## PRO HOCKEY EUROPEAN TRIP CHECKLIST



- ❄️ **Trip Cancellation & Supplemental Insurance (Covid) Mandatory.**
- ❄️ Pack uniforms + 3 pucks, 3 sticks, skate blades, tape and laces.
- ❄️ Pack your semi-formal clothing for opening ceremony banquet.
- ❄️ Carry a [Canadian](#) or [American](#) Passport that is valid well beyond the date of your anticipated return home; keep a copy of the identification page separate from the original.
- ❄️ Leave copies of your passport identification page, itinerary, and [insurance policy](#) with friends or family.
- ❄️ If [travelling with children](#), carry documentation proving your right to accompany them (e.g., a consent letter or court order).
- ❄️ Anticipate financial needs, such as local currency and departure tax.
- ❄️ [Take care of health needs](#): vaccinations, prescriptions, medical certificates, supplies, extra eyeglasses.
- ❄️ Carry an [Emergency Contact Card](#) with the coordinates of the nearest Canadian government office in your destination country.
- ❄️ Arrive 3+ hours before departure.
- ❄️ Let Credit card companies know you will be travelling.





# Things to do in Munich

Visit a Castle. Neuschwanstein Castle is located near Munich, (München), the capital of Bavaria, in southern Germany. Named the 8th wonder of the world, it is Germany's most famous sight and is located on a mountain perch in the Bavarian Alps. It has inspired and amazed generations of visitors, among them Walt Disney. The castle from a fairy tale simply has to be seen to be believed. It is an absolute 'must-see' experience for any visitor to Bavaria. It is about the stunning Bavarian scenery around the castle, and the history of Bavaria that is written into Neuschwanstein.



**BMW World (Welt)...** BMW Welt combines futuristic architecture with fascinating insights into the present and future of mobility. Immerse yourself in the variety of the BMW Group brand world with our exhibitions, discover our event highlights, and enjoy a range of culinary offers. The BMW Museum brings to life over 100 years of automotive fascination, innovation, dynamism and the joy of driving. In this fascinating permanent exhibition, all questions about BMW, brand and product history will be answered and the arc from the beginnings to the present to the future will be stretched. Look forward to a unique experience.



**Town Square (Marienplatz)...** Brimming with tourists and shopping, the square has been at the centre of the city since the 12th century and is named for a Marian column that was raised here in the 17th century. The monument is from 1638 and celebrates the withdrawal of Swedish troops from Munich during the 30 Years' War. The golden statue at the top is older, sculpted in 1590 and showing Mary on a crescent moon as the Queen of Heaven.

This was the first Marian column north of the Alps, and the forerunner for a host of similar monuments in Bavaria and Central Europe.



**Beer Gardens (Biergärten)...** It's impossible to ignore [Munich's](#) beer halls and gardens – throughout Bavaria, *bier* is a vital part of life, and nowhere is this more evident than in the state capital, home to [Oktoberfest](#). Munich's best beer halls are some of Germany's most famous and, in the sunny south of the country, the city's beer gardens enjoy an ideal climate for supping from a *Maß* – a litre-mug of beer.





# Things to do in Prague

**Charles Bridge...** It may be one of Prague's most iconic attractions, but the 650-year-old [Charles Bridge](#) doesn't cost a penny to cross. Stroll along its stone cobbles to admire rows of baroque statues, enjoy armies of buskers and artists, and take in the spectacular spires and domes on both sides of the river. For a great view of the full 1640ft (500m) span of the stone-arch bridge, head to the riverbank behind the [Franz Kafka Museum](#).



**Týn Church...** The Czech Republic is among the most secular countries on earth, yet its capital is jam-packed with majestic churches from centuries past – and many are free to enter (though donations will be gratefully received). One of the most photographed is the [Church of Our Lady Before Týn](#), a twin-spired Gothic masterpiece looming over the Old Town Square. Step inside to explore a bold baroque interior, including a 17th-century altar and the tomb of pioneering Danish astronomer Tycho Brahe, who is also notable for sporting an artificial nose throughout most of his life (his original sniffer being partially decapitated in a sword duel with a contemporary over who was the better mathematician).

**Old Town Square...** Bordering it are lots of different rooftop restaurants that, along with great food, offer lovely views of the square below. Nestled amongst the spires of the churches that surround the square is Terrace At Prince, a fantastic restaurant that makes for an epic dining setting. With international dishes as well as the usual Czech specialties; basking in the sun above the rooftops is a relaxing and refreshing experience. Generally, we recommend dining away from main tourist attractions like this, but the views up here more than make up for the prices.



**Letná Beer Garden Prague...** Besides beer and street food, it offers visitors a beautiful panoramic view of Prague [Old Town](#). At the entrance to the beer garden you can buy a variety of snacks, sausages and other food. There are special tracks for roller-skating as well as numerous children's playgrounds.
