2023 President Report

This season saw the QCMBL still trying to bounce back from the pandemic that saw us lose over 70 % of our membership. We continue to work on recruiting new players through various forms of advertising, free try-lacrosse days and winter camps. While it has been a struggle since returning to full play, we continue to work to make the box lacrosse experience for all. We did see an increase in our U9 Registration numbers this past season, which gives us hope moving in to next season.

We also have an issue in Regina with the lack of a facility that we are able to use year round for camps, winter programs, early and late season work, etc. Being at the mercy of the all mighty hockey in Regina always pushes us to the back when it comes to facility usage and other facilities in Regina are privately owned which also causes a struggle.

This season saw the expansion of our annual Mother's Day Classic Tournament. While we have traditionally held this tournament over the Mother's Day weekend, it previously only included the U11 Division. This season we decided to expand from the U11 division and include the U13, U15 and U17 Divisions. We had twenty-two teams from across the province attend to our first expanded tournament and will continue to grow that in the coming seasons.

We also continued to see success with our House level and Barracuda 'A' programs in the Province, which included multiple South Sask Lacrosse League and Provincial medals. Special congratulations to our U11 Reapers who completed an undefeated season through league play, league playoffs, and the Provincial Festival. Also to our U17 Barracuda team winning the Canada Day Tournament in Calgary.

We were also able to field two junior level programs based out of Regina this year with the QCMBL Jr Barracuda playing in the PGLL and in partnership with the QC Kings for their RMLL team. Our junior numbers look strong going in to the 2024 season.

As always, we continue to work at bringing in new coaches and referees, which as we all know can be a struggle. We are working on bringing in younger coaches recently removed from the junior ages and keeping them involved with the game.

Moving in to the 2024 season, we look forward to getting back in to the arenas and watching all our players continue to grow and have fun. We will continue to work with our Board members, other Member Associations in the South Sask Lacrosse League and across the Province, as well as the Saskatchewan Lacrosse Association. We will continue to work hard with all of these Boards and Associations to provide a quality lacrosse product on the floor, continue to grow the game in Regina, and continue to work towards new and exciting opportunities for all of our players, coaches and families.

2023 Vice - President Report

Another busy Lacrosse season has come and gone. The season was a very busy one that saw all the age divisions manage and work through a chaotic game and practice schedule. The numbers and excitement among the Mini Tyke, Tyke, and U11 age group is a very encouraging sign that lacrosse in Regina will continue to grow. Competitive teams in all the age groups that played in the SSLL was a testament to a lot of work put in by coaches and players. QCMBL was also well represented with players on every Team Sask team that participated at Nationals which was encouraging to see that the development and coaching they receive is working. Lastly, speaking of Nationals, Regina hosted the largest National Box Lacrosse Tournament ever held and thanks to our many association member volunteers, 2023 Box Nationals was hugely successful and garnered so much positive feedback from across the country. Thank you again to all our players, coaches, parents, referees, and volunteers on a great Lacrosse season and we will see you back in 2024.

Treasurer's Report

Our total income over 2022 was up \$10,000. Registrations were slightly higher, and we still have some Accounts outstanding. Our expenses were up by \$24,650 over 2022. The SLA 2022 fees were recorded in 2023 however, as we did not get the invoice until 2023 season. This would take \$14,000 off 2023 expenses. Our floor rental was \$6,000 lower in 2023 than in 2022 and we thank Becky for watching that. We will try to shave more off this year. Ref fees were down as well but with the mentoring program it will stay consistent around the \$14,000 mark. The fixed expenses stayed the same such as rental space, bank fees, and website costs. This is the second year in a row that we have taken a loss. Registration fees will need to be raised as we are not covering our operating expenses with what we are collecting currently.

RAMP was used again this year for players to register online. Options were made for players paying by etransfer, cash, cheque, Kidsport, Jump Start, Band payment, etc.

Coaching Report

Another year has come and gone for lacrosse in Regina and surrounding areas. Like many years before, finding coaches always requires additional searching and convincing of new and old members to be involved. We had several new faces to the coaching position in the younger age divisions and hope to further this involvement with early notice and advertisement of coaching seminars/on-floor training sessions. The 2023 season saw two separate sessions organized for both community (CMD) and competitive (CPI) training, with numbers being lower in the latter of the two. For the 2024 season, emphasis should be placed on early posting of sessions, allowing more time for word to be spread about the event as well as giving members time to organize their schedules accordingly.

Equipment Report

A quiet Equipment report as the only changes in 2023 was the purchase of an extra set of jerseys for the U15 and U17. Each of these age categories has now been updated with 3 full sets in the past 2 years.

DIVISION REPORTS

U7 & U9 Division Reports

The 2023 U7 and U9 season was a success. Registration numbers were consistent with prior season, which included a slight increase in the U9 numbers. The year was filled with fun and development with a number of excellent coaches and new volunteers to assist with on floor sessions. The on floor sessions ran through out the season and ended with the annual QCMBL's U7 and U9 Festival. The festival ran with mini games with teams from southern Saskatchewan all enjoying a free hot dog lunch. In 2023 our teams also had the experience to travel to other southern Saskatchewan festival days. It was a great way for the athletes to experience some local travel and tournament fun.

U11 Division Report

The U11 division had two teams this year consisting of 36 players. The season provided development for the players and a lot of fun. The Reapers went undefeated throughout the season. It was a great season for all.

U13 Report

We had two teams compete this season in the U13 Division, the Warriors and Crossfire.

The players had fun and a great season!

U15 Division Report

The U15 division consisted of 2 teams (Regina Predators and Regina Titans). The Titans were able to finish 3rd place in league play while the Predators found success in a 5th place finish. Both teams came up with tough provincial matchups and the Titans would lose in the B bronze medal game while the Predators dropped their final game in the B semifinals to the Titans for a birth in the B bronze game. The season started out with some scheduling issues as the coaching staffs for the U15 division were unfortunately secured late. With both teams having athletes from the A program participating in house, finding dates for practices took some work. Once the A program had their practices set with the help of some other coaches in other divisions we were able to move some floor times around to make sure all athletes were able to participate as needed in both A and house league events. As the season moved forward all the scheduling issues were resolved. In tournament play one of the teams had a goalie go out with injury and both teams along with parents of the athletes were able to work together to ensure both teams would have a goalie for the tournament as well.

U17 Division Report

This year the U17 division consisted of 2 teams (Regina Waterdogs and Regina Snipers). The division operated smoothly with no issues brought to the attention of the board. Both teams performed well in league play finishing 2nd and 3rd and strongly represented QCMBL at Provincials playing against each other in the B bronze medal game.

Jr Division Report

The Junior division had a total of 22 registered participants from the Regina area, including Standing Buffalo. We entered one team in the Prairie Gold Lacrosse League (PGLL) at the Junior level. The PGLL had 5 teams (Regina, Prince Albert, Swift Current, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon) for the 2023 season. They decided to do a 12-game schedule with playoffs to culminate. The Regina Barracuda was able to win 5 games and finished third place in the regular season. We lost our first game in the playoffs to Prince Albert and were eliminated.

"A" League Division Report

This season our Barracuda teams continued to progress and see success on the floor. Many new players and coaches started with our program that will allow our teams to continue to grow in the future. Our Barracuda teams attended the Curtis Ptolmey Memorial Tournament in Saskatoon coming away with two silver medals. The teams also attended the Prestigious Canada Day Lacrosse Tournament in Calgary were our U17 team was able to capture gold against some of the best 'A' teams from Alberta, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, and the United States. This was a fantastic achievement by them! In the Provincial championships, our teams came away with a Silver and Gold! It was another fantastic year for the Barracuda teams and we look forward to next season.
