



#### Rams Lacrosse the World

Rams Alumni shares his passion for Lacrosse as he sets up a permanent home in Korea.

After his minor Career with the Rams, A successful NCAA career, some time with the Edmonton Rush, and back to back President's Cup victory's with the Miners, Dave Marrese is ready for the next step in his Lacrosse Adventure.

Dave played his entire minor career with the Rams, before graduating to the Jr. B Tier 1 Rams in 2004. After a year of Jr. B, he made the jump to the Jr. A Miners where he played until 2008. Finishing his Junior career, he was first pick for the Sr. B Miners for their inaugural

season, spending 7 years playing with the Club. In those 7 years, he would spend 2 of them sharing the net with his brother Jon, claiming 5 RMLL championships and 2 national championships.



In Tandem with his Jr. and early Sr. career, Dave Attended <u>The Dominican University of New York</u>. He spent one season playing attack and three playing defense for the <u>Chargers</u>, captaining the team for 3 of those 4 seasons while earning his Psychology Degree.

After Graduating university, Dave was signed as a free agent by the Edmonton Rush. He would remain on the practice roster from 2011-2013, but never got his crack at an NLL start.

In 2011, he would become an instructor for the Lacrosse Program at St. Francis Xavier, where he taught until 2020. This is when Dave decided it was time for change. But neither from teaching nor from Lacrosse.

In 2019 Dave originally made the move to the Republic of Korea, where he started teaching English at a Hagwon (Korean Kindergarten). While getting settled into his new life, local Lacrosse figure Stu Begg put Dave in touch in with the Korean Lacrosse Program. Dave took his experience and passion for Lacrosse and started a development program for the Korean Men's national team.

During this time in Korea, he would meet his soon to be wife Julie. Though spending the majority of their time at their home in Korea, Dave would still find time to come back home to Canada in between responsibilities. And when those times did come, he would instantly jump right back into the local Lacrosse fold.

While home, Dave coached a 10U team for the Rams during the 2022 season, once again building a love for the game, that he seems to contagiously spread to all the players he interacts with. Dave has continued to work with the Rams, consulting the Executive Board, and evaluating players during the pre-season. *cont. on pg.4*

Having been fortunate enough to Chat with Dave shortly before he left, while watching a North Zone U15A Practice, which happens to have a number of players that he coached at a Tyke level, he mentioned his new role with Korea Lacrosse.

Dave had been promoted to Asst. Coach with the Korean Men's National Team, and will help lead them to the 2023 World Men's Lacrosse Championship in San Diego California.



Dave and his wife Julie still plan on spending summers home in Canada to be with friends and family. But you can be assured, that if there is Lacrosse, Dave will find himself there, no matter what side of the globe he happens to be on at the time.

## IS A REFEREE'S GREATER CHALLENGE THE GAME, OR THOSE WITHIN IT?

It's cliche to say that referee's are only noticed when they get the call wrong. And that you'll never recognize a referee for calling a great game. But sadly these are more commonly truths then they are cliche. And we are at a breaking point with our referees.

The <u>ALRA</u> has sent off major concerns and a suggested course of action to the <u>ALA</u> following a very rocky start to the 2023 season. With an attrition rate of almost 75% from the new referee pool in 2022, and current referees declining assignments, we are on a path that quite literally leads to no Lacrosse being played.

Incidents ranging from parents berating officials, coaches questioning every call and even as far as physical altercations against officials are causing our referee pool to diminish at an alarming rate.

Quite often these officials are young lacrosse players looking for ways to get more involved in the game, but is actually causing them to get further away. This causes problems for the schedule makers and tournament organizers, but most importantly our young men and women looking to help grow and stay involved in the game.

So next time you feel the need to call out a referee for what you think was a missed or incorrect call. Take a look around first. See that parent that doesn't seem to be sitting with either club playing the game? That is likely the referee's parent, and just like you, they are there to watch their child learn and thrive. And though a parent may be able to shrug off the words you feel compelled to shout, that young official cannot, and should not have to. If that child is not granted the opportunity to learn and grow in their craft, then yours may lose the opportunity to play.

### **Parents Challenge!!**

Common Lacrosse Canada rules and regulations that maybe you didn't know.

#### Rule 37 - Charging

(a) A minor or major penalty shall be assessed to a player/goalkeeper who runs, jumps into or charges an opposing player/goalkeeper. When a violent collision results, the *Reckless and Endangering Play* rule may be applied. A goalkeeper penalty shall be served by a player who was on the floor at the time of the infraction. (Modified 2013)

Situation 1 - Rule 37

Q - Can an offensive player be assessed a penalty for charging?

A - Any offensive player (including the ball carrier) who deliberately charges directly at a defensive player may be assessed a penalty.

Note: This interpretation is only to be used when the infraction is too violent to be covered under the minor interference rule.
