All the U19 teams continued to be competitive with the following Session 1 and Session 2 starts:

U19AA - RIOT

Session 1: They played 4 games with a 0-4-0 record. The RIOT had 10 Goals For, 22 Goals Against and 38 minutes in penalties.

Session 2: The RIOT record is 3-6-0, with 33 Goals For, 45 Goals Against and 106 minutes in penalties. They currently have 3 players in the top 20 of BGL league scoring.

U19A

Session 1: They had a record of 0-6-2, with 19 GF, 45 GA and 76 minutes in penalties. The team record is 0-2-0 in BGL play, with 7 GF, 10 GA, and 28 PIM.

Session 2: Team record is 1-1-1 with 16GF, 16GA and 38 minutes in penalties. The team currently has 2 in the top 20 scoring.

U19B

Session 1: The team record was 0-8-0 with 16 GF, 88 GA, and 142 minutes in penalties.

Session 2: The team record is 0-3-0 with 11 GF, 30 GA and 46 minutes in penalties. The team has two players in the top 30 of BGL scoring.

- Overall it seems the 2026 Sweetheart was a big success.
- 94 teams including Active Start and Ringette for All = 1375 athletes
- We heard many compliments from many associations over the weekend. Lots of comments about how lucky we are in Spruce Grove to have such nice facilities around the city. Many expressed interest in hoping to be back next year for the tournament.
- Teams loved their swag- and it was so fun seeing all the athletes in their tournament shirts. Some businesses even commented how it helped to showcase the tournament- they would have a team show up all wearing shirts.
- Heart and Hustle Toques were also a big hit.
- We sold upwards of 160 old SGRA jerseys - they were a huge hit.
- We got a few different praises on how amazing our officials were over the weekend.
- Half of the Ringette Plushies were sold- we will sell the others in the years to come.
- For the most part, the committee members were incredible. We only had 1 person not show up past the first meeting (her team was fined 300 dollars and it will be taken out of her seed cheque) and we set up a remediation plan with the other parent, in which he did fulfill his additional tournament shifts as "payment"
- We had no "no shows" for volunteer shifts over the weekend.
- We crushed our food bank donation drive, over 1000 items were donated
- All facilities over the weekend opened at promised times each day.

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INCOME:

Square Payments (Raffle, Silent Auction, Games, Jerseys, Sucker Pull, Lotto Board, Pick a Player, Mom Pins, Caramels, Croc Charms, Ringette Plushies)- \$34 598.00 - \$433.23 (square

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fees) = \$33 447.77

(card - \$23 763.00; cash- \$10 118.00)

Cash Payments: (Raffle, Games, Jerseys, Sucker Pull, Lotto Board, Pick a Player, Mom Pins, Caramels, Croc Charms, Ringette Plushies)- \$15 338.30 - \$10 118.00 (on square) = \$5 220.00

Raffle Box 50/50 (Winner took home \$3425.00)- SGRA took \$2 693.00 (after fees) - consider starting this up earlier next year!

Team Registrations: (not including SGRA teams; Active Start only paid \$150 per team):

\$73 300.00

Sponsorships (cash): \$36 550.00

Stay and Play Hotels: Still waiting to hear from Todd- hope to have it by the board meeting.

Total Income: approx \$66 000 (Still waiting for a few things to trickle in, ref fees estimated at this point, not including Stay and Play kick back either.

STAY & PLAY: Reconsider using Stay and Play Accommodations for next year. At times, challenging to work with and seemed to have issues with every association trying to book. Local hotels not used to the fullest and many teams booked in Edmonton when wanting to stay closer

-slow to reply to emails, requesting rooms back after block bookings were set, selling "Family Suites" when those rooms weren't available.

- Some ideas for next year: Reach out to some of the local hotels and see if they would like to be considered a "partner hotel" in exchange for some sort of donation. Esso Golden Ring does this- individual teams book wherever they want, but "partner hotels" feature on the website and teams are encouraged to use them.

will use them next year to be more successful.

LEARNING POINTS:

- Medals- as of last update they are sitting in a Japanese Airlines warehouse in Vancouver. We are still hopeful we will receive them and then be used next year. We do feel our rushed back up plan for medals worked out and they looked good. Would love to work with a possible local vendor in the future to avoid this again. Michelle was instrumental in getting this all sorted very quickly when we found out we weren't going to have the original medals.

- Will limit vendors next year to just Pressed YYC, Photographer I think. The other vendors were upset about the vendor fee set by the TLC.

- 6 team pools were tricky when it came down to deciding playoff spots in a few pools

- One upset coach from U10Step 2 - after clerical issue on RAMP showed a consolation non medal game when it was just supposed to be two separate pools, with top two teams playing for gold/silver. That was reflected in our rules and it didn't affect her

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team making the medal game.

- One SGRA U10S2 team used affiliates when they shouldn't have in their first two games. We spoke with the manager and coach immediately. Looking back we wonder if we should have automatically forfeited their games when it was brought to our attention.

- One specific concern re: behavior (aggressive yelling) of a SGRA coach towards officials. Concern was brought to Breanne and she dealt with it very quickly.

- One medical emergency- situation was dealt with quickly.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2027...

- Scheduling was a HUGE job. Vanessa Kyle did an incredible job and was also the person helping up through the weekend to upload teams to medal games on RAMP. Schedule was ready almost a month ahead of the tournament which gave teams lots of time to plan, Lindsay appreciated all the time she had to make the ref schedule. We have already asked that Vanessa take the role again next year.

- Vanessa also took care of all the behind the scenes RAMP work onboarding teams and took care of the tournament website.

- 94 teams is about as high as we can get it, if we want to make sure all teams get through the TLC by Sunday at noon (before Raffle and Silent Auctions close)

- We only needed to use 2 ice slots at Stu Barnes- all other games were played between Glenn Hall, TLC and HMP.

- Source MEDALS locally? Despite higher cost...we ask a lot from our local sponsors.

- We need more help with medal presentations. It ran Allison and I pretty thin, coordinating when and where to be for the end of medal games.

- We would like for the association to purchase an additional ipad (at least 1) or refurbished phone. We only have one Ipad for the association so relied on Steph's old phone and Allison's old ipad to have additional options to pay with card. We also will need at least one more Square, as one in the tote does not work. Being able to use more of these devices will allow for easier tracking of purchases.

- Maybe having us attend the first Manager/Coach meeting to lay out expectations of Sweetheart Reps, especially for new managers in the younger years may help avoid any difficulty getting SH reps from younger divisions.

- Do we charge Open Teams ? half the registration for the tournament and release them from the volunteer shifts...? We would still like the raffle baskets. Open teams were only obligated to 4 volunteer shifts compared to the average 7-9

- Consider splitting our raffle basket table and silent auction between HMP and TLC.
