to ensure authenticity.

<u>Step 3</u>: The home team retains the game sheet after the game's completion. The away team and referee(s) can take a picture of the game sheet.

<u>Step 4</u>: The home team Coach/Manager must file a game report, including the score, discipline issued by the referee, and game feedback on the RAMP System within **24 hours** of the game's completion. A picture of the completed game sheet must also be uploaded to the RAMP System for verification.

**When a game sheet cannot be printed from the RAMP System due to technical difficulties, the team will email PEI Soccer to inform them. PEI Soccer must receive notice of the difficulty before the game starts. The affected team will create a handwritten game sheet, adding the additional game information. PEI Soccer will manually verify the registration status and eligibility of the listed players. If the notification was not sent, the team may be issued a fee.

Policies

Quick Reference Guide

General:

- The home team shall provide the referee with a suitable game ball as follows:
 - o U11 & U13 Size 4
 - o U15 & U18 Size 5
- Unlimited substitutions in league play will be permitted.
 - o Substitutions may be made at any stoppage in play at the discretion of the referee.
- Each youth league game shall commence as follows:
 - o $U11 2 \times 30$ -minute halves
 - o $U13 2 \times 35$ -minutes halves
 - o $U15 2 \times 40$ -minutes halves
 - o $U18 2 \times 45$ -minutes halves

Call-up Procedure:

Call-up decisions can occur at any time throughout the regular season and playoffs. The number of call ups is <u>unlimited</u>, call ups can only be made within the club for regular season games. Each club determines their own internal communication process for call-ups (i.e. coach to coach; coach to club; youth director to coach, etc.).

- Div. 2 players can be called up to a Div. 1 and/or Premier team within their age group or one (1) age group above.
- Div. 1 players can be called up to a Premier within their age group, and/or a Div. 1 and Premier team one (1) age group above.
- However, Premier players cannot be called up to Div. 1
- U11 Div. 1 can be called up to U13 Division 1 & Premier but cannot be called up to U13 Div. 2
- U11 Div. 2 & 3 can be called up to U11 Div. 1 and U13 Div. 1, 2 & Premier.
- Where a club **only** has U11 Div. 1, players can be called up to U13 Division 2 with discretion from the club's youth director. In this scenario, the top players on U11 Div. 1 should be identified for call up to U13 Div. 1 & Premier and the other half are then eligible for U13 Div. 2

Call-up decisions for playoffs:

- Final rosters, including call-up players, need to be set in your respected club's registration system before July 31st of the current calendar year.
- Any player listed on a game sheet during playoffs MUST be listed on the roster on the PEI Soccer website

Discipline:

Disciplinary measures will be taken when necessary for the appropriate offense.

- Caution (Yellow Card) A player receiving three (3) cautions during the current season shall be suspended for one (1) game following receipt of the 3rd yellow card. Two (2) cautions in one (1) game will result in an ejection from the game and a one (1) game suspension.
- Ejection (Red Card) Automatic game suspension, depending on the offense, game suspension length may vary.

Jewellery:

All items of jewellery (necklaces, rings, bracelets, earrings/studs, leather bands, rubber bands, bobby pins, barrettes, etc.) are strictly forbidden and must be removed. Using tape to cover jewellery is <u>not</u> acceptable.

Casts:

Hard plaster and fiberglass casts are not permitted to be worn. The practice of padding a hard cast is not acceptable. Soft casts are permitted with the condition that no rigid materials are contained/embedded within the casts.

Knee/Ankle Braces:

Conventional knee/ankle braces are permitted. Braces must not have sharp edges or components which protrude from the main brace. All braces must be covered with a neoprene (or similar material) sleeve.

Extreme Heat:

If there is a Heat Warning issued, by 2:30 PM PEI Soccer will establish if the temperature at game time is expected to be in excess of <u>37 degrees</u> or <u>humidex of 39</u> in each of the three counties:

- Kings County Eastern Eagles, Souris, Morell
- Queens County Winsloe, Sherwood, Stratford, RC United (CQ/ER), North Shore
- Prince County Summerside, Kensington, West Prince

PEI Soccer will be using the Weather Network website to make these decisions.

If it is expected to reach either stated temperature in that particular county, those youth league games will be postponed. Discussions about any make up games will be taken by the youth league coordinator.

- Water breaks are recommended when temperatures exceed 34 degrees or humidex of 36 degrees.
- Breaks should be a minimum of 2 minutes but not exceed 3 minutes.
- If both coaches agree, the halves of the game can be shortened by referee discretion.

Lightning:

If lightning occurs during the game, please proceed as follows:

• The safety of players, coaches, management and spectators is the primary concern in any weather event that occurs during all matches sanctioned by Canada Soccer. As soon as you hear thunder or see lightning, quickly get to a safe location. More people are struck before and after a thunderstorm than during one. Stay inside for **30 minutes** after the last rumble of thunder. Ultimately, the referee has the final say over delaying or restarting a match due to weather.

If lightning occurs during the game, the game will be considered completed if 60% of the game has been played. See below for the amount of time needed to play in each league to be considered complete:

- U11 36 minutes
- U13 42 minutes
- U15 48 minutes
- U18 54 minutes
