special tribute is being paid to longtime Canadiens supporter Pat O’Neill. He played with the Juvenile Canadiens in 1958 to 1959 and was involved with Senior hockey for 10 years as a player and on the management side. Pat served for 25 years as a Junior B board member. He was team manager from 1977 to 1987, served as assistant coach from 1972 to 1978, coached the team from 1978 to 1980 and he served the club as its president for two years in 1980-1981 and 1982-1983. He still found time to serve as a referee for five years. He was named as St. Paul’s Citizen of the Year in 1985 and was inducted into the NEAJBHL Hall of Fame in 1994 for his outstanding service to the sport of hockey. While he’s watching from the sidelines today, he continues to be a great supporter of the St. Paul Jr. B Canadiens. We’re proud to honour him this year by raising his banner to the rafters in recognition of his many years of service to the organization.

Forward

Canadiens have not only endured, but also enjoyed the organizational success that it has had for more than half a century.

One has to look back at the early years of hockey for adolescents of the Town of St. Paul and the surrounding area to fully comprehend the reasons that the St. Paul

Prior to the construction of the first covered rink in St. Paul, the only truly organized hockey in the community was for older adolescents and adults. Teams in the various minor hockey age categories, which have changed from the time simply were non-existent. The only “organized” hockey to which young St. Paulites were exposed to was played at the high school level. The thousands of games played on sloughs, ponds and lakes that dotted the countryside were spontaneous rather than organized. In the mid-forties, the St. Paul High School “Bruins” (the baseball team was the “Bears”) hockey team competed annually for the St. Paul School Division #45 Memorial Hockey Trophy. This competition usually consisted of a home and home series with schools from Vilna to Heinsburg. Some of the older and more skilled high school team members might also be playing with the senior St. Paul Hornets.

For many of the youth of St. Paul who played hockey, the highlight of the year might be the occasions when a team was assembled to go to Blue Quills to play against the school’s team.

It was an outing that was looked forward to, as it was an opportunity to play a “real” hockey game with lines and penalties and all those other things which shinny did not provide. The excellent lunch, which the Blue Quills hosts served up to the teams at the conclusion of the game, was also looked forward to.

There are other factors, which may have had a significant impact on the existence or development of “minor” hockey in St. Paul and surrounding communities. One of these being the fact that the culture of organized sports or play did not develop in rural Alberta until the early 50’s, and the second factor had to be that many of the young males in the 13 to 19 age group were away from the community for their formal schooling. College Saint Jean, St. Anthony’s College and the Jesuit College all featured strong hockey teams composed of young males from all over northern Alberta. In addition, the “original six” of the NHL had a well-developed recruitment program, which functioned at the junior level in large urban centers. These teams had strong sponsorship programs that virtually tied young players to the sponsor team. One of these sponsor partnerships that was to play a vital role in the history of the St. Paul Canadiens was the arrangement between the Montreal Canadiens and the Regina Pats. Consequently, if a young Albertan in some way came to the attention of the “scouts”, it was not long before arrangements were made to have this lad move to a centre where he could play on the local junior team and also have his education paid for or be given a job which allowed for his major focus to be on playing hockey.

Hockey in St. Paul was to take huge steps forward in 1948 when the St. Paul Jaycees announced that they would be proceeding with the erection of a covered rink. The Jaycees were able to lease from the Town of St. Paul, for the sum of one dollar, a parcel of land (the east side of 53rd street between 50th and 49th avenues), currently Portage College. The very energetic group undertook a busy program to raise funds for this construction, as the Town did not have the money required for such a project. By December 1949, although the volunteers had only erected an unsheathed shell, ice was made in the Arena (as it would be named) and the Senior Hornets had a home in which to play their games. It would be another two years before the shell was covered properly. Meanwhile, the first steps leading to the establishment of organized hockey began as regular “peewee” hockey practices were held on Saturday mornings under the direction of Roger Belzil and Art Pigeon. It was easy to get teams from other communities to travel to St. Paul to play as the next nearest covered rinks were in Vermilion and Vegreville. However, the only “organized” hockey for the junior and senior high school boys remained the annual play between schools of the St. Paul Inspectorate. Although some challenge games were played by a team that included the likes of Eddie Keen (of CHED fame), Terry Laboucane, Fred Patry, Ray Hunter et al...

By the winter of 1952/53, a juvenile aged team coached by Ted Paradis wore the St. Paul High School colours (the Boston Bruins uniforms), and participated in the provincial playoffs against teams from Wainwright and Vegreville. This team also traveled to other small communities to play games on open-air rinks.

The following season, the team that would be recognized by many as the forefather of the St. Paul Juvenile Canadiens was formed. Known as the “Chevies”, the team was sponsored by Alec Tannas of St. Paul Sales & Service. Although this team did not win any championships in the two years of its existence, it succeeded in putting St. Paul on the map of minor hockey in northeastern Alberta. Throughout these years, teams of younger boys were also being organized and they were receiving some coaching and competition on a regular basis for a first time....

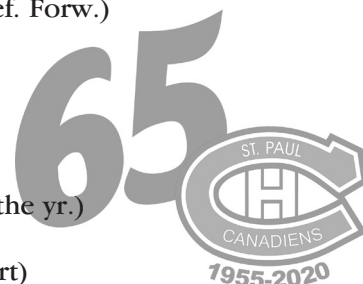

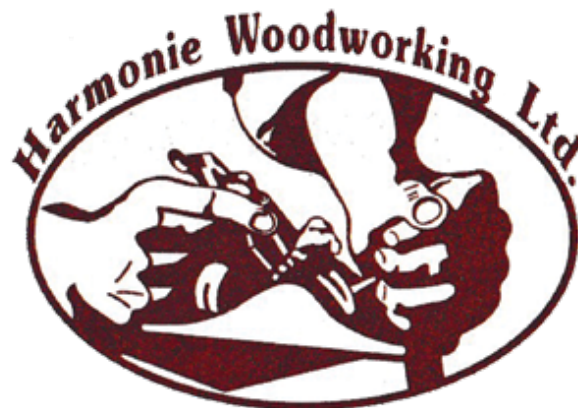
