Hosted an average of 23 full-time players from Saskatoon, Swift Current, Prince Albert & Regina together to compete across a variety of different competitions, showcases & trials.

The program brought in 10 new players, joining from a pool of 57 identified athletes that were scouted from various events.





COACH HIGHLIGHTS

Coach Workshops

Coach Developer Workshop with Mike Whyatt

On December 8, 2024, Coach Developers and Technical Leaders joined Mike Whyatt to begin a larger discussion on the role of technical directors and how they can be best suited to support the coaches in their clubs. 15 individuals joined this event and will be invited to attend an in-person workshop held in April 2025 to further the conversations and learnings.

Power Chair Soccer Workshop

Dwayne Myrmo attended this one-day education session for new coaches and facilitators to learn the rules and equipment to play power chair soccer. Dwayne has years of experience as the Alberta Provincial Coach and the Men's National Para Team assistant coach.

Soccability Workshop

SSA received a grant from Canada Soccer to introduce Soccability to Saskatchewan. John Clubb from Soccability Canada was in Saskatoon to lead an education session for interested coaches, technical director's, officials, volunteers and participants to learn about adaptations to the game of soccer.

Technical Director Grassroots Workshop with Wayne Cleverly

On December 2, 2024, Master Coach Developer and Canada Soccer Manager of Grassroots Programming, Wayne Cleverly presented to 16 technical directors and technical staff members across the province. This 90 minute session was geared towards assisting technical leads in the development and enhancement of grassroots programming. Topics covered included a holistic approach to player and coach development, the implementation of Skill Centres, session frameworks, and tools to support coach education.

Grassroots Coach Workshop with Wayne Cleverly and Hollie Babut

On December 4, 2024, 46 coaches from across the province joined Master Coach Developer and Canada Soccer Manager of Grassroots Programming, Wayne Cleverly, and Canada Soccer Master Coach Developer, Hollie Babut, to learn more about coaching U7-U13 aged players. The session focused on session design strategies, key outcomes from practice, and how to support player development through transformational coaching behaviours.



REFEREE HIGHLIGHTS

Referee Registration

2024 showed an increase in registration numbers compared with 2023 (475 vs 452).

Referee Initiatives

The overall referee registration numbers have increased by 23 referees.

Despite the substantial increase in the number of new referees through the Entry Level Clinics, there has been a notable decline in the number of returning match officials from 2023.

This disparity underscores the imperative for ongoing efforts to foster a respectful environment and provide mentorship and education.

Saskatchewan Soccer partnered with the University of Ottawa, BC Soccer and Ontario Soccer to conduct a Safe Sport Research Program under a larger spectrum of Mental Health. First year results showed that 89% of the SK soccer referees have been exposed to verbal/physical abuse.

By investing in Safe Sport research, we wish to maintain and increase the understanding of the behaviors that need to be reinforced or prevented, and to evaluate the impact of the Abuse-Free Sport programs and initiatives.

Referee Professional Appointments

Chantal Boudreau received 15 MLS appointments as well as 4 domestic professional appointments. Dan Boudreau received 12 domestic professional appointments.

Vitalii Oliinichenko (2) and Richard Kent (1) were appointed in the MLS.

Access to Major Competitions

SK referees were involved in several National competitions. Across the 20 appointments received, Theo Diederichsen was appointed to the Gold Medal Game at CCAA Male National Championships, Shukwia Tajik to the Bronze Medal Game (CCAA Female Championships). Miguel Carrillo officiated in the U15B Semifinal(Referee) and U15B Final (AR).

Referee Education

- SERP/Candidates Program 39 unique participants met over 17 sessions.
- Futsal education sessions consisted of 2 sessions with 26 unique participants.
- Community Referee Refreshers were offered as a benefit to registered SSA referees – 4 online sessions with 131 participants.

Active Developers (Instructors/ Assessors)

- A total of 20 clinicians (18 male and 2 female) with 14 Assessors (13 male and 1 female) were accredited in 2024 and 400 assessments provided throughout the season.

Leadership Development

- Community Refresher Sessions were taught by 4 new up and coming instructors, current members of SERP (SK Elite Referee Program).
- 2 new Instructors led 4 Entry Level Courses, graduating from an apprentice instructor to a full-fledged instructor – Laurie Winter and Frank Laterza.
- 1 Instructor has attended the Provincial Promotion in Laval – Daniel Boudreau.
- 2 SSA Instructors have been confirmed on the CSA National List of instructors – Len Chelack (16th year) and Octavian Iliuta (3rd year).

REFEREE HIGHLIGHTS

Referee Courses

- Canada Soccer Smarter U Module implementation went smoothly.
- 16 Entry Level Courses resulted in the addition of 242 officials.
- 2 Futsal Entry Level courses resulted in certification of 38 new Futsal officials.
- One SERP official successfully gained Provincial accreditation.
- 5/8 officials were promoted from District to Regional classification.

Referee Development Grant

- Enabled 33 officials to pursue higher levels of officiating for a total of \$5,500.
- 5 SK referees and 1 SK instructor have been funded with \$1800 for out of province appointment opportunities.

Female Development Network

The group came together in April to celebrate another successful year and to begin planning education, events, and outreach for 2024-25. During that time, the group worked on redeveloping the mission and values, and to rename the group to the Female Development Network.

To increase, support, and retain women in soccer through empowerment, inclusion, and education.

2024-25 Intake

The FDN 2024-25 intake kicked off in October with an in-person session with 29 participants joining from around the province. The network continues to work on developing and creating opportunities for women on and off the field.

MAP Grant

A total of \$250,900 was distributed between 43 Member Organizations.

Athlete Assistance

A total of \$40,155 was distributed via 35 payments to support athletes in pursuing high-performance training opportunities.

November Member Session - November 1-2, 2024

8 Member organizations attended. Elder, Mary Lee, opened the day with a blessing. An in-person session was held for members on an "Introduction to anti-racism" facilitated by the Multicultural Council of Saskatchewan. Allison Forsyth provided an update on the safe sport audit of the SSA.

Lunch & Learns

Established monthly sessions scheduled the 3rd Wednesday of each month providing information to membership on a variety of topics supporting the Everyone's game strategies.



ORGANIZATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Financial Management

- In 2024 SSA managed the budget to a surplus of \$214,147. Self-Help revenue raised by 26.5%. The third year of the investment strategy yielded \$108,744 between interest and unrealized gain.
- SSA presented an unqualified audit report for the 11th year in a row and membership confirmed Virtus Group as the auditor for the 2024 fiscal year.

IDEA Funding

- SSA received a 3 year grant funding commitment from Sask Sport allowing for a full time staff position to focus on inclusivity initiatives

AGM – March 22/23 in Regina

- RAMP Interactive Come & Go Social held on Friday night giving Director candidates the chance to meet with membership
- Annual General Meeting took place at The Conexus Arts Centre with 56 individuals in attendance. Lisa Bagonluri – President, as well as Directors Gord Quinlan, Jakub Rogowski, Nicole Tryhorn and Glen Schuler were re-elected. Amanda Stith was welcomed to the Board as a new Director.
- Following the AGM sessions were held by RAMP Interactive and Satori Surveys to present to membership on the services available via their organizations.

Everyone's Game Strategy

- A yearly review and update of strategies was undertaken in September with a focus group of 6 people. We will continue to educate, bring awareness and provide opportunities to equity deserving groups and the membership to further the strategies of Everyone's Game.

Partnerships and Collaborations

Accessible soccer programming has partnered with many community groups, healthcare facilities and the University of Regina to provide learning, recruiting, and volunteers to new programming opportunities.



COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

Soccer Day in Saskatchewan - July 20th Regina SK

- SDIS was held in Regina on July 20th moving to a one-day event. Kids camps, 3-on-3 tournament, girls only camp, an adaptive camp and a powerchair event highlighted the day along with PSL finals. SSA would like to thank the University of Regina Cougars soccer team for their assistance in the delivery of the events throughout the day.

Adaptive Soccer

- Saskatchewan Soccer continues to promote Walking Soccer matches during member events. This adaptive style of play has started to pick up across the province with multiple member organizations now offering Walking Soccer programming. In 2024, two Powerchair Try it events were hosted, teams have now begun training in both Saskatoon and with FC Regina. After the Soccability workshop was held two member organizations have added All Abilities programming to regular indoor programs (SYSI, FC Regina).

AccelerateHER

- 3 Saskatchewan coaches awarded \$5,000 each towards Advanced Coach Education Diploma work.

Gender Equity Playbook

- This playbook was completed under the direction and support of Canadian Women and Sport over a 6 month process. A focus group reviewed current strategies and policies, and the final report from Canadian Women and Sport has given us a pathway to follow to increase programming and participation for females across the province.

Canada Soccer

- Soccer in Schools Grant - SSA received a grant from Canada Soccer that allowed us to send equipment packages and educational information to 16 Northern Community schools. There were an additional 9 SSA member organizations that had successful grant applications and are in partnership with local schools in their communities to enhance soccer programming.

Adaptive Programming

- Following the success of SDIS adaptive soccer day, SSA hosted an 8-week program for adaptive soccer in Regina, the program had volunteers from the University of Regina Kinesiology 341 – Therapeutic Recreation class assigned to assist with program facilitation, and members of the University of Regina Cougars Soccer Team. There were 5 MO's who identified increasing adaptive participation in their clubs through the MAP-SPF grant and we will continue to support these initiatives.

Power Soccer Program

- Following the success of SDIS adaptive soccer day, SSA hosted a 7-week program for Power Chair soccer in Regina, the program had volunteers from the University of Regina Kinesiology 341 – Therapeutic Recreation class assigned to assist with program facilitation.

Girls only/Newcomer Programming

- Following the success of SDIS Girls only soccer day program with a focus on newcomers to Canada, SSA hosted a 4-week program in partnership with FORZA soccer academy to support the recruitment and retention of Muslim and Newcomer female athletes to participate in soccer. The program reached capacity in the first 4 days of advertising.

COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS

Canada Soccer

First Kicks program – 5 clubs received this grant to assist with the recruitment and retention of newcomers to Canada to participate in soccer. Participating member organizations: Astra Soccer Academy, Aurora Soccer Club, FC Regina, Lakewood Soccer Association, and Weyburn Soccer Association.

SSA Futsal in Schools

SSA held a futsal in schools' program in Regina on October 23rd. 6 schools attended for a one-day futsal festival with equipment and session plans provided for schools to utilize to form a school league.
