5. SAMBA Executive and Director's Reports

5A President's Report

- ◆ Ed thanked the volunteer's, Tigers Association and the City of St. Albert for assisting in making 2009 a very fulfilling and successful year, then highlighted some of the key focuses of 2009 which included:
 - On-going long term agreement with the Tiger's baseball club, some disappointments with the Jr. Tigers participation/appreciation of what the agreement represents to them. Tiger's camp and on-going coach/player mentorship program was a huge success this year
 - Delivered very successful Winter/Spring and Girls Baseball camps
 - Hosted Umpire/Coach Clinic, Umpire Level 1 & 2 clinic and Initiation Coach clinic in partnership with MMBA
 - Implemented Rally Cap Program during T-Ball mid-season tournament with some success
 - Rep Jersey standardization/replacement program, new uniforms for the Midget AA, Bantam AA/AAA and PeeWee AAA teams
 - First year to have a Midget HL team
 - Completed lower level Clubhouse renovations and re-opened clubhouse for baseball use throughout the season c/w concession services thanks to Kim Coffin
 - Shale replacement on 3 diamonds (Midget, Bantam & PeeWee)
 - Exceptional field maintenance program and field staff
 - New front entrance signage, purchased SAMBA flags and banners for all rep teams
- Ed also identified some key achievements and challenges including:
 - 2009 marked the third consecutive year of growth in player registrations, marking a 13 year high
 - Launch of on-line registrations reflected 77% overall participation

6. Financial Report

Ed. E in Lori's absence, presented the 2009/2010 Financial Report

6A 2009 Financial Review

- Highlighted overall in 2009 SAMBA managed expenditures relative to established budgets and anticipated income much better. The association is ending the fiscal year with a small but positive bank balance, all Bingo, Casino and Grant accounts are essentially depleted, however we do not anticipate any issues related to sustaining operations/utilities through the winter months. Any and all outstanding invoices will be paid, clubhouse rentals will continue to offset all costs associated with janitorial services and utilities.
- Highlighted 2009 expenditures including: field improvements/equipment purchases were better managed and on budget, clubhouse lower level renovations were completed on budget, grounds keeping/facility labor costs were maintained on budget and included bonuses, equipment (primarily baseballs), coaching honorariums and ump fee requirements increased due to depleted stocks, coaches at the Midget AAA level and providing more opportunity for younger umps at the lower HL divisions. Vandalism was less than the previous year however still impacted expenses.
- ♦ Highlighted income anticipations for 2009 were lower than anticipated in certain areas, including Bingo revenues, low participation/revenue in sports

raffle initiative and not being awarded any grants (EOTA). Income relative to sponsorship and clubhouse rentals were however higher than anticipated and an increase in registration revenue was experienced due to participation with Kid Sport's subsidy program.

 Highlighted expected 2010 expenditure increases including: City of St. Albert field rental fees are doubling over the next 2 years, costs to implement online registrations \$4.25/player plus start-up fees and recovery of increases expected for apparel/equipment, etc.

6B 2010 Budget Review

- Highlighted 2010 budget components for most part will remain the same as 2009. Expect more revenue from the Casino, Sports Raffle and Grants and less revenue from sponsorships. Can expect higher expenses related to City field rentals, field operations/utilities, etc. at Legion Park and coach honorariums. Can expect an increase across the board for registration fees due to poor volunteer base to accommodate the shortfall/per child subsidy Vs more reliance on paid labor resources. Rep fees for 2010 will remain the same.
 - Question from floor: Do the clubhouse maintenance costs indicated include damages incurred by vandalism? Ed responded No, those are indicated as other/clubhouse expenses
 - Question from floor: Has SAMBA discussed moving honorariums to any other levels other than Midget. Ed responded yes, discussions have and will continue to take place in order to plan for potential future/annual honorarium budgets and possible accommodate the Bantam division ensuring SAMBA is at least comparable to other associations at these levels to entice/sustain high level coaches

2010 President's Report

General Comments:

Overall the 2010 season was a very fulfilling and successful year of baseball from SAMBA perspective. Our primary focus and objectives over the past year continued to concentrate on generally enhancing all aspects of our baseball program, including; promoting a fun environment for our House League, fielding competitive teams at the rep level, technical capabilities, certification and advancement of our coaches, skill development of players, marketing and image of our association, as well as maintaining/ enhancing the overall condition and appearance of our facilities. I am very pleased to be able to present the following few of many outstanding accomplishments which supports our belief's that we achieved and/or exceeded expectations relative to our objectives and the program that was delivered.

Key Focuses:

<u>Program</u>

- Camps delivered very successful Winter & Spring, Tigers and Girls Baseball Skills camps
 - Winter Camp registrations were down however Spring Camp registration numbers exceeded expectations, eventually had to turn away families
 - Completed the programs even though there were challenges related to scheduling, facilities & resources...once again!
 - Over 75 registrants for Tigers camp (T-Ball to Mosquito)
 - 4th year for hosting a "girls only" camp, included more than 75 girls from various associations surrounding the greater Edmonton area. Largest girls camp in Alberta
- Training hosted more clinics and sessions than any previous year
 - 2 day Regional Certification Coach clinic, overwhelming number of registrants
 - o 2 night House League Coach clinic at Servus, very well attended
 - Largest and the only Umpire/Coach clinic in Alberta, more than 75 coaches attended
 - 2 2 day Umpire Certification clinics
- Pitch Count implemented Pitch Count in the House League, Mosquito Division and above
- Midget House League second year to promote Midget teams to play in the ERRBL, 2 teams in 2010
- MMBA continued to work with Kelly and her board to promote and grow baseball in Morinville. Fielded more teams this year and added their Rookie Division to our league
- Tigers Association on-going long term agreement/relationship with the organization, implementing camps, evaluations & coaching/player training and mentorship program
- Senior Cardinals continued relationship with the Gary Tater and his club, promoting men's baseball in St. Albert
- Prospects Academy partnership to provide access to our facilities, in return they would run
 joint practices with our Midget AAA team, build/provide a stronger and more experienced

- coaching team for our club and provide an opportunity for players to play with and strengthen our teams overall skills and abilities
- SAMBA/MMBA Day at the Capitals Game all teams that participated had a great time, we received many acknowledgements and raised more than \$500 for the Association

Facilities

- Second straight year of full time concession operations....thanks to Kim & Ron Coffin
- Exceptional field maintenance program and field staff....thanks to Gerry and his dedicated crew
- Realized continued clubhouse bookings and maintain great management/cleaning services.
 Providing more income than expected which will allow sustainability through the winter month's to cover all utilities, supplies and facility maintenance and labor costs
- Completed demolition of trailer interior, started renovation to convert into a team dressing/ locker facility. Expect to complete and open by the start of next season
- Purchased new locks to re-key entire grounds...pending welding of locks to the facilities
- Started High School paining project on dug-outs to provide better visual appeal of the grounds
- Purchase of 3rd tractor c/w mower and snow blower
- Cleaned rubbish from treed area behind batting cage, built storage area for all tractor equipment
- Refurbishment of Mosquito Diamond, although originally interpreted as a disaster, the
 outcome generated many positives. Joint/renewed partnership with the City Council and
 various management levels lead back to minimal costs and labor required by SAMBA and
 may lead to incorporating better environmental conditions/mandates across Canada.
 Diamond was scheduled for shale replacement during the 2010 2011 season

Marketability & Image

- On-going SAMBA Corporate Sign Campaign (2 year sponsorship program)
- On-going Grant Proposal focus.....thanks to Karina Guy for her commitment and efforts to submit proposals, facilitate outstanding issues and seek out additional submissions. We are very optimistic about the potential to be recipients of additional ones in 2011
- Upgrade to SAMBA's website, new more intuitive and interactive site expected to launch in November

Achievements:

- 2010 realized a slight reduction (5%) in registration numbers, the majority being female players, however our numbers still maintain SAMBA as the largest association in Alberta and the House League teams rosters were maintained at comfortable levels allowing more play time
- <u>All</u> registrations for House League, Rep League and all Camps were conducted on-line this year which significantly reduced administration efforts, requirements and handling of fees
- Abolished House League "Player Pairing Request" offering due to abuse of intent/members
- All League fees, team fees and accounts payable were facilitated on time and in a very timely fashion, no outstanding invoices or carrying costs exist. Overall the association's financial status is very respectable and sound, much better than other previous years
- SAMBA Sports Raffle 75% participation, generated more than \$22k in revenue

- SAMBA was successfully at being awarded a \$20k matching grant from the Community Initiatives Program. Originally the intent was to receive the grant in early spring, based on actual award date in July all intended projects will be completed during the 2011 season
- Successfully completed a Casino earlier in the year, raised more than 16k in revenue
- Health & Wellness Program (Smokeless Tobacco Awareness) Ed Ewasiuk continues to
 participate and represent baseball on the St. Albert & Sturgeon Primary Care Network
 Steering Committee. Program provided awareness to our membership at various events,
 and will continue to be promoted and enforced (documented policy in place) at our facility
 for the foreseeable future. Additional components will be added each season, including
 nutrition and fitness. Signage still remains to be posted around the facility however
- Rep Jersey Replacement/Standardization completed two year program to replace all Rep Team Jerseys through a sponsorship program with Amyottes....thanks to Rick Moreau. Have establish a consistent standard and specification for many years to come
- Fielded very competitive teams in all divisions/levels throughout the season...thanks to all the coaches/players for their efforts and sportsmanship. All teams, coaches and players represented SAMBA to the highest regard, there were no significant issues realized throughout the season. Well done everyone!!!!!
- Hosting of Championships/Facility Utilization hosted Midget AAA Provincial Championship, Sr. Cardinals League Championship for the second straight year, Tigers Sunburst League Provincials, Major League Scouting ID Camp, Team Alberta Bantam Girls pre-event conditioning camp & Prospects Academy fall baseball program maximizing utilization of our facility right through to the end of September
- Coaching Expertise Hiring of Kurtis Lay from the U.S., tremendous experience for SAMBA with a very successful outcome in all aspects
- Facility Condition.....exceptional in 2010!!!! Overall the fields and facility were in the best condition that we have seen for many years!!!

Challenges:

- WEATHER IN 2010!!!! Created an overwhelming amount of extra effort, levels of stress and frustrations for everyone, especially a number of our current executive. Coordination for cancellations and rescheduling of league games and tournaments (mid-season tournament cancelled, year-end tournament required many games to be either cancelled or rescheduled), all the efforts to try and start the Early Bird Tournament ultimately lead to the cancellation, first time in well over a decade, umpires, etc. etc. Not a very good year for ball however managed to complete the season and all we very satisfied!
- Vandalism Realized less than previous year(s), however continue to experience vandalism at our facilities which ultimately impacts our financial status
- Participation/Volunteer's Continual need to appeal to and encourage our membership to
 participate in our various programs/events and engage volunteer's as part of the regular
 operational (coaches, coordinator's, etc) and seasonal requirements to minimize/stabilize
 labor costs and at the same time maintain our reputation as the largest and one of the most
 cost effective baseball associations in Alberta
- Mature BOD need to promote/mentor "younger (Jr. Division)" successors. Those that will be engaged with SAMBA for years to come
- Facilities availability of respectable facilities to utilize at the Bantam/Midget House League level

2010 Technical Directors Report

It was a pleasure working with our Rep and House League Coaches during the 2010 season. Their dedication and commitment to our players and our program is sometimes overlooked or taken for granted. I would like to thank them for their efforts on behalf of SAMBA.

SAMBA Camps

Winter Camp

Faced with booking challenges at Servus Place and Athletes Nation, we combined the Junior and Senior players for the winter camp. Enrollment was down overall from previous years, feedback we received indicated the start time for the Junior camp was too early for many.

Spring Camp

2010 House League Directors Report

House League Overview:

Overall, the 2010 House League Program was once again a great success. There was a slight drop off in registrations with a total of 522 players competing in 6 divisions this year, compared to 557 competing in 6 divisions last year. All divisions with the exception of Bantam and Midget played either a Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday schedule.

- 1. **Rally Cap** (T-Ball) consisted of 12 teams, 143 players in total (118 males & 25 females), with 1 overage player.
- 2. **Rookie** consisted of 14 teams, 12 from St. Albert and 2 teams from Morinville, 138 players in total from St. Albert (120 males & 18 females), with 13 underage and 2 overage players.
- 3. **Mosquito** consisted of 10 teams, 8 teams from St. Albert and 2 teams from Morinville. 100 players in total from St. Albert (88 males & 12 females), with 10 underage and 2 overage players.
- 4. **PeeWee** consisted of 10 teams, 7 teams from St. Albert and 3 teams from Morinville. 72 players in total from St. Albert (67 males & 5 females), with 5 underage and 1 overage player.
- 5. **Bantam** consisted of 3 teams, 39 players in total (35 males & 4 females). 2010 was the fifth straight year our Bantam division teams played in the Edmonton & Rural Recreational Baseball League (ERRBL). Once again a total of 20 teams from Edmonton and surrounding communities played in the league.
- 6. Midget consisted of 2 teams, 30 players in total (30 males & 0 females), with 3 underage players. 2010 was the second straight year our Midget division teams played in the Edmonton & Rural Recreational Baseball League (ERRBL). A total of 10 teams this year from Edmonton and surrounding communities played in the league, compared to 8 teams in 2009.

General Comments:

- Player Evaluations Took place at Servus Credit Union Place for the third straight year, we realized
 greater than 80% average participation for the 5 divisions. Thanks to Danny Mikitka and the Senior
 Tigers for participating and assessing the player's this year, their contribution provided SAMBA with
 more consistent ratings in order that we could comprise teams to a higher level of balance within the
 divisions
 - Rookie 79%
 - Mosquito 69%
 - PeeWee 100%
 - Bantam 85%
 - Midget 70%
- 2011 League Forecast:
 - 1. Rally Cap 12 to 14 teams, 94 returning players in total (80 males & 14 females)
 - 2. **Rookie** –12 SAMBA teams, 135 returning players in total (113 males & 22 females)

- 3. Mosquito –10 SAMBA teams, 110 returning players in total (97 males & 13 females)
- 4. **Peewee** 7 SAMBA teams, 81 returning players in total (72 males & 9 females)
- 5. **Bantam** 4 SAMBA teams, 56 returning players in total (53 males & 3 females)
- 6. **Midget** 3 SAMBA teams, 43 returning players in total (40 males & 3 females)
- **Division Coordinators** Coordinators for all divisions were identified prior to the start of season. Helene Schulte (Rally Cap), Kristyn LeBlanc (Rookie), Trent Bronson (Mosquito), Patrick Sullivan (PeeWee) and Ed Karl, House League Director (Bantam & Midget) volunteered a significant amount of their time and efforts to ensure all the objectives of our program were well executed/fulfilled, the outcome was successful and very enjoyable for all players and their families. On behalf of myself and the Board of Director's, a huge note of appreciation and thanks goes out to all of them!
- Player / Team Pictures This year's photo sessions at SDI Digital Imaging were scheduled for the second week of regular season play. Deferring the sessions by a week has proved to be much more effective and accommodating for the coaches and families, ensuring any rooster changes, uniform requirements, etc. were completed and at the same time maintained delivery of all packages by the midseason tournament. As always, SDI provided exceptional service and high quality of product
- League / Tournament Play The 2010 season was a challenge from start to finish, with wet weather placing tremendous strain on both league and tournament play. The scheduled commenced on May 3rd and conclude on June 27th. Starting the season in May as opposed to the last week in April had many advantages from a house league stand point. The extra week allows greater time between the closing of registrations and the formation of the house league. This gap in time proved less stressful and allowed for better preparation for the coaches meetings which take place 2 weeks prior to the season start, and also meant that equipment to be issued for the season could be much better scrutinized for any discrepancies. It also created a larger window to host the mandatory Umpires/Coaches clinic. I would recommend that the 1st week of May remain as the start date for the league
- Over the originally planned 8 week period, 607 league and tournament games were scheduled. 509 in St. Albert, 98 in Morinville and 21 in Rundle Park for the PeeWee Mid Season Tournament. Baseball Alberta took over management of the ERRBL for both Bantams and Midgets this year with all scheduling done by BA. Bantam and Midget games were scheduled and played at Legion Fields with the exception of some rescheduled rain out's due to scheduling conflicts. Games affected by the weather experienced through the course of our season were the responsibility of all coaches to make up and all were made aware of the fact throughout the season. Efforts by coaches to reschedule make-up games met with marginal success partially due to parent refusal to play weekends and also the continued poor weather. Both Bantams and Midgets teams rescheduled the majority of their games, the exceptions were the final games of the season where time restraints placed by their pending playoff schedule made it impossible to reschedule
- Practice facilities and schedules were established for all divisions/teams once again this season, including access to the batting cage's
- Coach meetings to review and discuss the 2010 program, distribute information packages, schedules, uniforms & equipment took place at the clubhouse 2 weeks prior to the start of season
- Most House League coaches completed their mandatory Respect in Sport courses, additional NCCP courses will be made mandatory in 2011
- The implementation of the pitch count at the Mosquito and PeeWee levels met with some resistance, and was in use during our mid and year end tournaments for Mosquito and year end for PeeWee. Over all it was a success, and could not have been so without strict oversight by both Trent Bronson Mosquito Coordinator, and Pat Sullivan PeeWee Coordinator, WELL DONE!
- The mid-season tournaments Rally Cap to Mosquito were impossible to complete due to precipitation.
 Rally Cap (1 day event) and Rookie (3 day event) which usually includes a lunch was made up by offering all teams at these levels the option of watching the Tigers weekend tournament with a free

lunch provided through the SAMBA concession. Only a few team players (approx. 12) took advantage of this

- PeeWee teams for the fifth straight year participated in the NEZ tournament as part of their mid season tournament (3 day event at Rundle Park) which included teams from Edmonton and surrounding communities. SAMBA subsidized 75% of the \$200 entry fee for each of our 8 team's, the remainder was collected from the team families
- All divisions/teams participated in a year end tournament, 1 day event for Rally Cap, 3 day event for Rookie, Mosquito and PeeWee divisions. Weather once again threatened the event with Friday's games being forfeited, but the remaining games were played, with a proper conclusion to the season played out on Sunday at all levels. Our Bantam and Midget teams finished league play and did well in the standings, with one of our Bantam teams once again winning an ERRBL Championship. Well done coaches and players! All SAMBA House League players PeeWee Division and lower received trophies at season's end regardless of how they placed in their respective year end tournament
- Umpires 2010 continued to be a very difficult year relative to the number of available umpires (consistent across Alberta). Considering more than 200 house league games in St. Albert required umpires, John Bresler St. Albert District Umpire Coordinator, all his local umpires and a few parents/coaches need to be commended for their efforts and exceptional job of coordinating and communicating amongst themselves to ensure the games were played as scheduled. Kelly Phelan and Joan Agnew of Morinville Minor Baseball Association, also need to be commended for their role coordinating the umpire requirements to the same set of standard's
- Facilities Overall, the City of St. Albert ball fields were well maintained, grass cut and shale raked on a regular bases. This proved no easy task given the extraordinary precipitation we received this year. We are pleased to see the field's in Morinville were maintained regularly and to a high standard, well done!
- Equipment Deposit Program SAMBA this year once again collected a \$200 deposit from each House League coach prior to distribution of equipment. The result at season's end was 96% return of all equipment. The return of keys did not seem to be a problem as with previous years although we still have 1 or 2 outstanding. The implementation by the City of a combination lock at Grosvenor Pumphouse certainly helped alleviate some of the continuing headaches of less than 100% return of keys. Thanks to Gary Bokenfohr Equipment Coordinator, Ed Ewasiuk President and Trent Bronson Technical Director for their efforts ensuring equipment return, this will continue to reduce the impact on following year's equipment replacement requirements and registration fee's

Key Highlights:

- Winter / Spring Camp For the second straight year SAMBA's winter/spring camps were held at Servus Credit Union Place and Athletes Nation, twice weekly from February through to the end of March. More than 40 Rally Cap to Midget level players attended the winter camp and more than 90 attended the spring camp. Thanks to Trent Bronson Technical Director for scheduling and Danny Mikitka and a number of Tiger's for leading the sessions to ensure all players involved had a great deal of fun, received the very best instruction/workout and were able to enhance their basic skill set in preparation for the season. The Tiger's leadership and commitment to deliver this program can certainly be attributed to the successful outcome we realized. This year unfortunately due to facility booking issues and issues with the flooring we did face certain challenges of not being able to provide consistency in the schedules, next season we will be in a better position to coordinate the facilities well in advance, developed a better tiered / consistent program, and provide earlier notification to accommodate our membership
- **Tiger's Camp** As per 2010 recommendations, scheduling and coordination efforts were well underway prior to the start of season, this provided our membership an extended notification period which resulted in a terrific turn out. More than 75 boys and girls from Rally Cap to Mosquito attended the camp on Saturday, June 5th to take part in a full day of fundamentals instruction and drills, receive a Tiger's

T-Shirt, compete for awards and have lunch with their favorite Tiger. Recommendations from those involved believe that the full day event could possibly be shortened without impact to instruction, as the length of the session proves to be challenging holding the attention of many of the younger players. Thanks to Kurtus Millar, Darren Kirstiuk, Danny Mikitka and the rest of the Tiger's for hosting this event and the included House League Coaches mini camp. Many families commented on how excited their kids were and what a great job you all did to keep them interested and active for the entire day, not to mention what they learned, the new friendships/mentorships formed and overall awareness of who the Tiger's are....we certainly look forward to seeing all of you out there again next season!

- Community Division Provincial Play This year we saw the return of community baseball at the Peewee level for the first time in 4 years. Unfortunately for a second year in a row, lack of coaching interest at the Mosquito and Bantam levels resulted once again in 0 teams at these 2 levels even though there continues to be interest amongst the parents and players for continued play through July
- Coaching Clinic This year's pre-season coaching program held over 2 nights at Servus Credit Union Place for returning/prospective House League coaches was a great success, and should be continued. Feedback from all that attended was very positive. Hopes are that many of the younger coaches gained confidence in their abilities and will remain coaching in our program for years to come. Many thanks go out to Trent Bronson for coordinating the clinics, Kurtus Millar and all the Tigers that helped out
- Girl's Baseball (SAMBA Angels) / Girls Baseball Day In Alberta Camp SAMBA's ongoing initiative to promote Girls Baseball continued to struggle in 2010 (67 registrants) and resulted in no Rally Cap teams, 1 Rookie team, 1 Mosquito team and no PeeWee teams, a 25% decrease in registrations from the previous year (89 registrants) and 36% decrease from an all time high in 2008 (105 registrants). All teams were represented in the Angel uniforms c/w "Girl Power" silk screened on the jerseys for the fourth straight year. SAMBA also hosted it's fourth consecutive "All Girls Baseball Day in Alberta Skills Camp", more than 75 girls from across the greater Edmonton area, Rally Cap to PeeWee division attended the Friday, May 14th event on our Bantam diamond coordinated by Ed Ewasiuk, and lead by Chris James, Director of Girls Baseball for Baseball Alberta and members of the 2010 Alberta Bantam Division Girls Provincial Team and Alberta Women's Open Division Provincial Team...way to go girls!
- Girl's National's Kaitlyn Ewasiuk from SAMBA's Bantam AA team along with Assistant Coach Ed Ewasiuk, joined and competed with Team Alberta Bantam Girls at the Canadian Nationals hosted in Richmond, BC during August. Although it was overall a stronger team, unfortunately they finished with a 2 and 2 record and out of the medal round. Paige Wakefield from SAMBA's Midget AA team competed with the Team Alberta Open Division Girls at the Canadian Nationals hosted in North York, ON during July. Congratulations are in order as they brought home the Silver Medal. PeeWee Division baseball at the Provincial level continued to struggle as well, Julia Nicholson from SAMBA's PeeWee AA team along with Coach Byron Nicholson were preparing to compete with Team Alberta PeeWee Girls and host a Western's Provincial tournament, unfortunately at the last minute all other Western Provincial teams pulled out, leaving Byron to host a mini camp for the team in St. Albert
- Apparel Part of our four year program to firstly promote girl's baseball by enhancing/consolidating the appearance of their uniform ("SAMBA Angles" jerseys), SAMBA continued the player purchase program for baseball pants, and it is now an accepted practice and requirement to play baseball. The appearance of our House League team's on the field in grey pants, Major League themed jerseys and St. Albert Cardinal caps made our teams not only look very smart and organized, but really enhanced the overall impression and player feelings that they belong to a more unified and great baseball association. Thanks to Rick Moreau at Amyotte's for alleviating the pressure on SAMBA resources by stepping forward to manage the program, supply and sell the pant's at a very competitive rate directly out of their facility. In addition, all the families comprising our membership need to be commended for adopting this program, in the long run it will prove to be very beneficial from a financial perspective, ensuring SAMBA continues to be one of the best and most cost effective baseball associations in Alberta relative to registration fee's and we can all share the same sense of pride to be part of it

New For 2011

- The promise of possible reduction in registration fees in 2011 was made to those coaches that volunteered and completed both their courses this year with the hope of developing a solid base of returning House League coaches each season. It is my opinion that this break in fees should be implemented in 2011
- Introduce pitching clinics throughout the season to coincide with the Tigers practice schedule at Legion Fields. This was partially introduced in 2010 and was a big success
- Lobby the City to improve conditions at Bellerose or other facility of required size. This field will continue to see additional use from both Bantam and Midgets, as this is our only alternate field outside of Legion Field to facilitate practices and or make-up games
- Return to Rally Cap division mid-season/year end tournaments with 1 day of play, but intermix the regular season schedule play with the Rally Cap Program
- Consider cashing equipment deposit cheque prior to season start to entice some coaches to maintain better control over their kit

The 2010 season was fairly uneventful for Special Events, however we did once again for the second straight year proceed to have the SAMBA Sports Raffle and we did make money.

The raffle was a little more organized this year, the packages were circulated to the coaches during their respective meetings at the start of season and for the most part all tickets were handed out. A few coaches either forgot to or simply choose on their own accord not to hand them out, which was very disappointing to find out as they simply do not understand why we need a consolidated effort from our entire membership to fulfill our projected program requirements at both the House League and Rep League levels. Unfortunately those few will now impact the entire Association as next year there will be projected cuts to various aspects of our program in order to maintain our registration fees.

The following figures are the results of this year's raffle:

Combined, we sold 5970 out of 8000 printed tickets for a total income of \$29,820.00 out of a possible \$40,000.00 = 75% participation (up from 73% last year). Prize expense costs equated to \$7,788.00 for a total net income of \$22,032.00

Broken down further, the Rookie Division sold 68% of their tickets, the Mosquito and Peewee Divisions sold over 80% of their tickets, the Bantam Division disappointingly only sold 38% of their tickets and the Midget Division sold 66% of their tickets.

The Rally Cap (T-Ball) Division sold 71% of their tickets however were the most vocal about <u>having</u> to sell them.

The Rep division was to me the most discouraging of them all. They sold 85% of their tickets but a couple of the AA teams really let us down. I think it is kind of an unwritten rule that this division sell ALL their tickets, especially at the higher levels and this was not the case this year.

In conclusion, we did make a profit of over \$22,000, without this raffle we would have been in serious financial trouble at year's end. We, as Board Members of this great Association, are working very hard to try and make baseball affordable in St. Albert and we need the help from our membership to make it possible. There are a tremendous amount of expenses at every level (field rentals, maintenance, umpires fees being the highest, etc.) and without some form of fundraising, we would have to continually raise fees to an unrealistic amount just to keep baseball in St. Albert alive and competitive across all other Associations and Communities within the greater Edmonton area.

I would like to thank all the Team Coordinators in helping me keep track of ticket sales and all the Division Coordinators fop helping me hand out and collect the tickets and money prior to seasons end. Without all of you, this job would have been extremely time consuming and difficult to fulfill.

Going forward, I believe SAMBA needs to continue facilitating this raffle up to a point it no longer becomes an interested or viable fundraising initiative, I also believe the ticket price is very reasonable relative to the fantastic prizes that are available and won. Hopefully we can all take a lesson from the Mosquito players and sell over 84% of our tickets next season.

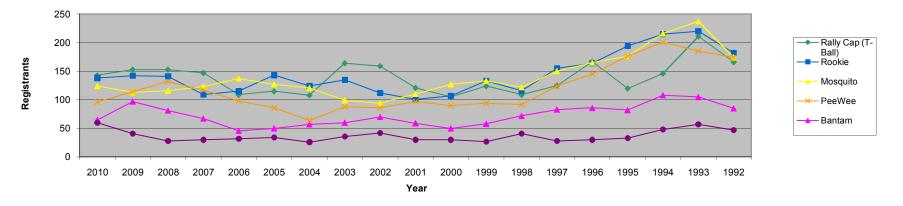
