

Frequently asked questions regarding Play at Home for U13 and under players

Q – My daughter was born in 2009, we live in Vancouver, but last year played on a team in Burnaby, can she return to that team for the 2022 season?

A – Yes, any player who played out of their home district (district of residence) in 2021, may remain in the same district they played in for the 2022 and subsequent seasons. However, if the athlete wishes to move to a different district, other than the district where they currently live, then they would be required apply for a Tryout Activity Report permit prior to trying out in the new district.

Q – what form do I need to have completed for my daughter to play out of her home district, and where do I find it?

A – If the athlete was born in 2009 or later (2009, 2010), and wish to try out for a team located outside the district where they currently live, they must have the Tryout Activity Report completed and signed by all qualified organizations in their home district and your District Minor Coordinator. This form is available through your home district Minor Coordinator or the Softball BC website at XXXXX.

Q – If there is no A (or B) team in my district for me to tryout for, can I just go out of district?

A – You can go out of district but you still need to have the Minor Coordinator for your district fill in the tryout activity report confirming that there is no team in your home district.

Q – If I try out for a team in my own district and am chosen for that team but do not want to play on that team, can I decline and then try out for a team outside my district?

A – No, if you are offered a spot on a team in your own district, you must accept it.

Q – If I try out for a team in my own district and am not offered a spot can I then go out of district to try out?

A – Yes, as long as there are no other teams in your district that you could try out for and you get a tryout activity report.

Q – If I try out for A outside of my district and do not make the team, can I then tryout for B in that same district.

A – NO, if you are not selected for the A team, you must go back to your home district.

Q – If I am a C player 13 years old and under, do I have to play in my home district?

A – yes, you must play in the district where you reside.

Q – If I am a C player 13 years old and under and there is no team for me in my district, can I go to another district?

A – Yes, but you will need to get permission from your Minor Coordinator.
