6U (Mini Tyke) PLAYING GUIDELINES	
NET SIZE:	4x4 net or Drop Net with regulation crease
PLAYERS:	3 vs. 3
SUBSTITUTIONS:	Equal Participation (ex. 3-minute shifts)
CONTACT:	No Body Checking (Incidental contact permitted)
STICKS:	Stick Length 30" to 36" and no Long Pole (D-Pole)
GOALIES:	No Goalies required
OFFICIALS:	Coaches on the Field, stop and correct throughout

8U (Tyke) PLAYING GUIDELINES	
FIELD SIZE:	7's Field: 40 yards by 80 yards
NET SIZE:	4x4 net or Drop Net with regulation crease
PLAYERS:	7 vs 7
SUBSTITUTIONS:	Equal Participation (ex. 3-minute shifts)
CONTACT:	No Body Checking (Incidental contact permitted)
STICKS:	Stick Length 30" to 36" and no long poles (D-Pole)
GOALIES:	No Goalies required, if players want to try can rotate amongst players
OFFICIALS:	Coaches on the Field, stop and correct throughout

#### 3 vs 3

• Three players on the Field working on fundamentals to move the ball around and get the play into the other team's net.

#### <u>7 vs 7</u>

- One Goalie
- 6 Runners that consist of:
  - o 2 Attack
  - o 2 Midfield
  - o 2 Defense

#### 10 vs 10

- One Goalie
- 9 Runners that consist of:
  - o 3 Attack
  - o 3 Midfield
  - o 3 Defenders
  - As players get older and more advanced Coaches may add in LSM (Long Stick Midfield) to the mix of either Midfield or Defenders)



#### **FIELD SIZES**

#### 7'S FIELD

• Field: 40 yards by 80 yards

• Endline to goal line: 10 Yards

• Wing Lines: 5 Yards into Field and 7.5 Yards both ways from half (total 15 Yard Line)

• Coach Box: Runs from the restraining line to the substitution box, 5 yards wide.

• Scorers Table: Back of the Substitution area

• Substitution Area: 5 yards either side of center and 5 yards deep.

• Goal Crease: 9 ft radius

#### 10'S FIELD

• Field: 120.30 Yards by 65.62 yards

• Field Specifics: As per World Lacrosse Men's Field Rulebook Section 1.

Straight time except for the last 30 seconds in the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter and last 2 minutes of the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter which will be stop time.</li> <li>2 Minute Intermission between 1<sup>st</sup> &amp; 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter and between 3<sup>rd</sup> &amp; 4<sup>th</sup> quarter.</li> <li>5 Minute Half Time Intermission</li> </ul>
