- Overall, the 2025 Sweetheart Tournament was a success! Very positive vibes from most everyone we dealt with. All the teams seemed to really enjoy the tournament and the activities we provided for them.
- People were extremely positive about the tournament; many commented that it was very
  well organized and would be applying to return next year. People also enjoyed their
  swag bags with their spa packages and heart glasses. Heart and Hustle awards
  (Waterbottle and \$10 coupon from United Cycle, along with coupons from local
  businesses were well received.
- The Hillberg and Berke Sportsmanship award was really well received. I believe this will continue for future years.
- **68** teams from Alberta, BC and Saskatchewan participated with **956** athletes and their families coming through the TLC, Stu Barnes, Grant Fuhr and Glenn Hall arenas
- Vendor, Pressed YYC said the weekend was very successful again. Our numbers were lower than last year (76 teams and 1080 athletes) as we did not have Active Start participating and we did not include the extra AA teams that we did last year.
- Our sucker pull did not do as well as it usually does. It may have been the location as it
  wasn't as central to the action as it has been previously, or perhaps, parents were
  spending more money at the Plinko games area and spending less on the sucker pull.
  - Suggest to have sucker pull more visible next year. That big pillar at the Tri really blocked the view of it.
  - We usually don't have a lot of suckers left over at the end of the weekend. This
    year there were a ton left over.
- Income for the tournament...
  - \$17,104.47 in square payments
  - o **\$13,608.85** in cash payments
  - \$24,000.00 in Sponsorships
  - \$50,563.32 in team registration payments

- Total: \$105,563.32
- Expenses for the tournament...
  - \$11,283.09 approximately for all tournament committee costs. (This does not include ice and refs)
    - Expense spreadsheet attached.
      - Committee members did not all submit their expenses to the tournament Admin so we had to go off of last years numbers for some of the items. We cut expenses a lot this year, so we are expecting that total expenses are actually lower that what we are currently reporting.
  - Refs = \$10,921.45
  - We aren't sure what the ice costs were for the tournament.
- .First prize \$200.00 for the Social media challenge went to SGRA's U12A team
- 2<sup>nd</sup> prize \$100.00 for the Social media challenge went to SGRA's U16B team.
- Next Year...
  - Steph Devries is ready to take on being the Tournament Director next year. She is a great fit as she has been a key person on our Tournament Committee for 3 years.
  - Allison Wilson is ready to take on being the Tournament Coordinator. With Allison's experience on the board this year and taking the lead on the U10 Windup, she will be a great fit for this role.

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- TeamSnap Tournaments no longer needs to be used for updating scores during the tournament. RAMP has everything we need and it's also a lot less work for us to not have to do data entry.
- The tournament needs someone to take on the position of Scheduler next season. This person will be responsible for
  - Setting up the game schedule using RAMP.
  - Syncing the schedule to RAMP
  - Generating game codes
  - Updating the brackets on RAB site during the tournament as they progress so that the finals games are updated and game codes are generated.
