## 2023 Box Lacrosse Provincials to be hosted by The GELC

Changes to the provincial format are in effect for this season, while also being hosted in the Edmonton Area.

You read that right!! The [2023 ALA Minor Box Lacrosse Provincials](#) will be hosted by the [GELC](#). Games and festivities will be shared amongst different arenas and floors within the GELC and it's member clubs.

The biggest difference to the Provincial festivities this year as compared to the recent past, is the change back to earning your way in. The last handful of years, the provincial tournament was open to any team that wanted to enter, and any team could win the Provincial Championship regardless of where they finished the season in their respective league. This year, only the division winners will be eligible to take part in provincials. "A" Divisions will be a "best of" series between the GELC and CDLA champions, and the "B" Divisions will be a round robin format between the [GELC](#), [CDLA](#)

and the hosting team if applicable. More information can be found on the [GELC Provincials Page](#), and more detailed information can be found in Regulation 28 of the [ALA Regulations](#).

This will change the way some teams plan their [tournament schedule](#) for the season compared to years past. Teams this year may want to budget for the provincial tournament being a possibility or pre plan fundraising efforts, should your team earn a spot in the 2023 ALA Provincials.

## Monday Night Drop-In Lacrosse Camp A big Success



### More feet on the floor then a Fred Flintstone driven school bus

Dean Fairall's path to the NLL, though common, is not your typical fairy tale.


The most commonly told story about a star athlete's road to success is one of a young player tearing up every league at every age, making waves on social media, and hyped by all the major sports outlets. It's an ESPN docuseries and intermission vignettes during prime time games. It's pre-draft endorsement deals, and rookie max contracts, followed by a career of scrutiny and micro managing fandom.

Rarely is it a story of player going undrafted, slugging it out in amateur leagues, and being cut from multiple pro training camps year after year after year, while trying to make the dream of becoming professional a reality. And even more rarely, is the story of a player making a transition from being a goaltender to prolific goal-scoring, impact player that stands out every time he is on the floor.

But that's the situation former St. Albert Ram, [Dean Fairall](#) finds himself in. Years of hard work, determination, and getting back on his feet every time his path knocked him down have prepared him to take full advantage of his

eventual opportunity, solidifying his spot as a professional Lacrosse player.



## Lacrosse Returns to the Canada Summer Games

On Saturday, February 18th, the Hon. Pascale St-Onge, Minister of Sport confirmed that Lacrosse, the National Summer Sport of Canada, would be [added to the official Canada Games program](#), beginning with the 2025 Games hosted in Newfoundland and Labrador.

In 2022, Lacrosse returned to the [Canada Summer Games](#) for the first time since 1985. However, its return would be brief, as it was announced shortly after that Lacrosse would not be included in the 2025 event. But after a nationwide uprising, and [petitioning](#) from players, clubs, fans and governing bodies alike, the decision was overturned and Lacrosse was granted permanent inclusion in the summer games starting in 2025.

## Parents Challenge!!

**Common CLA Lacrosse rules and regulations that maybe you didn't know.**

### Rule 68 - Thirty Second Rule

(a) The offensive team shall be required to take a shot on goal within thirty-seconds of gaining possession. Failure to do so will result in the Offensive Timekeeper sounding a horn. The ball shall be immediately recovered by or possession awarded to the non-offending team.

NOTE: A shot on goal shall be defined as the ball making contact with the goalkeeper (while the goalkeeper is within the crease), goal posts or cross bar prior to crossing the goal line. A shot must originate from the front side of the goal.

(d) It shall be ruled that the referee's whistle sounded simultaneously with the timekeepers horn if a goal is scored (i.e. the goal shall be disallowed if the horn sounded before the ball was in the goal).
