- Respondents were: 67% Parents, 21% Player, 6% Coach, 2% Organizer, 1% Referee and 4% Other.




## Why did parents decide to enroll their kids in soccer?





## Why did you decide to coach soccer this past year?



**New Qualifications** 








To what degree do you feel your involvement in soccer this past year was value for your membership in the Saskatchewan Soccer Association?


