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What Softball BC's Discipline Chair Needs to Know

- The names and roles of the parties involved
- The nature of the complaint specific rule(s), regulation(s), policy (or policies), etc. allegedly broken.
- A detailed description of the incident(s) (what happened, why it happened, where you were when it happened, your role, etc.)

What You Need to Know

- You don't need to pay a fee to file a complaint
- Softball BC's Discipline Chair is impartial and does not take one party's side over the other
- Updates about the status of your complaint will be provided via email from if and when appropriate and possible
- In some cases, it may be appropriate for another organization within softball's structure (Youth or Adult Club or League, Coordinator, or District Organization) to handle your complaint which may result in your complaint being referred to a lower level organization to handle. As such it may be appropriate to consult with your Club, District and/or League before submitting a complaint to Softball BC
- To confirm, the following types of misconduct shall be reviewed by Softball BC Discipline Chair:
 - o Process #1 the Complaint alleges the following incidents:
 - o Disrespectful, abusive, racist, or sexist comments or behaviour
 - Disrespectful conduct
 - Minor incidents of violence (e.g., tripping, pushing, elbowing)
 - Conduct contrary to the values of Softball BC
 - o Non-compliance with Softball BC's policies, procedures, rules, or regulations
 - o Minor violations of the Code of Conduct and Ethics

Process #2 - the Complaint alleges the following incidents:

- Repeated minor incidents
- Any incident of hazing
- o Behaviour that constitutes harassment, sexual harassment, or sexual misconduct
- Major incidents of violence (e.g., fighting, attacking, sucker punching)
- o Pranks, jokes, or other activities that endanger the safety of others
- o Conduct that intentionally interferes with a competition or with any athlete's preparation for a competition
- o Conduct that intentionally damages Softball BC's image, credibility, or reputation
- o Consistent disregard for Softball BC's bylaws, policies, rules, and regulations
- Major or repeated violations of the Code of Conduct and Ethics
- Intentionally damaging Softball BC's property or improperly handling Softball BC's monies
- Abusive use of alcohol, any use or possession of alcohol by minors, or use or possession of illicit drugs and narcotics
- o A conviction for any *Criminal Code* offense
- o Any possession or use of banned performance enhancing drugs or methods
- Any other matter directly related to Softball BC which the Discipline Chair of Softball BC, in their sole discretion, chooses to handle
- Softball BC's Discipline Chair may share some or all of the information you provide in the process of resolving your
 complaint. For example, if your complaint is determined to have merit, then the information you submitted will be
 provided to the accused party so that they may have a reasonable opportunity to defend themselves at a discipline
 hearing.

What Happens When You Submit Your Complaint (Form)?

- The Case Manager for Softball BC will review your complaint and determine if it has merit.
- The Case Manager may:
 - 1. Investigate your complaint further (meaning you may be asked for further information).

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- 2. Refer your complaint to a Softball BC member club or affiliated organization (e.g. district, league, etc.) for review.
- 3. Constitute the appropriate panel to commence further review and/or action. The two panel options available are:
 - a) A Discipline Chair, a single individual, appointed by the president of Softball BC to review and decide on appropriate discipline for violations which fall under Category #1
 - b) A Discipline Panel, made up of three individuals, to conduct a discipline hearing for violations which fall under the heading of Category #2.
- 4. Determine the complaint does not have merit
