# **Competitions Report**

The 2016/17 Ringette PEI House League Regular Season began on Monday Oct. 24, 2016 and concluded on Sunday March 5th. The season progressed basically as planned. There were significantly more weather related cancellations than in the previous season.

A special note of thanks to the Association Ice Schedulers for their cooperative attitude and assistance throughout the season. Thanks to the team managers for timely attention to their duties.

The number of teams from each Association and at each level can be found in the following table:

In addition to these teams several Associations also had U6 groups, Learn to Play or other Development programs.

### U8/U10/U12

For the 2016/17 Regular Season:

- Teams in the U8 Division competed in six scheduled games.
- The U10 League consisted of 18 Regular Season games
- The U12 League consisted of 20 Regular Season games.

For the second year in a row RPEI piloted a tier scheme in the U10 and U12 Divisions. The purpose was to have the majority of teams be as competitive as possible in as many games as possible.

In U10 the process was that after 12 Regular Season games had been played the U10 teams were divided into two tiers based on accumulated points. There are no published standings or playoffs at U10 so specific divisions were not required.

At U12 a similar process was used. After 10 games the six teams with the highest accumulated points were placed into the Hollis Division. The remaining five teams were placed in the O'Brien Division. A new schedule was created where teams competed only inside their respective Division. Each Division had its own playoff format and two U12 Championship Games were held.

RPEI will be evaluating this pilot to determine if it should be considered for future seasons.

The U8 Jamboree took place in Georgetown on March 4<sup>th</sup>. The U10 Jamboree was held at the Pownal Sports Centre on Sunday, April 2nd. All teams played 2 games and performed skills on ice as well as participating in off-ice activities: Wii dancing, team banners, and cheering contest.

# U14, U16/U19 and 18+

- The U14 League consisted of 20 Regular Season games.
- The U16/U19 and 18+ Divisions consisted of 22 Regular Season games.

As with previous years the U16/U19 and 18+ competed in an unbalanced format. The U16/U19 teams played 4 of their Regular Season games versus the 18+ teams and the remaining 18 Regular Season games versus other U16/U19 teams. The 18+ teams played 9 of their Regular Season games against U16/U19 teams and 13 versus the other three 18+ teams. The U16/U19 and 18+ competed in separate playoff formats.

Playoffs were held in play down format (U12, U14, U16/U19, 18+) between March 6th and March 31st. On Sunday, April 2nd, the Provincial Championships were held in Pownal.

Congratulations to all Ringette PEI coaches for another great season. We would also like to extend our thanks to all assistant coaches, managers, parents, officials, and volunteers who's support is integral to the success of Ringette PEI.

# Officials Report

As the sport of ringette continues to grow and with more teams at the lower levels, more officials are required. The 2016-17 season began with two Level 1 courses being offered to keep up with the demand for officials. These courses were offered at the following times and locations:

Level 1 Officials Clinic
October 2, 2017
Pownal Sports Centre
Level 1 Officials Clinic
November 13, 2017
North Star Arena, Rustico

Nine young ladies attended the clinic in Pownal, with 4 attending the Level 1 clinic in Rustico; two of which, were returning Officials looking to get refreshed. Most, if not all, of the participants were players who very engaged in the course and had a great knowledge of the game - very impressive.

A Level 2/3 Clinic was offered in Dieppe, N.B. on December 10, 2017. Three dedicated officials from the Island; Judy Hennessey, Eryne MacLeod and Marc Reid, went to great lengths at a very busy time of year, to attend the clinic in order to further improve their skills.

Overall, total count for new and remaining officials is 56. All registered officials are not necessarily actively participating and given that the 2017-18 season is a refresher year where returning Officials have to attend a Refresher Clinic to continue officiating. Those that have not had a very positive experience, may not return.

Montague hosted their annual Early Bird tournament from November 17-20, 2017, where another successful tournament was offered with some very competitive games being contested. Charlottetown hosted its 13<sup>th</sup> annual tournament January 12-15, 2017, with 96 teams participating in 164 games - a total of 328 assignments for officials. With a tournament of this magnitude, organizers needed all the help they could get - 45 Officials participated, 12 from N.B., with 7 of them attending the tournament solely to officiate. Lucie Anne Ingoldsby attended as a Supervisor and also offered an Evaluator course to Breanne MacInnis over the weekend, which is critical to the further development of newer and all officials.

The Atlantics were held in Charlottetown from February 17-19, 2017, where Breanne MacInnis, Isabelle Saunders and Ashley Hollis represented the province, with a special cameo appearance by Alan Gordon.

Ringette Quebec hosted the Eastern Canadian Ringette Championships April 13-16, 2016, at the Pierrefonds Sportsplex. Officials and Supervisors were selected to participate from all 5 eastern provinces, up to and including Ontario. There were 17 officials and 5 supervisors participating during the event. The Island was represented by Breanne MacInnis, Isabelle Saunders and Dan Delaney. Ringette Canada invited David Singh to be a supervisor, plus there were 4 other supervisors available over the weekend who offered full coverage for every game and provided consistent feedback, advice and evaluations. From an Official's point of view, the event was very well organized, with great attention to detail, resulting in a successful Championship weekend.

Championship Day was held at the Pownal Sport Centre on April 2, 2017, to a packed arena. There were seven senior officials selected, who participated in some very exciting games.

Near the end of the season, the U12 girls look forward to the U12 Development Team Jamboree, which was hosted once again in the Charlottetown area with games being played at the Pownal Sport Centre on April 8 & 9, 2017. All eligible officials were invited to participate and of the nine that did, they enjoyed some very entertaining, close and exciting games.

# **U12 Development Program Report**

The U12 development program had a great year. The coaches this year were Scott Fisher, Brad Potter, Mike Devine and Rachel Chapman.

The program this year consisted of 61 skaters and 4 goalies who attended the base program. Two ice times were required for each session.

Because of the large numbers it was decided to go with two programs, a Base Program and a Training Team program. The Base Program consisted of players that would practice every Saturday. The Training Team program consisted of players who would practice every Saturday and play exhibition games against U12 Teams from NB and NS as well as some U14 teams.

The girls from both programs had practices most Saturdays. There were 16 sessions with the girls divided alphabetically for the ice times.

To go along with the practices the girls in the Base program had 3 inter-squad games. They also had the opportunity to go over and play 2 games against some Nova Scotia Development players in Amherst.

The girls in the Training Team program consisted of 27 players and 6 alternates. In addition to the 16 main practices these players had 2 additional practices to get ready for games and the jamboree. Each of the 27 players had the opportunity to play 14 games this season, with alternates playing half of the games. The games were exhibition games against the NB and NS U12 development teams. There were also inter-squad games and games against the U14 teams on PEI.

Included in those games were 4 games for each team in the end of the year Jamboree. The Jamboree was held in CARI and Simmons. There were 7 teams participating in the Jamboree two
