Tiebreaking Procedures for Women's Rec B.

1. Initial Group Play

- to determine the standings within a group the tie breaking procedure for the tournament within the Rules and Regulations will be used, based on the final score submitted to tournament headquarters (No Mercey Rule)
- 2. Once Standings with the pools have been determined the following tie breaking rules will be used to determine seeding in the Knock Out round:

2 way tie Breaking Procedures

- a) Goal Difference –by deducting goals against from goals for, in all games, the highest goal difference shall be used to determine the final standings.
- b) Least Goals Conceded for any teams still tied, the fewest goals conceded, in all games, shall be used to determine the final standings.
- c) Best Discipline Record for any teams still tied, the team with the least amount of Discipline Points (Yellows = 1 Point, Red = 3 Points) shall be used to determine the final standings
- d) Coin Flip / Shoot-out If teams are still tied, either a coin flip or penalty kicks shall be taken to determine which team(s) advances to the next stage of the competition. The choice will be up to the Tournament Staff. A.S.A. Penalty kick rules shall apply if penalties is the option chosen.

3 Way Tie Breaking Procedures

Teams will be placed accordingly through the steps. If a team is placed in any of the steps and two teams remain tied, those two teams will proceed to next step

- a) Goal Difference –, goal difference in all matches with the teams concerned shall be used to determine the final standing.
- b) Least Goals Conceded if teams still tied, the fewest goals conceded, in all matches with the teams concerned shall be used to determine the final standing.
- c) Best Discipline Record for any teams still tied, the team with the least amount of Discipline Points (Yellows = 1 Point, Red = 3 Points) shall be used to determine the final standings
- d) Goals Scored if teams are still tied, most goals scored, in all matches with the teams concerned shall be used to determine the final standing.
- e) Coin Flip / Shoot-out If teams are still tied, either a coin flip or penalty kicks shall be taken to determine which team(s) advances to the next stage of the competition. The choice will be up to the Tournament Staff. A.S.A. Penalty kick rules shall apply if penalties is the option chosen.
