2. Season Overview – Jessica Winship, President

Sherwood Park Ringette Association was the first ringette association in the Province of Alberta & was formed in September 1975. We are the second largest Ringette Association in Alberta and the largest in the North (of the 36 associations in the province).

SPRA provides ringette programming at all levels of ringette from Active Start division to the Open (over-18 Division).

Ringette is focused on long term athlete development, providing athletes the ability to continue playing the sport they love with the friendships they have built past the U19 age group.

Our sport and association are growing. This season we had a healthy 460 athletes registered for the 23/24 season, an increase of 11 from the previous season and an increase of 51 athletes from the 19/20 season. We have seen notable growth at the U10 level and this year in the Open Division.

SPRA formed 33 teams in: Active Start, U10 Step 1, 2, 3, U12 A,B, C, U14 AA, A, B, U16AA, A, B, U19AA, A, B and Open – 4 B teams

This season for our 33 teams, we had:

- 598 Shared Practices
- 563 Full Ice Practices
- 439 Games
- 146 Power Skating Sessions

SPRA continues to focus on coach, player and goalie development with additional power skating sessions, more goalie clinics for all levels, mental training for more levels and wrist shot clinics.

SPRA is also continuing to focus on additional programming opportunities and building out the Active Start, U10 and U12 age groups. SPRA is unique in hosting our Learn to Play program, which is running again this April. And is continuing to offer programming following the regular season with Spring Ringette and our PEAK Development Program, which is focused on player and coach development. We are also planning a Come Try Ringette event later this year.

A big thank you to the volunteers and coaches and athletes within SPRA who make these programs possible and their willingness to work together and provide mentorship and opportunity.

One of our biggest challenges continues to be ice availability and creating a balance of providing opportunity for players outside Strathcona County who don't have adequate ringette programming in their area and the need to focus on our local athletes. SPRA believes in advocating for the growth of ringette in our community and across the province. On that note, there's a potential for additional ice for the association through the new Crusaders Arena, anticipated to be up and running by fall 2026. That will mean an 1000 additional hours of ice for the minor ice user group in Strathcona County and more ice for SPRA.

SPRA's fantastic volunteers put on a handful of great events this past season:

- A successful Platinum Ring Tournament in November 2023
- A successful Mini Platinum Ring Tournament (half-ice teams) in February 2023
- Host of the U10 Step 3 Black League Finals and Step 1 Finals
- Host to the 14A Ringette Alberta Provincials
- Host to the 14AA, 16AA and 19AA Provincials

Our teams represented our community and association well, competing in regular season tournaments with medal wins at all levels, and Provincials and BLG Championships at:

- U19 AA, A
- U16 AA, A, B
- U14 AA, A, B
- U12 A, B and C BGL Championships
- and the U10S3 Finals

As well 9 of our U14/16 athletes and two of our coaches participated in the Alberta Winter Games in February 2024.

For a lot of our teams, their season goal is to qualify for provincials so congratulations to all those teams for reaching their season goal. A few of our teams had outstanding results this season.

Congratulations to the BGL Champions the 19A Surge and to 16A Red who won silver at Provincials in Leduc.

congratulations to the 12C Mighty Skittles (best name, aside from the Rainbow Thunderwolves) who won Bronze in their BGL Championships!

A couple of other notable events this season were the first annual Ringette Week Proclamation by Strathcona County Council October 15 - 21, 2023. A number of our athletes attended the ceremony along with Phyllis Sadoway. This recognition for SPRA was thanks to the efforts of Pam Kennerd our U14 Director and social media guru, and this will be an annual proclamation. Thanks Pam for the great idea and work to see this come to fruition!

As well we hosted a successful SPRA day on October 21st which was planned by a small committee.

And we hosted skills evaluation for the Alberta Winter Games!

Guidelines and Procedures Manual Updates - April 2024 – Jessica Winship, President

A small policy committee consisting of members of the SPRA board conducted a review and refresh of the Guidelines and Procedures Manual. This consists of alignment with government body policy, lessons learned this season and recommendations from panel findings, as well as a clean up related to content, formatting and consistency - which includes the description of the board roles.

The updated Manual was posted on the SPRA website and members were advised via email with a link to the Manual that it has been updated 14 days prior to the AGM, as per our policy requirement.

5. Executive Nominations – Run by Phil Bloomfield, Outgoing Vice-President

This year the board implemented a revised process for board nominations based on lessons learned, with the goal of supporting smooth transition and onboarding. Applicants and nominees filled out a form with key questions and information. A small Board Selection Committee then met with each potential board member to conduct an informal interview/conversation.

As a result, in the event there are new nominees from the floor tonight, the BSC will meet these individuals to walk through the same process prior to board confirmation.

For the election tonight, the process will be:

- 1. Election Chair will present the Nomination Slate as developed by the Board Selection Committee.
- 2. Each position will be open to nominations from the floor.
- 3. Election Chair will ask the membership three times for nominations from the floor.
- 4. Nomination must be accepted by the Nominee, either in person verbally or in writing.
- 5. If there is more than one nomination for a position, a vote will occur.
- 6. Bio's will be read in cases where there are multiple nominations.
- 7. A vote will follow the nominee presentations.
- 8. A count of the vote will occur by a minimum of two individuals from the current executive. (Theresa and Kristy)
- 9. Following the vote tally and confirmation, the Election chair will announce the winner.

Any protest of the Election Results will be reviewed by the Election Chair and two individuals from the current executive, plus one individual as requested by the individual asking for the review of the results.

Ballots will be destroyed upon confirmation of valid & closed election.

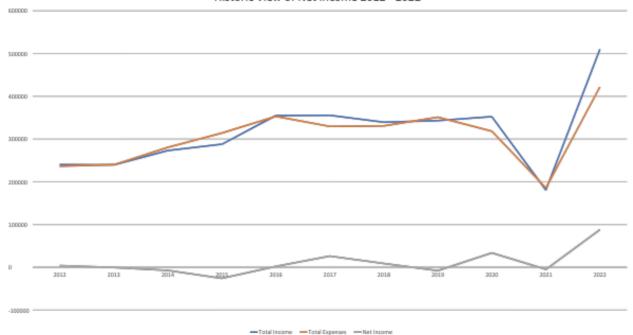

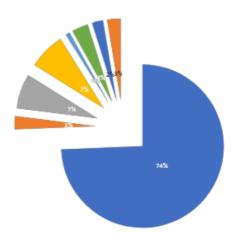
