Treasurer Report for April 27th, 2021 AGM

My first year as Treasurer was definitely a challenge! However, we managed to tackle a lot with many milestones along the way.

In September of 2020, the association was able to secure \$43,000 in gaming grant revenues from the Province of BC to help offset expenses such as ice fees, player development and equipment. We will continue to apply for this annual grant and I expect that we will be successful in the foreseeable future. In addition, we implemented online registration and payments enabling families to register at their convenience with several payment options. This has made registration and reporting more efficient for the association by eliminating paper based forms and large scale cheque deposits.

COVID-19 certainly had a financial impact. Sponsorship revenue fell below our original target since the lack of spectators was imposed as a restriction. While we were able to save some money on expenses such as game fees for referees, lower assessment and insurance fees, and player development, we also absorbed some unanticipated incremental expenditures in order to comply health guidelines. Currently, we are seeking \$7,500 from viaSport to cover some of these expenses through their provincial funding relief program.

Overall, our revenues exceeded expenses and we were able to clear out the majority of payables from the previous fiscal year. I expect the financial health of the association to improve even more next year as we continue to deliver a minor hockey program to almost 200 players in Sooke and surrounding areas.

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AGM Equipment Report 2020-2021

Very minimal spending took place this year due to Covid-19 and other factors, although I did have to acquire items not normally purchased each season such as hand sanitizer, gloves and masks to provide teams. Next season I would like to replace the U13 recreational team(s) game jerseys as those are currently in pretty rough shape and the oldest in circulation. If there's room left in the budget, I would also like to acquire some matching whites for some of the rep team jersey sets. I feel it's important to acknowledge the generous contribution made by the U18 A team this year, who went out of their way and fundraised for a set of black jerseys to donate for future U18 A team's to use. AtoMc jerseys were not kept by players this year so that I could instead order one home and away minor set (youth small size) to accommodate both smaller and taller players in the U11 recreational groups going forward. We are not eligible for new Timbits jerseys this season and unfortunately, their year-end swag gifts (mini hockey sticks) did not arrive until recently due to manufacturing problems so those have now been placed in storage to provide next season's U7 and U9 players. Gear distribution went well in the fall and collections in the spring went wonderfully. All team managers had the majority if not all of their gear returned within two weeks of the end of season and it was the best one yet. Last but not least I'd like to include a big thank you to all of our coaches, volunteers, players and families who stuck with us during this difficult year!

Risk Management Report

23-April-2021

1. ePACT

Player medical and emergency information profiles were completed with reasonable timeliness this year. There were a few outstanding players with incomplete or outdated information that required persistent follow-up. It is recommended that the initial ePACT reminder/request go out to parents/guardians in mid-September with a hard completion deadline of Oct 15th. To help with the level of effort required to follow-up, players without completed profiles should not be permitted to participate in sanctioned events after the deadline.

Team Safeties did not have issues or concerns accessing ePACT or using the mobile phone app. Good communication between the Safeties and Director of Risk Management helped resolve minor issues rather quickly.

2. Annual SEAPARC arena inspection

The Director of Risk Management completed the pre-season inspection of the SEAPARC arena and dressing room facilities on Sept 14, 2020. The facility was in overall good repair ready for SMHA to take the ice. There were a few minor defects noted with the boards but they were quickly repaired by facility staff prior to the SMHA schedule. The Hockey Canada arena safety checklist was completed and accompanied by relevant photos as well as email correspondence with facility staff. It is recommended the SMHA apply for and setup a Google Drive non-profit account to house these types of documents so that they can reviewed by the Executive and retained as a documented record of safety concerns.

3. Safety Person Training

Team Safeties completed the HCSP, RIS, and CRC requirements prior to the Dec 1 deadline. One item that was overlooked and now a mandatory BC Hockey requirement was CATT training. Unfortunately it was a scramble to get the training completed by the extended BC Hockey deadline. It is recommended that the SMHA communicate with and review BC Hockey team staff requirements in late summer. The requirements and deadlines should be clearly posted on the SMHA website, articulated to the team staff during the team meeting and monitored/followed up prior to the deadline via the Registrar to ensure everyone is on track for completion.

4. Annual Team Safety Meeting

The manager/safety meeting was held outside SEAPARC on Oct 26, 2020. The meeting was well attended and covered the main aspects for team coordination and safety. This meeting was a good way to emphasize key aspects, ask questions and put faces to names. The meeting should be arranged well in advance to ensure everyone has ample time to arrange their personal schedule accordingly to attend.

5. Injuries

Due to the reduced number of games this year there were only a handful of injuries that required and injury report form and physician follow-up. All injury reports, BC Hockey notification and return to play notes were completed in the required time frames. Each injured player was able to return to full hockey activity after they were clear by their physician. There was some confusion regarding time lines and required documentation after a player sustained an injury. Document templates and timelines should be placed on the SMHA website under a HCSP menu and/or in a Team Safety guidebook so that they are clear and readily available.

6. COVID-19 Co-Coordinator

The Director of Risk Management was also co-coordinator for the SMHA COVID-19 response alongside the VP-Admin. Parts of the hockey season were challenging due to Public Health Office requirements and increased documentation. An extra level of coordination and participation was required to ensure teams had volunteers to complete health checks and attendance, sanitize stands/dressing rooms and monitor conformance to public health guidelines. Despite the challenges players were able to complete a modified hockey schedule without any COVID-19 outbreaks or transmission. It remains to be seen what the 2021-22 hockey season will look like but the Association is well positioned to tackle continued COVID-19 requirements or restrictions. One mandatory item throughout the 2020-21 hockey season was participant health checks and attendance. Should COVID-19 restrictions remain a reality for next season it is highly recommended that SMHA look into a digital way for players/coaches/spectators to complete health check and attendance. Digital submission/tracking would enable real-time monitoring and reduce the remove the requirement for a health/attendance tracker.

7. Acknowledgement

Thank you to all of the Team Safety volunteers for donating their time to complete the required training and ensuring player safety throughout the season. It was a different and challenging season but our players had fun and made it through without any major or sustained injuries.
