## Competitions Report

The Ringette P.E.I. house league season started on October 28, 2014 and completed on March 3, 2015 for U12-U16/U19/18+ and on March 24, 2015 for the U8 and U10 divisions. Charlottetown continued dividing their U8 players with first year players into a U8 bunny program that did not play in the league schedule to develop players' skills & confidence for their first year. Rustico also had a similar U8 Bunny program and also had a U12 team this year as their club continues to grow the sport in their area. The RPEI board allowed goaltenders to be called across and up from other associations this season when a team did not have their regular goaltender available. This was used 4 times this season across the regular house league season but was not available for the playdowns or Championship Day.

Each association had the following teams in each division with a total of 43 (up from 40 last season) teams registered this season:

- Charlottetown - U8 (2+3), U10 (5), U12 (5), U14 (5), U16/U19 (4) and 18+ (2)
- Montague - U8 (1), U10 (1), U12 (1), U14 (1) and U16/U19 (1)
- Souris - U8 (1), U10 (2), U12 (2), U14 (1) and U16/U19 (1)
- Summerside - U12 (1) and U14 (1)
- Rustico - U8 (1+1), U10 (1), U12 (1)

The U16/U19 teams were scheduled this year to play 1 home and 1 away game against the 18+ teams and the balance of their 22 games were a round-robin mix with the U16/U19 teams. As a result, the Goalline web site could not handle that format and the schedule was manually created for this level and imported to the website. Followed by the U8, U10, U12 and U14 divisions, all manually created and uploaded to the website.

The season continued to be a challenging one due to the number of activities to schedule around throughout the season as well as the weather cancellations in February and March, even with the extra days at the start of the season with the Oct 28 start date. The league finished the season with the schedule extended by one day and with the semi-finals playoff games subject to weather review daily to get the games completed before the Championship Day.

Ringette Championship weekend started with the U8 and U10 Jamboree held at the Pownal Sports Centre on Saturday, March 28. All teams played 2 games and performed skills on-ice as well as participating in off-ice activities - Wii dancing, team banners, and cheering contest. On Sunday, March 29, the Provincial Championships were hosted by the Montague Association at the Three Rivers Sportsplex in Georgetown.

The 2015 Atlantic Championship were held from January 30 - February 1, 2015 in Halifax. Our 4 teams were entered in the U14, U16, 18+, and Canada Games divisions. The U16 team captured 2nd place with a loss to NB in the final game.

The Canada Games team were in Prince George, BC for week one of the 2015 Winter games from February 13-21, 2015. They were officially 1 win and 4 losses (Alberta 11 vs PEI 4, BC 7 vs PEI 4, NS 6 vs PEI 3, PEI 9 vs SK 8, Quebec 9 vs PEI 5) but very close and competitive in many of their games and showed the great Island spirit at the games.

The 2015 Eastern Canadian Ringette Championships were held from April 16-19, 2015 in Moncton, NB with teams entered in the U14, U16, U19 and 18+ divisions. The U19 team finished in 2nd place with a loss to Ontario and the U16 team finished 3rd in a loss to Ontario. Great showing by all teams at the Easterns in all levels as we continue to improve our skills each year.

## Officials Report

The 2014-15 season was an eventful and exciting year for Officials. Some of our Associations significantly increased the number of teams at the lower levels, resulting in a higher demand for junior officials. Although there were a few challenges with some of the officials' assignments; through evaluations, on ice experience and a little encouragement, most officials showed marked improvement.

The following courses were offered on the Island in the fall:

October 18, Level 1 Course, Charlottetown

November 29, Level 1 Course, Montague (cancelled due to lack of participants)

Overall, there were 13 new officials added this season for a total of 56 registered officials.



Patrick Dean continued in his role as an evaluator and was invited to participate in the following tournaments: Miramichi, Charlottetown, the Atlantic Ringette Championships in Halifax and the Eastern Canadian Ringette Championships in Moncton.

Shot clocks were utilized for the second year in a row and were introduced at the U12 level. The players, parents, coaching staff, officials and minor officials continue to adjust well and encourage others to learn and participate in the role of shot clock operator.

The Island was represented at the Atlantic Ringette Championships, January 30 - February 2 by Breanne MacInnis, Alan Gordon and Patrick Dean. The Eastern Canadian Ringette Championships, April 16-19 saw Breanne MacInnis and Dan Delaney represent the province.

Championship day was held on March 29 at Pownal Arena, where six different senior officials participated in some very exciting games, some of them decided by a one goal difference.

Mike Devine once again hosted a U12 Development Team Jamboree in Pownal, April 3-4, which also included teams from the U14 and U16 high performance programs. Officials across the Island were approached to participate and 15 different officials, of varying experience, participated.

The further development of officials comes from gaining knowledge, experience, confidence and a better understanding of the game. Officials learn a great deal when they work together with colleagues from their own and other Associations.

Tryouts were held and team selection began in the fall 2014. Efforts continued into late fall to secure a second goalie to join the team. Late November a second goalie was secured.

The season began with an intensive gym training series for the team at Synergy Fitness. The team participated in group training sessions as well as self-lead fitness work outs provided by Synergy and running programs. The team held on-ice practice a minimum of bi-weekly primarily in Morell and Pownal. Also the team participated in a number of on and off Island exhibition games, team building activities, fundraisers and tournaments.

The coaching staff made great strides in advancing the PEI program through prioritizing physical fitness, nutrition and fine tuning systems and player response on the ice. PEI was recognized by several clubs throughout the year and Ringette Canada during the CWGs for the strides in player development noting PEI as being a contender at the elite level of competition.

In summary the team program began in June 2014 with a 3 month in-gym fitness program, ROPES program, and between August and February 2015 players participated in 46 on ice practices, 17 exhibition games, and 17 tournament games! 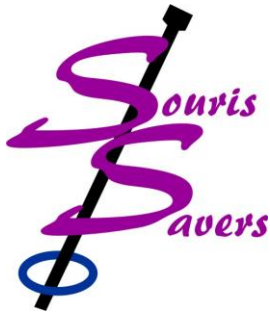
Financially, we are in good shape. All bills are paid and we have money set aside to start doing some player development activities next year.

I would like to thank everyone on the Ringette PEI board and in the ringette community for all of their hard work and dedication to the sport. It has been great to work with such a dedicated group of volunteers. The hours spent organizing are reflected in the success of our league and the continued increase in members.



This season, RPEI iced five high performance teams. The U14, U16, and 18+ teams all competed at both the Atlantics Ringette Championships and the Eastern Canadian Ringette Championships. The U19A team competed at Easterns. The Canada Winter Games team competed at Atlantics and the Canada Winter Games. All teams boasted successful years with the CWG team notching PEI's first win at the Games since 1999, the U19A team winning a silver medal at Easterns, the U16 team winning a silver medal at Atlantics and a bronze medal at Easterns, and the U14 team finishing Easterns with a 2-2 record. Additionally, the CWG team had 3 players finishing in the top 12 in points, Ashley Hollis, Alysha Corrigan, and Sidney Corrigan. And the U16 team won the team skills event at Easterns.

The house league ran relatively smoothly this year. There were a few issues with officials but RPEI continues to work to find solutions and give the younger officials more opportunities to officiate with senior officials and more training experiences. RPEI again hosted its year-end jamboree for the U8 and U10 divisions. A few minor tweaks and a lot of parent volunteers improved this event. This event is an excellent way to celebrate the year for these ages and has become a season highlight for most players, if not their parents.
