This season the U11 age group had 29 players. The large numbers are contributed to the MOU agreement with Medicine hat Minor Hockey. With the large number of players in U11 division this allowed the group to split into two teams who played in the Central Alberta Hockey League. For the league tiering, the teams were entered as one tier 3 and one tier 5. After the tiering round the tier 3 team moved to Tier 2. And the tier 5 team remained the same through regular season.

U11 Tier 2 (White) had a great season playing hard throughout. The finished the season with a 6-7-3 record. The team lost out in the first round of playoffs to Pincher Creek. Throughout the season the team attended several tournaments. One in Bentley which they won. a tournament in Irvine they took a loss in the finals due to shootout. And the home association U11 tournament which they won.

U11 Tier 5 (Blue) had a great season as well playing hard throughout the season. The finished the regular season with an 8-7-1 record. The T5 team lost out in the first round of playoffs to Kainai. The team attended several tournaments. One in Airdrie, Bow Island and the home association U11 tournament.
