

SMHA/TMHA PILOT Project 2024-2025 Season



REGISTRATION

- Registration opens online Friday May 31st, 2024 at https://go.teamsnap.com/forms/434728
- If you encounter any issues with online registration, please email registrar.smha@gmail.com
- SMHA runs **OPTIONAL** pre-season conditioning camps (U-9 to U-18) and hitting camps (U-13 and U-15). Players can register for these camps through the registration platform indicated above.

 Goaltenders are free for the camps but must still select the N/C camp at registration checkout. (Subject to availability)
 - Conditioning camps are scheduled for both rep tryout participants (earlier offering) and community hockey participants (later offering) so players are placed in groups based on their evaluation schedule.
- There is a tryout fee for all rep teams in Strathcona; U-11 AA, U-11 Tier 1, U-13 AA, U-13 Tier 1, U-15 AA, U-15 Tier 1, U-16 AA, U-18 AA and U-18 Tier 1. This is optional and if not selected, players will be automatically placed into the community hockey evaluations (EFHL Tiers 2-6). Goaltenders must also select the tryout fee if they wish to be evaluated for those teams.
- There are options at the body checking levels of hockey to select either Tier 1-3 body checking or
 Tier 1-3 non body checking. Please ensure you select the appropriate evaluation group. Players are
 not guaranteed to be placed on body checking teams and are subject to overall registration numbers
 and the Hockey Alberta One Standardized Tiering Grid.
- SMHA offers Recreation Hockey for players U-15 and older. No practices or body checking, just a
 fun 20-game season. Excellent option for multi-sport athletes. Select RECREATION Hockey to
 participate in this program.
- Fee payment options include 1) Online credit card payment in full, 2) online credit card installment plans, 3) E-transfer, 4) Cheques payable to SMHA. Fees must be paid in full by September 30, 2024,

unless utilizing the online credit card installment plan. Optional camp fees must be paid prior to attending.

• If your player is trying out for AAA at U-15, U-17 or U-18 with SPKAC, you can still register with SMHA online but do not make payment unless you are released or are participating in one of the SMHA optional camps.

LEAGUES & GAME PLAY

SMHA participates in four different leagues. The U-13 AA, U-15 AA, U-16 AA and U-18 AA teams have historically played in the Northern Alberta Hockey League (NAHL). The U-11 AA team in the Edmonton Federation Hockey League (EFHL). The Junior B Bruins play in the Capital Junior Hockey League (CJHL) and the Junior C Warriors play in the Noralta Junior C Hockey League.

For 2024-25, the NAHL teams are being moved to the <u>Alberta Elite Hockey League</u> (AEHL) and the U-11 AA team will also be in a new league, details still to be confirmed.

Our U-9 to U-18 Tiers 1-6 teams and U-15, U-18 and U-21 Recreation Hockey teams participate in the EFHL.

Discovery and U-7 Major & Minor Teams play a series of inter-association games (coordinated by SMHA) and exhibition games outside of a formal league structure.

Is Tofield Minor Hockey no longer an active minor hockey association?

TMHA will continue with an elected Executive and conduct regular meetings. In addition, TMHA Executive will attend the SMHA Board Meetings to provide feedback and insight.

Do I register my player with Tofield or Strathcona for this coming season?

You register with Strathcona Minor Hockey at smhahockey.com

Will all Tofield players be placed on teams together?

At U-9 and older, registrants will be placed on teams based on their evaluations with players of similar skill. SMHA fields teams at all tiers in all divisions of play. At Discovery and U-7 there will be effort to place all Tofield players on one team with Tofield Arena as their primary practice facility.

Who completes the evaluations for Strathcona Minor Hockey?

Why did I have to indicate that we are Tofield Minor Hockey members in registration?

We are using this information to try and place Tofield players together on teams when they evaluate at the same tier. There are divisions of play where we have multiple teams within one tier. We will make effort to place Tofield players together when possible.

Will teams have ice at the Tofield Arena?

Yes there will be both practices and games scheduled at the Tofield Arena as well as our other primary use facilities of Ardrossan Recreation Complex, Strathcona Olympiette Centre, Moyer Recreation Centre and Broadmoor Arena.

Can we make friend requests or ask for siblings to play together?

Friend requests are only accepted at Discovery and U-7 due to tiering restraints. Siblings at the same age division can be considered but no upward movement permitted. Underage movement can be requested but applicants should review our underage policy at smhahockey.com Overage movement must be approved by Hockey Alberta. Contact your Division Director if you require additional information.

Will teams be using Tofield or Strathcona jerseys?

Teams will wear Strathcona jerseys and socks, both of which are provided.

Will Tofield referees continue to be assigned games?

Yes the Strathcona County Referees Association will work collaboratively with the Tofield Referee in Chief and allocator.

Will Tofield players have to pay more than SMHA players for registration?

Fees will be the same for all registrants for the 2024-25 season regardless of which minor hockey association they belong to.

How do camp, evaluation and general communications come to us from SMHA?

Level Directors will communicate via Team Snap and email your upcoming ice times for evaluations as well as post the information on our website. Sometimes there are quick turnarounds during the busy evaluation period so be sure to check the website (don't forget to refresh the page) often. General communication will also come on email via Team Snap and posted on our social media (Facebook, Instagram and X). Once placed on a team, Team Managers most often use the Team Snap portal to send out communications.

Will Tofield players continue to play in Strathcona Minor Hockey after this season?

An end-of-year evaluation will be conducted by both SMHA and TMHA, with feedback gathered from players, parents, and coaches to assess the pilot project and make recommendations for future seasons.

Will Tofield coaches be eligible to coach on Strathcona Teams?
