#### **Community Softball Coach Clinic**

- Prerequisite: Elearning- foundations of coaching softball part 1 & make ethical decisions online evaluation
- Online via Zoom: Intro, Participants, Tasks, EAP, Rules, Basic Strategy (3 hours - 1 module)
- In person: Fundamental Softball Skills, Practice Planning, Coaching Sessions/Drills/Positional Play (5 hours)

#### **Competition – Introduction Coaching Clinic**

- Prerequisite: Elearning- foundations of coaching softball part 1 & 2 , make ethical decisions online evaluation
- Online via Zoom: Analyzing the Game, LTPD, Rules, Teams, Goal Setting, Legal Delivery, Teaching & Learning, Defensive/Offensive, Principles, Strategies, Team Selection, Pre-Game Plan, Homework (9 hours -3 modules)
- In person: Warm-Up, Fundamentals, Hitting/Bunting, Signals, Practice Planning, Baserunning/Sliding, Special Position Skills, Drills, Pitching, Analyzing Performance, Catching - Micro Facilitation (14 hours)
- Coach portfolio and on-field evaluation

Please note that should we receive only one (1) Bid for a Championship, this does not guarantee the Bid will be accepted. The Bid must still meet sufficient criteria in order to be accepted. Should we not receive any bids for a championship or the bid(s) do not meet sufficient criteria, then the championship will be turned back to the W.C.S.A.

The Softball Saskatchewan Board of Director's will be evaluating and awarding championships based upon the specific criteria.
