SOFTBALL NOVA SCOTIA'S POLICY ON SEVERE WEATHER

RESPONSIBILITIES

The Softball Nova Scotia Umpire, along with the Softball Nova Scotia Supervisor, hold the responsibility of stopping a game in the event of severe weather.



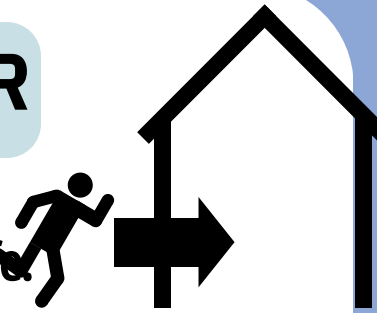
THUNDER ROARS = STOP

When thunder is heard, the game will be stopped. Players, coaches, umpires, and spectators should promptly find suitable shelter.



FIND ADEQUATE SHELTER

The dugout does not suffice as proper shelter. Any frequently utilized structure is deemed safe. A vehicle with a hard metal roof and windows rolled up can offer a degree of safety.



RESUMING THE ACTION

During Softball Nova Scotia events, the Softball Nova Scotia Supervisor is responsible for the continuation of the games. The Softball Nova Scotia Representative and umpires will wait a minimum of thirty (30) minutes after the final sound of thunder before returning to the field and continuing the game.
