TEAM RAMP FOR PARENTS AND COACHES

By now all players parents and coaches should have to their teams ramp page on the rams website and to the Ramp Team App.

Coaches/Managers: You'll use the web portal to manage your rosters and Ramp Team Access. You'll enter and confirm game sheets and can add non-league games and team events into the schedule.

Parents: You'll be able to view the schedule, RSVP to games and practices and you'll be able to interact with the team in the chat.

Sometimes it feels like it's over before it starts. But that's a decision only you can make.

After setting a <u>Crude Lacrosse</u> Club Jr. B record for points in a season and getting accepted into an Ivy League School with a Division One Lacrosse Program, <u>Erik</u> was on the path he pictured as a young child aspiring to become a professional Lacrosse player.

Although he reached his goal, his path was not exactly that which he had pictured. After a successful Lacrosse career and education at Cornell University, Erik was passed over in the the 2016 NLL Entry Draft. Following that disappointment he returned home, where he starting working with minor Lacrosse Clubs while trying to figure out his next step.

In 2018 he found his next opportunity, getting an invitation to training camp with the Coquitlam Adanacs of the WLA. After making an impact to this historic franchise in training camp, Erik tore his ACL in the first pre-season game ending his season. He was forced to spend the remainder of that year rehabbing his knee.

When he was able to get back on his feet, he continued to work with local clubs, where he came

and ran the Rams Winter Camp, teaching young players our wonderful game.

In 2019, all that work and dedication paid off, when he signed his first NLL contract with the Colorado Mammoth. He dressed for a couple games, but this opportunity was also short lived, as the season would be cut short due to the COVID 19 pandemic, where play was paused for 18 months.

He would finally get his chance with a new contract for the 2022 season. Erik found himself on the full time roster, dressing for all but one game in the regular season. He got the nod for one playoff game, where he made his mark scoring in transition, helping the Mammoth achieve the 2022 NLL Championship!!

be hosted in Oakville Ontario, by the Rock.







Parents Challenge!!

Common Lacrosse Canada rules and regulations that maybe you didn't know.

Rule 33 - Boarding

(a) A major Penalty shall be assessed to a player/goalkeeper who body-checks, cross-checks, trip, pushes or otherwise causes an opponent to be thrown violently into the boards (Modified 2013)

NOTE: Rolling of an opponent's ball-carrier along the boards he/she is trying to go through too small of an opening is not boarding.

(b) If the check was a reckless and endangering play the player/goalkeeper, a match penalty shall be assessed.
