

## PRESIDENT'S REPORT.



Now that the winter season is finished and the summer season is starting I thought it was time to send out an update on recent developments.

Firstly, we recently achieved recognition by Canada Soccer and Soccer Nova Scotia as a Quality Soccer Provider. This is the first rung on the ladder of Club Licensing in Canada and required us to meet 37 criteria, both organizational and financial.

As of this year Canada Soccer will require all soccer clubs in Canada to meet these standards and Soccer Nova Soccer now has a full time employee whose job it is to work with clubs to ensure that they meet the required standards. There are a further 3 levels of accreditation above QSP and we intent to continue working toward a higher level of club licence.



As the only club in the Valley which operates year round and which has been through the accreditation process we are in a position to assist those clubs which operate only in the summer to meet the new standards and we have offered them our support.

I also have to acknowledge the tremendous amount of work which Stephen McNeill, our Administrator, and Findlay MacRae, our Technical Director, have put in to enable us to achieve this recognition.

At the end of the NSSL Indoor season we finished slightly above .500, with a record of 53 wins, 50 losses and 6 ties. We scored a total of 268 goals and conceded 269. Obviously, some teams had better records than others but I don't think there was any team which wasn't better at the end of the season than they were at the beginning. The Women's team picked up silver medals after losing the final to Dartmouth on PKs. The Men's A team beat the Men's B team in the semifinal then beat Dunbrack in the final to win gold.

Looking ahead to the summer season, we are disappointed that we will not be able to field a Women's team this year. The team has been one of the top teams in the league for the past several years but this summer many of the Acadia players from HRM who usually play for VU in the summer have chosen instead to play in HRM since Halifax will be hosting Nationals in the fall. We will also be fielding a team in only 1 of the 4 AAA divisions. (U15 Boys.)

On a happier note, we are pleased to announce that this summer, for the first time, we will be providing all our recreational players, from U11 up to U18, with matching red shorts and red socks. We believe that all kids feel better (and maybe even play better!) if they look like real soccer players.

And finally, a new Board was elected at the AGM on March 30th. We lost 4 Board members, Marie Doucette, Megan Trace, Gillian Williams and Kelly Flecknell, who chose not to re-offer or to resign. We thank them all for their efforts on behalf of the club.







I was happy to be returned as President for another 2 year term. David Crabb moved from his position as a member of the Board to take over as Treasurer since Kelly Flecknell did not re-offer. Mike Landry re-offered for the Board and was returned. We welcomed 2 new Board members, Krista Robertson and Corey Cadeau.

Krista works in the Athletics Department at Acadia as Athletics Services Coordinator. In that position she helped organize 3 USPORTS national championships which Acadia were hosting and also worked on last year's CFL Touchdown Atlantic. She has a long association with VU as a parent, team manager and previous Board member. Corey is a lifelong VU player who also played at Acadia. While working in HRM as a Certified Professional Accountant he was Treasurer of Halifax City. He has now returned to the Valley for work and played on the Men's team which recently won the NSSL Indoor Championship.

The full Board is now composed of myself, Troy Lenihan, as President, Devin Tetlow as Vice-President, David Crabb as Treasurer and Cate McCormick as Secretary. Board members are Angela Morrison, Laura Akao, Mike Landry, Ross Bentley, Krista Robertson, Corey Cadeau and Rod McBeath.
