#### President Report

SOOOOO this has been a strange year for sure.

COVID has made this a hockey season like no other. As a Board, we have made adjustments to our schedules several times to accommodate the changes to the government guidelines on an almost daily basis.

We've made sacrifices to ensure our kids got ice time and practice time. We've worked with the MRC in ways we didn't think we're possible in years past.

As an Association, we made it work.

As a Board, we have had to work together with the coaches, managers and players to develop a hockey model that worked within the confines of the guidelines to ensure that we were doing our very best to ensure a clean and safe environment....did we get everything right....probably not but this has been a year of firsts for everyone.

Our COVID Safety Coordinator worked diligently to ensure that we followed the public health guidelines and I think the position was filled by the right person with the right knowledge and commitment to see that out association worked within those guidelines to deliver our program.

On a side note...this position will change once COVID is finished, we have reached herd immunity and/or the government allows our association to resume "normal" hockey operations.

As we started the season, we had all the necessary things in place to successfully launch the hockey season and we even had a few games played with some of the teams. Then in November, that all changed again with the government's announcement that youth sports was put on hiatus again as the numbers of COVID positive cases was higher than the governments threshold.

The board worked through this time while developing an alternate plan including some form of refunding/credit solution and after much debate, it was determined that the membership would receive a refund of 70% of their membership fees.

While we waited for the government and Alberta Health to make decisions about youth sports, a window of opportunity opened for our association. In conjunction with the MRC, we would be allowed to get back on the ice but to only practice with very stringent restrictions in place. Again, our Board of Directors, coaches, managers, players and volunteers made adjustments to ensure that we could get back on the ice for an eight-week period to allow the kids to finish with some positives.

Our eight-week program worked well with the managers, coaches and chaperones ensuring the all parties involved worked within the guidelines to keep everyone safe. Throughout the program, the membership followed the rules, with some minor hiccups, and pulled off a successful season ending program. Congratulations to everyone involved.

One to other things....

Our league (Northern Alberta Interlock) will be holding the AGM on May 8<sup>th</sup> and will be attended through Zoom by our association.

Additionally, the league is having some issues related to various associations (Leduc and Ft. Sask) wanting to join the larger Edmonton League to avoid the increased travel demands and longer distances for hockey.

NAI is preparing for next season but like all associations/leagues, have no idea what the coming hockey season will bring. We are all standing by and as we learn more information it will be made available to the membership as appropriate.

Now on a more personal note...I want to thank the board, those of you who are staying and those who are leaving, for their continued support, their dedication to the association and their unwavering determination to push forward. Volunteers make up the bulk of any association and this one has some wonderful people leading it....I only hope it will continue to do great things.
