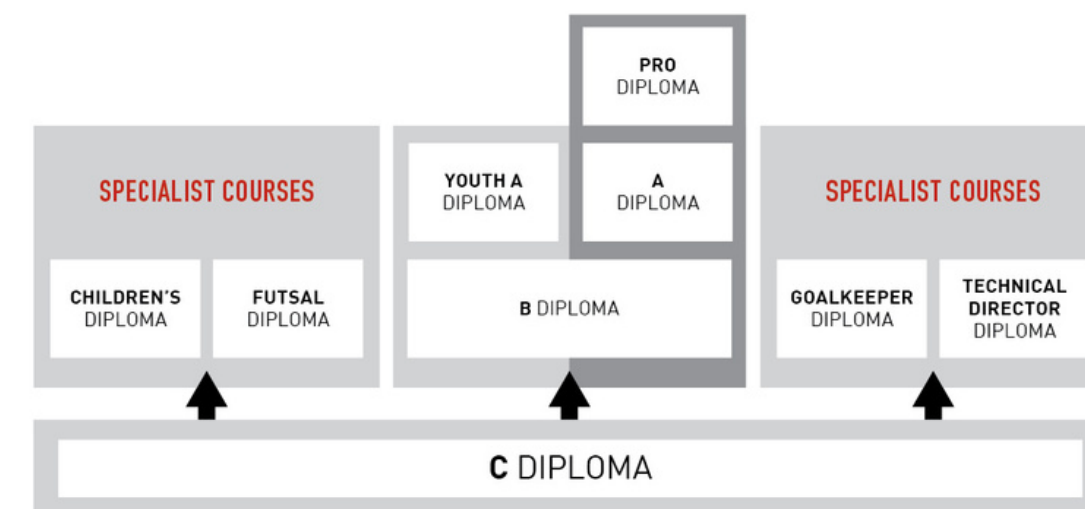

# TEAM PERSONNEL

## Certifications & Requirements

- **Criminal Record Check with Vulnerable Sector**
  - All U5-U19 team personnel are to provide this to their Zone and/or Community Association every two years or more frequently as determined by the association
- **RAMP registration ~ All U5-U19 Team Personnel**
  - All team personnel who will be on-field or on the bench must register online through RAMP as a registered team personnel prior to their first game or practice
- **Respect in Sport (RiS) ~ Free online (Renew every five (5) years)**
  - All U5-U19 team personnel must complete Respect In Sport prior to their first game or practice
- **National Coach Certification Program ~ Minimum one coach per U7-U19 team**
  - Part 1 (online ~ \$20 - \$30 dependent on the course)
  - Part 2 (On-field) : Active Start / FUNdamentals (U7-U9) ~ Apr 21; Learn 2 Train / Soccer 4 Life (U11-U19) ~ Apr 22
- **Making Ethical Decisions and/or Make Ethical Decisions Online Evaluation (Minimum one coach per team ~ U7- U19)**
  - Upcoming clinics: Thurs Apr 20, Wed Apr 26 & Tues May 2 (Free for SYSI Coaches)
- **Making Headway online ~ Minimum one coach per U15-U19 team (free online)**

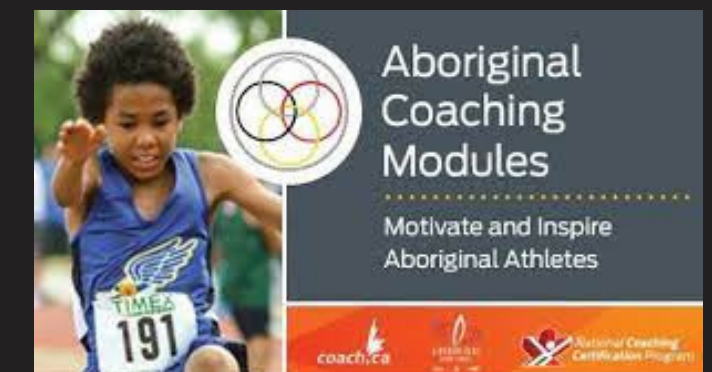

# TEAM PERSONNEL

## Certifications & Requirements

- Keeping Girls In Sport Training (\$17 ~ Online Learning)
  - Highly encouraged for those coaching coed or female teams.
- Aboriginal Coaching Modules (Free)
  - its content reflects the uniqueness of Indigenous cultures, values, and lifestyles and is rolled out in three modules.
- Commit To Kids (\$12 ~ Online Learning)
  - The Commit to Kids (C2K) for Coaches online training empowers coaches with practical information to help them enhance child and youth safety in sport. It highlights the importance of understanding boundaries, sexual misconduct and reporting inappropriate behaviour.





# PLAYER SAFETY

## Codes of Conduct

- The purpose of the Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc. Code of Conduct and Ethics...is to ensure a safe and positive environment...by making individuals aware that there is an expectation, at all times, of appropriate behaviour consistent with Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc.'s core values. Saskatoon Youth Soccer Inc. supports equal opportunity, prohibits discriminatory practices, and is committed to providing an environment in which all individuals are treated with respect

# PLAYER SAFETY

## Rule of Two

- The Rule of Two serves to protect minor athletes in potentially vulnerable situations by ensuring that more than one adult is present
- The Rule of Two states that there will always be two screened and Respect in Sport and NCCP trained or certified coaches with an athlete, especially a minor athlete, when in a potentially vulnerable situation





# PLAYER SAFETY

## Guidelines for Interacting with Children & Adolescents

- When taking on the responsibilities of the role of the coach you are also taking on a position of trust for the athlete.
- This trust is built on boundaries of professionalism inherent in the coach and athlete relationship.
- The responsibility of maintaining the professional relationship and appropriate boundaries always lies with the adult.





# PLAYER SAFETY

## Reporting Abuse or Misconduct

- There is a legal and ethical responsibility to act, when a person becomes aware that a child may be or has been abused.
