The Doc's Blues Softball Bursary

The Doc's Blues was the last club team to represent Canada at a World Championship, finishing second at the 1978 World Softball Championships in San Salvador. This was, and still is, Canada's best finish ever at this competition.

There were several sponsors throughout the late 60's and 1970's, but the coach, Adrian Lavigne, and a major core of players, grew the team by winning 8 BC championships, 5 Canadian Championships, 3 Northwest League Championships, as well as competing in two World Championships which are held once every 4 years. They were honoured as BC Team of the Year, inducted into the BC Softball Hall of Fame, the Canadian Softball Hall of Fame, and the BC Sports Hall of Fame. They travelled the world becoming highly admired and respected Canadian softball ambassadors, displaying great skill, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

The team was tight knit, with similar drives and goals, who complimented each other's playing styles on the field, to eventually become the team to beat, known as "Doc's Blues".

To continue the legacy of this incredible team and provide opportunities for future generations to realize their dreams through sport, the alumni of Doc's Blues have created a bursary intended to help student/athletes with their education while playing softball.

It is intended that the recipient of the The Doc's Blues Bursary displays the same Desire, Determination, and Dedication (the team's mantra known as the 3 D's), as well as outstanding sportsmanship and teamwork.

The Doc's Blues Bursary will award the successful applicant \$1,000.00 to be applied to their cost of education.
