On Ice Helper Policy

Introduction

From time to time minor hockey teams enlist older hockey players or other volunteers to assist with practices, scrimmages and other activities. It is important to ensure that insurance is in place for anyone participating in sanctioned activities, that volunteers are screened and they possess the appropriate certifications.

Effective Date

September 4, 2021

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to provide guidance to our members, parents, teams and coaches on the selection and use of onice helpers, while ensuring the safety of SMHA players and safe opportunities for our volunteers.

Scope

This policy applies to all SMHA teams participating in Hockey Canada sanctioned events including games, practices, and other on ice activities.

Description of On Ice Helper Duties

- Assist with team drills during practices;
- Assist the Head & Assistant Coaches during practices;
- Assist players to understand drills;
- Be there to help players, not participate in the practice;
- Be encouraging and positive with players;
- Reports to the team Head Coach.

Requirements

- Any on-ice helpers must be a current registered member of BC Hockey / Hockey Canada. If the individual is not
 currently registered through a minor association, junior team, senior team or as an associate member, SMHA must
 register the individual as a volunteer with Hockey Canada;
- All on ice helpers must wear a CSA certified helmet with chin strap fastened and appropriate face protection required
 for the player's level of play. A BNQ certified neck guard must also be worn by all minor hockey aged players assisting
 as an on ice helper
- U15 and below on ice helpers **must** wear full gear. All other helpers (above U15) are to wear what is appropriate to their Division;
- Any helper who is not a BC Hockey minor or junior player must have current certification in Respect in Sport for Parents (RIS). Additionally, they must be under the direct supervision of the certified team officials;
- All on ice helpers over 18 years of age must have a current Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Person Check on file with SMHA;
- Non Members offering coaching or other on-ice help for a fee is not a volunteer, and must become an associate member prior to participation.

A summary of requirements can be found in Appendix A.

Selection

- On ice helpers must meet all requirements outlined in this policy prior to participating in on ice activities;
- Appointed by Head Coach (must have permission of Coach).

Adult (18 and older)	 Must be registered member of BC Hockey or Hockey Canada If not registered they must be added as a "volunteer" on the roster 	 CSA certified helmet, chin strap fastened, gloves Full tracksuit or pants and sweater are recommended to be worn on the ice 	Respect in Sport HU – Planning a Safe Return to Hockey Criminal Record Check and Vulnerable Person Check
Non-members (offering coaching or on ice help for a fee)	Must become an Associate Member Not to be rostered with a Minor Hockey Association	Must follow above outlines for ages for required equipment on ice	Requirements on Associate Member application
