President's Report

It has been a very interesting year from a hockey perspective.

Hockey Canada and Hockey Alberta, after exhaustive research, determined that a change needed to happen in hockey at the grassroots level and implemented the Intro to Hockey. Intro to Hockey is a model of the general structure and administrative guidelines as well as specific playing rules for players aged 5-8. There are five specific sections to address everything from playing rules to the structure of the season. These rules and guidelines were required by all sanctioned hockey leagues (Northern Alberta Interlock[NAI]) in Alberta.

SLMHA implemented this program this year and throughout the year had some struggles with differing opinions, the program was slow to gather speed and many needed help with understanding why HC had changed they way hockey was being played.

Coming next season...if there is a next hockey season, we will see some additional changes to, most notably to the addressing of the divisions. Hockey Alberta will again follow Hockey Canada's lead and rebrand the divisions U11 through U18 for divisions of Atom, Peewee, Bantam and Midget. Female hockey will be rebranded in an identical fashion.

Additionally, U11 will have its own development program in line with Hockey Canada's Long Term Player Development model. Many of the same rationales used in the Intro to Hockey have been used to develop the U11 program with the focus on player development and equal and fair ice time. This is to ensure that all players at this level get the same opportunity to contribute to the outcome of the games, regardless of skill or ability. This will definitely challenge our coaches next year and they will be looking for support and resources to support this change.

As an association we have made some changes as well. Recently we implemented the ability to send e-transfer of both players fees and officials' payment. This has allowed the association to remain fluid with respect to revenue collection. Additionally, I know that Bobbi, our Administrator has been in discussion with the Treasurer to examine TeamSnap and the ability of that application to support player registration....fun times ahead.

With all the administrative things out of the way I want to talk about our hockey teams and hockey family.

As an association, we were having a wonderful year. Our teams were doing well, except for the one or two mishaps during the season, we had not major issues...we were well on our way to a great season.

Wait...this is Slave Lake, they're not allowed to flourish!!!. Bam, all of a sudden we were all blindsided by Covid-19. Early in March, Hockey Alberta announced that it would be suspending all sanctioned hockey in Alberta in response to the increasing global pandemic. There was lots of shock and uncertainty about what was going to happen to hockey...how were we going to finish the year. Well as the global pandemic grew, it was decided that the 2019-20 hockey season was going to end. The administration had to determine how to finish off the year for the teams...what kind of wrap-up would we be able to hold. Much like the whole world...things just stopped!!

However, we had a lot of wonderful success stories this year...

- Midget finished with 22-1-1 record and winning the Gold banner for the division and were Provincial bound when the season ended.
- Bantam finished second in their division.
- Peewee 1 finished winning Gold in their division.
- Peewee 2 finished second in their division.
- Atom 1 finished second in their division.
- Atom 2 finished with an outstanding record of 16-0-0 and winning Gold in their division.

Congratulations to all the teams for a wonderful 2019-2020 season. I think it is a testament to the players, coaches, managers and parent volunteers and everyone else involved. Slave Lake has had its fair share of tragedy over the years but we have rebounded and have held our hockey family tight. We always manage to make the best out of difficult situations, and this will be no different.

Now on a more personal note...I want to thank the board, those of you who are staying and those who are leaving, for their continued support, their dedication to the association and their unwavering determination to push forward. Volunteers make up the bulk of any association and this one has some wonderful people leading it....I only hope it will continue to do great things.
