CSG Weekends & PSL Conflicts

Octavian and I have worked very hard to arrange the dates for the CSG ID Weekends and CSG Training Camp Weekends that have as minimal disruption on Provincials and the PSL as possible. This should mean that players will not have to miss many, if any, PSL games if selected to a CSG roster. Playing in the

PSL will have no bearing on CSG registration, and as per usual, we will encourage players to play in the PSL.

ID Weekend Attendance

There are 3 ID Weekends, each with sessions on Saturday and Sunday, totalling 6 ID sessions. Players are expected to attend all 6 sessions for the best chance of selection. Although this is not mandatory, they will be expected to inform the Head Coaches if they miss ID sessions and provide a reason. Reasonable reasons such, as medical issues etc. will be fine. However, not attending because players do not want to travel may have a bearing on the final selection. However, we will emphasize that this will be considered on a case by case basis and talking with the Head Coach is the best way to discuss any potential issues. There should be no conflict with PSL or Provincial weekends, minimizing any disruption to Member Organisation schedules.
