## Evaluation Report

#### Evaluation Highlights

- Evaluations for the 2023/24 year was a success, this was my first year taking on this very daunting task.
- The success of the evaluations was due to our fantastic volunteers. A huge thank you to all that have helped SMH in regards to evaluations.
- We had roughly 326 players to evaluate, from Timbits through to U18.
- We had only a couple of discrepancies, which were dealt with in a very timely manner and in accordance with our policies and procedures.
- We have utilized the same Goalie Evaluator group from last year, which continued to be successful.
- We will be looking for evaluators very soon to get together and go over forms, drills and process, so that we are prepared for the upcoming season.

## Development Report

#### Development Highlights

- Torjager Hockey was hired this season to run bi-weekly development sessions for U9 U18 Age. These sessions were signup sessions outside of scheduled practices and were well attended. The committee is looking to have a similar format next season, with the goal to secure additional ice times.
- Torjager Hockey additionally completed several individual team sessions.
- Bi-weekly Goaltender Development sessions were held for all age groups. These sessions were also well attended and a similar format will be continued next season.

#### Development Highlights

- Checking Clinics were held at the beginning of the season for 2010 age players entering U15 and at the end of the season for 2011 age players.
- Coach Information Sessions were held on 2 dates. These were mandatory sessions for all Head Coaches and were open to all assistant coaches.
- Some topics reviewed and discusses included.
  - Assistant Coach Selection
  - Practice Planning
  - Game Day Planning
  - Bench Management
  - SMH Expectations and Code of Conduct

#### Development Highlights

- Evan Barlow & Paden Grant served as coach mentors.
- Coach Evaluations were collected and in the process of review by the committee.

## CAHL Report

#### **CAHL** Highlights

- Player suspensions an all time high compared to previous seasons.
- Coach suspensions an all time high compared to previous seasons.
- 2024-25 SMH will have the most carry over suspensions ever.
- No new Associations will be joining CAHL for a period of 3 years.
- All SMH Teams made playoffs following Alberta One mandate.
- CAHL will be going back to more than 6
   Tiers if required for 2024-25 season.
- All playoff games this season and in future seasons will be 2 game total point. A SMH member has suggested changing this to be similar to the female league. More information and a membership vote to follow next season.
