Evaluations Schedule is complete. A big thank you to Desiree and Leanne for confirming our ice sooner than ever before! This has allowed Sports Evaluations to secure their desired Evaluator candidates. Once Leanne confirms final approval of the schedule, it will be released in a manner that works with her system.

U14/U16 Goalie Evaluations and AA Evaluations will take place Aug 26- Sept. 1. As was the case last year, I would like to note that our U14AA's are the only group that will be requiring an evaluation skate over the September long weekend. This is an unavoidable situation due to the UAA requirements for this group as set by Ringette Alberta.

House evaluations will begin after September long weekend.

Our Technical Director, Shawn, will be overseeing UAA's this year so that I can focus on scrimmages and skills skates. We will be sending out a Google Sheet sign up after this meeting to begin securing ON-ICE help. We need everyone to assist us with filling these spots.

- A reminder that those volunteering with on ice UAA's will receive a \$15/hour payment or credit
- All volunteers must be 2nd year U16+
- U14AA UAA scores will be carried over for those athletes moving to house league tryouts. These athletes DO NOT complete a 2nd UAA.
- All athletes will be given a practice UAA ice time facilitated by SGRA prior to their timed UAA ice times.

Goalie Evaluations (U14/U16) are on Monday August 26. We will be requiring 10 shooters each at the U14 and U16 levels in addition to on-ice adult helpers.

Both Edmonton and St. Albert reached out to me to schedule AA evaluation scrimmages. I have confirmed games in St. Albert on the evening of Aug.30th at the Go Auto Arena at Servus for all three AA teams- please refer to schedule. (U19AA- may or may not utilize this exhibition game as an evaluation- Alison, let's chat)

All AA evaluation scrimmages will have paid refs (Lindsay, I will be connecting with you). House league evaluations will require on ice volunteer refs. These roles are most often filled by potential coach candidates, and I would ask for everyone's help in securing them.

Divisional Directors will need to begin thinking about organizing volunteers for check-in, bench roles and box workers. If you are new to the Director role, please reach out to our past or second year Directors for advice/information as required. An online Zoom training session with Sports Evaluations will be scheduled prior to evaluations for Divisional Directors. Date TBD.

There may be some adjustments to the schedule as evaluations roll out. I appreciate everyone's flexibility in advance. Please remind families of this.

I would encourage everyone to review the Evaluation Guidelines document on the website. Most often, questions I receive are answered here.

This year we put the coach applicant deadlines much sooner in an effort to catch people prior to departing on summer holidays. We were able to name our three AA coaches early June and the remaining levels closed on 2024-08-01.

There were a total of 34 applications received, many for assistant coaching. Although there were duplicates for parents wanting to coach both their children, we had the following for each age group:

- Active Start = 3
- · U10 = 10
- · U12 = 7
- · U14 = 10
- · U16 = 3
- · U19 = 1

In consideration of some of the names I had expected to see, but did not apply I strongly believe that they are waiting for AA tryouts to be completed to see where their athlete lands. Conversations will be had once AA evaluations are completed. I will be in touch with the division directors to schedule head coach interviews.

The Coach / Manager meeting will potentially be held on Wednesday, 2024-09-25. I have contacted the manager mentor to determine availability. **TBD**

We are hosting Community Sport Initiation (CSI) here in Spruce Grove on 2024-10-20 and are working on dates for the Comp Intro (CI) in November/December as per request of RAB.

I have heard from two individuals who would be interested in mentoring other coaches, so will work to get them set up once teams are formed and coaches are named.

I will be sending out the application form for Junior Coaches here in the upcoming weeks.

The current U12 registrations are 38, there have been no new registrations since July 15th. This is another decrease over the past 3 years. Last year we had 46 athletes and 52 the year before.

Of the 38 players, 3 are new to SGRA, 20 are second year players and 18 are first year U12 players.

Goalies - 3 are interested in being a full-time goalie, and another 4 or 5 would be interested in being a part time goalie. Plan will be to have interested goalies play net at least once during evals.

SGRA Goalie Policy - 14.

All U12 players will evaluate as skaters first, then may play goalie for game play. Goalie evaluators will be used to provide a goalie evaluation. Goalie evaluation and UAA scores (as skater) will both be used to determine team placement. Directors to discuss with goalies and parents to help with determining final placement, based on interest, skating skill set vs. goalie skill set, as well as potential playing time.

For this upcoming season I'm planning for 3 teams (A, B, and C) with 12 -13 players per team, these will be good size teams.
