What to know about the 2025 season

As registration opens and anticipation builds toward an exciting new season, behind the scenes the Rams executive board has been feverishly trying to find solutions to some of the problems that are almost impossible to avoid when running a youth sports organization.

Registration fees, fundraising efforts, floor availability, coaching resources, player development strategies and volunteer incentives are always at the top of the list. And the hardest part might be navigating topics that are outside the club, like tournament challenges and reffing shortages. And as much as we, as a club, try to mitigate the impact of some of these challenges to our members, some are just unavoidable.

Changes to the volunteer program

The biggest change you'll notice this season is the mandatory volunteer fee added to your registration. This topic was deliberated over at great length trying to find a solution to troubles we have had securing volunteers to fill a variety of positions over the course of the calendar year. The volunteer fee is refunded upon completion of vour volunteer commitment.

Returning for 2025 is the raffle program. With your 2025 registration, you'll receive a pack of raffle tickets that you'll be able to sell to re-coupe the costs. You can sell or disperse the raffle tickets at your discretion.

Uniforms and Shorts

When you fill out your registration this season, you'll be asked for a shorts size, because they are included in this years registration fee for U9 and up players. As we unveil the new uniform for 2025, we want all of our players to look complete, fresh and fierce while on the floor.

The Dreaded Fee Increases

Every year we hold high hopes that operating costs, like floor time, officials, sanctioning fees ect... will remain stagnant from the previous year. 
The loss of Panther City in the NLL most notably eliminated 25 roster spots, creating an even harder path to find a spot on a team, and created even more parity within the league.

PROFESSIONAL PLAY FOR WOMEN:

With the exponential growth in the women's game, not just across North America, but across the world has created a capacity for professional play in the box and field games.



In 2022, <u>The Arena Lacrosse League</u> (ALL) which is a semi pro box lacrosse with divisions based out western and eastern

Canada, introduced a Woman's league to run in tandem with the Men. Comprised of 6 teams in the west and 5 teams in the east, opportunities to play have never been greater.

The most recent opportunity for women to play at a professional level has been the announcement of the *WLL* which will operate under the <u>PLL</u> umbrella providing women to play at the highest level of field lacrosse with national TV broadcasts. The WLL will debut 4 teams playing the "Sixes" format at the 2025 PLL Championship Series Feb 11-17.

History Was Made

The Week 3 match up between the **Calgary** Roughnecks and Albany Firewolves, had fans leaving disappointed after watching **Dane Dobbie** re-write the record books on route to an overtime win in the most dramatic fashion.

At the end of the third quarter the Firewolves had an 8-5 lead and had been able to silence Dobbie to an uncharacteristic 0 points. However, that would end in the fourth quarter when Dobbie would set an NLL record by scoring 7 goals in a single quarter, and tied the game late in the forth to send it to overtime. Dobbie would cap off the night with the overtime winner, in true Dobbie form. A burst

of speed off the bench and a long pass from the goalie. Dobbie scored the last 8 goals for the 'Necks in a dramatic come from behind overtime victory.
