

### **General Comments:**

The 2023 season was another good year for St. Albert Minor Baseball. We were up in registration from 2022 and offered a full roster of programming. From Rally Cap, Challenger, House League to Rep Baseball, SAMBA once again showed why we are a leader in our Province. The Development Program was strong, and growing again in 2023, and the addition of Acumen Clinic has proven its worth with our athletes.

### **Programs:**

As previously mentioned, SAMBA did offer a full roster of programs in 2023.

- A hybrid version of our Winter/Spring Camp was offered for a month before evaluations began. Coaches from the Cardinals Dev Program and SAMBA Rep program offered instruction to an 11U/13U group and a 15U/18U group.
- Evaluations began in late February in Millar Field House and Servus Place. I believe this
  process ran very well. All teams were selected by a group of coaches who genuinely cared
  and tried their very best to place each athlete fairly, on a team where the athlete would be
  able to play and compete.
- The Cardinals Development Program ran its 4th season, now in season 5, and went very well. We saw 74 athletes in the 7 month program run by a great group of coaches. We continued to look at ways to make the program better and give those athletes the best possible training to prepare them for their seasons and help develop them to the next level. We are currently running our 5th season of the program and I'm proud to say the program is stronger than ever. A great group of coaches and athletes are working hard towards the 2024 season. We partnered with Acumen Clinic to offer our strength and conditioning, now in our 2nd year with them, and we continue to receive great feedback. Thank you to all the coaches and our families for another great Dev Program season.
- House League: Rally Cap to 18U A full season of HL baseball was offered in 2023 with a mid-season and year end tournaments. Our directors had to be creative this season, and put in some long hours with their scheduling to make sure all teams were able to practice and play games. Thank you to Legal Minor Baseball for their help hosting tournaments. A big Thank you to Cori White for her time and all her hard work and efforts. Cori is stepping down from her final position as Sr HL Director. Thank you Cori for everything!
- Rep Programs: 11U to 18U We were one of the only associations in Baseball Alberta
  where all our coaches earned their correct level of certifications and we are pleased to
  report that all teams competed very well and showed well in Provincial Championships
  across our Province. SAMBA hosted the last chance NCCP clinics again this season, thank
  you to Baseball Alberta for their help in providing these clinics.
- Challenger Baseball Always great to see our Challenger athletes back on the field! Thank
  you to Jays Care for their continued support. Thank you to all our coaches and buddies for
  another great season.
- NUCP Certification continued to show strength and positive growth again this season. A
  special thanks to John Bresler for his hard work in training and retaining young umpires
  while coordinating thousands of assignments throughout the season.
- Unfortunately due to air quality, our annual Larry Rindero Memorial Tournament, formally known as Early Bird, had to be cancelled. Only the Thursday evening games were played. We plan to run the tournament again in 2024.

### Facilities:

- Facilities is always one of the areas where I believe SAMBA takes tremendous pride. Kevin
  and his team did a great job again this season to provide a top notch facility for our players
  and players around the province. A season without much rain definitely offered some
  challenges but our crew did a great job!
- Millar Field House continues to be a huge benefit to all our members. Both Rep and HL
  teams used the facility throughout the season and helped take some pressure off our fields.
  Some repairs are required to the nets and some equipment needs to be replaced but I'm
  very grateful to have that building which gives our athletes another great experience. We
  added a second pitching machine to the facility which will also really help.
- Thanks to Ella Fystro who provided all our cleaning services. We received many
  compliments on the cleanliness and well keeping of our clubhouse. We are once again
  partnered with SANS preschool who operate their programs 5 days a week and pay SAMBA
  a monthly rental rate.
- Thank you to Leanne and Tony Arlia who ran the concession again this season. Nothing but good reviews to them as they provided delicious food and refreshments to all our members and visitors at a fair price. The addition of the payment square and deep fryer for fries were big hits.
- A big thank you to Jeannette Sullivan who continuously worked very hard at planting and maintaining the beautiful flower pots and beds throughout our facility.
- Big thank you to Steve Cummings and his company Super Save for donating and maintaining ports-potties through our facility saving SAMBA \$1000's in expenses. Steve has also provided us with a unit for the winter months. Super Save fence banners have been placed on all 4 fields.
- Another big thank you to Martin Deerline who once again sponsored us with a high speed mower, SAMBA exchanged advertising at our facility and on our website. This partnership was very beneficial to our grounds crew team. The mower cuts maintenance times down and took a lot of pressure off our other machines. We hope to continue this partnership for years to come.

### Marketability and Image:

- Our Website continues to receive thousands of hits and we are going to update a lot of the information posted on there. SAMBA may look at moving over to Spordle to align with Baseball Alberta in the future.
- Facilities Sponsorships: Thank you to all our facility sponsors for their continued support.
   Eng-Con, Active Physioworks, Martin Deerline, Super Save, and Source for Sports continue
   to invest in SAMBA and we are very grateful. We are excited to bring in dozens of new
   sponsorships to other areas of our program and will have a complete list of those companies
   on our website.
- Big thank you to Sophia Jenkins for all her hard work and time putting together a
  sponsorship package and bringing in 18 HL sponsors. She has changed the role of the
  Marketing Director for the good and we are grateful for everything she has done for SAMBA.
  Sophia is stepping down from the position due to work and family commitments. Finding a
  replacement will be tough but we are hopeful that whoever fills that position will be able to
  continue the sponsorship support that Sophia has brought in.
- Social Media Exposure was at an all-time high this year. SAMBA hired Liam Froment to handle our social media and he did a fantastic job. We saw the number of followers on all our platforms increase and our social media presence is stronger. We hope to work with Liam again in 2024.

# Challenges:

- While the Covid-19 pandemic still had some effects on SAMBA, getting back on our feet and offering full programming did have its challenges but we were excited to face them head on. Finding volunteers will always be a challenge but I feel that SAMBA is very fortunate to have many really great families who continually step up to provide baseball for our kids. We continue to see rising costs across the board and SAMBA will have to find more/alternate revenue streams to continue offering programs at affordable rates. We will continue to run Bingos and should see our Casino in the 4th quarter of 2023.
- Coach training and certification will be another focus point in 2024. Providing our athletes
  with a more consistent and structured development plan is one of our many goals. We are
  working with Baseball Alberta and Baseball Canada to look at improving coach certifications
  and communications.

# 2024 Objectives:

### Administration:

- SAMBA will continue to work tirelessly to provide top notch programs and facilities to all our athletes. New house league programs are being discussed to allow membership growth.
   Rep programs are always being carefully monitored and tweaked to help provide support to our volunteers and better experiences to our players and coaches.
- Bylaws, policies, procedures and league rules: Review Update desperately required. Proper documentation and publishing of these would decrease a large amount of issues brought up during our season. Also looking into a SAMBA handbook like the BA handbook. The world of sport is changing and many new costs will come with these changes.

### Program:

- Early coach selections and mentorship throughout the season. Coaches need to be selected
  even earlier in the season to allow them participation in our winter camps. The number of
  "new coaches" in SAMBA has grown significantly in past years. A coaching mentorship
  program would greatly enhance the chances of these coaches success and sticking with the
  game.
- Umpire Mentorship Program The number of baseball players is rising significantly and the number of umpires decreases every year. Thank you to John Bresler who brought in many new and young umpires into our system and provided very good support to them. Members, players, coaches, and parents need to understand that without these officials, we cannot play the great game of baseball.
- Tigers, Sr. Cards, and Jr. Cards SAMBA will schedule private meetings with each program
  to ensure all costs and needs are covered. Better and more clear terms from all parties
  should make life a lot easier on all members.

### Facilities:

- Continue focus on a regular and efficient field and equipment maintenance program due to aging and mature trees and equipment. SAMBA is always striving to keep our fields at a very high level and I believe getting better every season to maintain our fields and improve daily routines to cut costs and maintenance times. We are looking at renovations to our 11U filed in the spring of 2024.
- Light usage Agreements towards the cost of running our 18U field lights need to implemented. The hourly cost of \$250+/ hr. will only continue to increase and as such should be covered by the teams using them. SAMBA will look at a grant to switch over to I FD's
- A big thanks to Tara Feser from the City who time and time again, did whatever she could to support SAMBA's growing demands. We welcome Brendan Smith into this role and are excited to work with him.

### Marketing and Image:

Continued sponsorship programs/grants - These are crucial to the costs of running all our
programs at a high quality. The number of programs we deliver and the condition of our
facilities rely heavily on these programs. SAMBA is always looking to grow fundraising
opportunities and grant applications to support all our financial goals and requirements.

# **Closing Comments:**

Unfortunately due to, what I feel are lazy blanket policies put in place by the AGLC last May, I am required to step down from the position as President if we want to continue running bingos and casinos. In my opinion SAMBA should really look at alternate revenue streams as AGLC continues to restrict what monies can be spent on and funds do not increase. Their policies will handcuff not only our association but hundreds of non-profit associations across the Province. Volunteers are proving more and more difficult to find and I believe the AGLC should be looking at ways to assist non-profits to adopt new checks and balances that would allow members to fill multiple roles, because it's necessary in most associations, in order to operate and grow. As this will be my last season as president of SAMBA, I'd like to thank the board and our members for some really great memories and all their hard work. It's been a pleasure to lead this association for the past 10 years. I wish I was able to leave on more of my own terms but as I've always done, I will do whatever SAMBA needs to continue growing and thriving. Thank you to the St. Albert Minor Baseball Association board and our families for trusting me to steer this ship. I'm very proud of my time as President and look forward to continuing to assist in the future.



Spring baseball is a steadily growing sport in St. Albert. We ended up with 24 Rally Cap teams, 12 - 9U teams, and 9 - 11U teams.

Because of all the Rally Cap teams, and lack of diamonds to play on, we went with two different time slots: 5 to 6 pm and 6:15 to 7:15 pm. This allowed us to accept more registrations and not have to turn anyone away at this age level.

The weather was not much of an issue this year. There were a few rain out days and a few days we were dealing with the air quality from forest fires.

Pictures were set up at MVP for the weekend of June 3rd. Anyone who was unable to attend could call and go another time convenient for them. Pictures were once again included in registration fees.

This season the 11U teams were fortunate enough to utilize Millar Field House. Each team was provided 3 slots throughout the season. They were able to practice their hitting & pitching skills.

We did utilize the Grosvenor pump house this season. Half the pitching machines were stored at the Grosvenor pump house while the other half were stored at the Legion Memorial Ball Park in the trailer near the clubhouse.

With the high number of players (close to 500), it was very time-consuming with all the tasks required to set up and run Rally Cap, 9U, and 11U; therefore I had 2 division coordinators to help me out. One at 9U (Trevor Townsend) and one at 11U (Rob Hardy). I will require just as much help if not more for next year.

### 2023 Summer Baseball Season

We were fortunate enough to be able to run summer ball this season. There was great interest from not only spring players but also new players. We had 7 teams at Rally Cap and 4 teams at 9U. We are looking to expand this next season.

# **Partnerships**

This year we were able to renew our partnership with Morinville Minor Baseball and Legal Minor Baseball. There were a few issues with Morinville coaches that we were able to work through.

### **Diamonds**

House League diamonds continue to be an issue. The issues range from the condition of the diamonds to the lack of diamonds. We were able to utilize diamonds in both Morinville & Legal. We look forward to continuing to work with Tara and the City of St. Albert to find solutions to field conditions and our shortage of diamonds.

### Coaches

We had an in-person coach's meetings to kick off the season this year. Equipment was picked up after the meeting. We had a few issues with coaches not following the rules we had laid out for each division and with constant communication, we were able to resolve these issues. A huge thank you to all our coaches who put forth numerous hours of their time to help teach the kids this great game.

### **Tournaments**

Rally Cap had end-of-the-season games played against teams that they did not see all season. The 18U AAA team hosted a Rally Cap Day this season that was very well received by players, coaches, and parents. All players were given a Blue Jays hat for participating.

There were mid-season and end of season games for all 9U & 11U teams, they were able to play teams that they otherwise would not see in the regular season. After the mid-season games, there were adjustments made for the end-of-season games to help run smoother.

Overall the season was a success and the kids had fun!

# Recommendations/Insights to Future Seasons

- Find new, fun, and creative ways to continue to deliver our programs and develop skills in our youth.
- Designate funds to continue replacing existing SAMBA House League Equipment.
- Look at creating a House League survey to determine SAMBA members' value of our programs and to highlight the areas we do well and need to improve.
- Continuing to foster and develop relationships with the City of St. Albert to continue to help improve our programs and our access to facilities for our programs.
- Continue to improve our working relationship with Morinville Minor Baseball and Legal Minor Baseball to strengthen our programs.
- Continue to find ways to recruit, support, develop, and retain coaches.
- Find volunteers for division coordinator positions to help with the amount of work.

# 2023 Sr Rep Director Report

The team just didn't have the physical strength to compete with bigger and older teams. They did not possess enough bats to score or an arm that could consistently shut down teams.

# 2023 Umpire Coordinator Report

Once again, the crop of new and returning umpires did a great job covering local House League and BA League play. We had 17 returning umpires and were blessed with almost 20 new umpires. The weather was not as bad as last year, fewer games were cancelled due to weather or air quality.

The House League ran their program during the month of May and most of June. BA League and Provincial play went into early August. We had 23 umpires who worked both House and BA League Play. We had 13 umpires that worked some Provincial play. Some of these umpires have been identified and will be getting additional attention next year.

We had some challenges during the year. Most of our House League coaches displayed good sportsmanship, only had two serious issues but they were handled quickly. Most of the other problems they had were with two teams from Morinville and Legal.

SAMBA has committed to continue with our practice of lending out equipment to our umpires. A small change will be implemented starting next year. Returning umpires will be encouraged to start buying their own equipment, we feel that there may be a stronger commitment to come back year after year. Indications from this year's group is that this is a positive move to establish committed umpires.



Athletes ranged in age from 4 to 18. We had 6 female and 23 male athletes; 12 of whom were new to Challenger.

The program operated from 5 pm to 6 pm on Mondays starting May 1st with the last being Monday, June 26. We cancel 2 sessions due to weather.

Skills/drills and games were played on the 15U ActivePhysio Works diamond.

Coaching staff: Brenda Bourassa, Erin Fisher, Lori Gardner, and Matt Woodland. Having four coaches allowed us to set up a hitting station and a catching/throwing station which the athletes then rotated through before breaking into games. Splitting the athletes into two groups help to keep them engaged as well as allowed the coaches to better interact with them.

We were able to add more tees and batts this year with having the dedicated hitting station.

New this year was having some regular buddies for our athletes. The coaches would like to take this opportunity to thank the following for volunteering: Ryan Hnatiuk, Adeline and Hudson Eaton, Brent Doran, Quinn Lukay, Ryan Marples, and James.

### Challenges for 2023

- Inconsistent attendance made planning/splitting of players into groups difficult.
- Very few female buddies for female athletes for some athletes this was an issue.
- Participation from some Rep teams was better than others with respect to Rep player engagement with the athletes.

### Recommendations for 2024

- Cap registration at end of March to allow adequate time for ordering t-shirts and planning.
- Continue to meet with all the Rep teams and their coaching staff before the season starts to discuss their volunteer commitment, what it involves, and expectations when Buddies.
- Fine tune the athlete check in process so athletes are assigned buddies shortly after their arrival.
- Continue to build on the regular buddy base to supplement the rotating Rep players; some athletes do better with a consistent buddy from week to week.

On behalf of the coaching staff, I would like to thank the athletes and their families, all our volunteers, and the SAMBA Board of Directors for their continued support of this program.

# 2023 TREASURER'S REPORT

### **LOOKING BACK: Fiscal 2023**

As required by SAMBA Bylaws, the fiscal 2023 financial statements have been assessed by two members, Raelene Liske and Ryan Diprose. Their **CERTIFICATION** is attached. I appreciate their diligence and attention to detail.

Fiscal 2023 was an exciting year for SAMBA with things finally back to "normal" post-pandemic. The Development Program kicked off the year strong, another successful winter camp was held and registrations for both Rep and House League continued to rebound. Unfortunately, the air quality did not cooperate with our Larry Rindero tournament this year, with only a couple of games able to be played, but we look forward to hosting this fun tournament again this coming season. Challenger Ball was again a great success, as were our bingos and casino.

As a result, revenues totalled \$687,430 which was greater than budgeted. Our gross profit came in at \$205,109 which was slightly less than budgeted and can be attributed to a combination of the cancellation of the Larry Rindero tournament due to poor air quality, the introduction of Acumen to the Development Program and a few higher than anticipated increases in the cost of items such as uniforms, and team equipment.

After operating expenses, which include things like utilities, insurance, maintenance, software, amortization, and other items not directly attributed to a program, we had a net loss of \$2,040 for the year. Increased utility costs greatly impacted our bottom line this year coming in at \$14,000 more than the prior year. In addition, we put more of a push on advertising resulting in additional costs, and some additional grounds and equipment maintenance was required this year. More detail on these figures is provided in the included *FISCAL 2023 STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL INCOME AND EXPENSE*.

We ended the year with cash balances totalling \$249,849, as identified in the *FISCAL 2023 BALANCE SHEET*. About \$36,000 of these funds are informally held to support the potential for future grants, and an additional \$12,000 in cash is expected to be received in the new year from AGLC for our Casino held this past summer. We saw a decrease in the cash balances over the prior year as \$30,000 was spent on outdoor diamond equipment, a capital asset reflected on SAMBA's balance sheet. More cash will be required for capital expenditures in the coming years.

### **LOOKING AHEAD: Fiscal 2024**

Looking ahead to next year, we have budgeted for a relatively conservative year, while still anticipating a profit of approximately \$15,000. To arrive at these projections, we have assumed 680 House League and 148 Rep League participants. It is our hope that we will exceed these registration numbers. Development Program registrations of 66 have been budgeted.

We have budgeted for an increase to registration fees of \$65 per player in house league and \$110 per player in rep. After a review of other associations registration fees we determined that overall our fees were much less, and taking into consideration the possibility of a Baseball Alberta fee increase, the upgrades required to the diamonds and overall inflation across all expenses our board decided that this increase was necessary.

As we have communicated since the commencement of the Development program, the budget includes salaries for a Development Manager and a Development Administrator for their work in executing the program, as well as paid coaches. Payments made to the Development Program staff are completely separate from any board of director positions. Payments are highlighted here for transparency, as done in the past. To be clear, the revenues of the Development Program are set to recover all direct costs, including coaching and administration, to provide funds for a portion of SAMBA's operating costs and to contribute towards other future capital that may be required.

After review of other associations' structures, and to ensure compliance with AGLC requirements we have budgeted for a new salaried position of Executive Director for the next fiscal year. This is an appointed non-voting position, reporting directly to the Board of Directors, and this individual will oversee the overall operations of SAMBA. As this position will also assume some of the managerial tasks of the Development Program, the Development Program Manager's salary has been adjusted accordingly. The impact to SAMBA will be an increase to salaries expense of \$22,000 plus applicable payroll taxes.

As mentioned previously, our current projections show a net profit for fiscal 2024 of \$15,248. More details are included in the *FISCAL 2024 INCOME AND EXPENSE BUDGET*.

There are several capital projects totalling \$133,225 being considered for the upcoming year, which are detailed in the *FISCAL 2024 CAPITAL BUDGET*. The most significant of which are an upgrade to the 11U infield, the purchase of a Rapsodo and a HitTrax System. Significant upgrades to the other infields are being planned for in future years according to the greatest need. The cash flow situation will be reviewed before any capital expenditures are approved.
