Ref fees are up \$10,000 from our budget last year. Where will the excess funds come from? We only did one fundraiser this year, we can do more, we can increase fees and we do have a casino coming up. Tournaments brought in a pile of money this year. VMHA is sitting in a good financial position.

Vice President - Development Report

This season provided us new initiatives and opportunities. Our first Request for Proposals brought us Kam Ballas from Apex Wellness and Steve Larry with Net Science. We utilized current practice times to offer further development in an inclusive way that had all players within U11-U18 to participate. The goalie development was huge and a step in the right direction. Both Kam and Steve were assets who provided high level services at affordable prices and were flexible with VMH's needs and wants. The Fall Prep sessions were difficult to schedule with 3 on 3's and volleyball but helped prepare our players for the upcoming season. U9 Coaches were provided an opportunity to choose which development they would like for their teams. To confirm, the RFP for the 2024/25 season is currently available on the website, there will be a few emails and FB posts to promote. Please assist us in promoting it by sharing the post, or sharing the RFP with a provider who may be interested.

VMH received two grants to run female events. In October we held a girls fall fun day. U18 Female players ran on ice sessions for the younger players, parent volunteers hosted a fun skate, yoga was offered to all ages, and all VMH female players received a nice VMH cross body bag. On Female Hockey Day (January 27, 2024) we offered "Lets Cheer It For the Girls" in collaboration with the U15 Female tournament. Foam Tiger Paws were provided to fans, and we were able to add a fun shoot out to the tournament. The goal with these events is to support and celebrate Female Hockey and we appreciate everyone who participates.

In February we had contracted The Nest Project to provide mental health sessions to the U15, U18, and U18 Female teams. Feedback from Coaches, players, and parents was positive. Hopefully this initiative can continue to grow.

I would like to extend a very sincere thank you to all volunteers that keep VMH growing. Our Association is lucky to have some pretty amazing parents who care about it, and don't mind spending endless hours in meetings planning, scheduling, emailing, listening, etc. Thank you for helping me be successful in my term.

Tigers Day is this Saturday, March 23. Tigers Day Started as a few parent suggestions. and With a generous spansorship from Alberta Broadband Network of the hard work of the planning committee and volunteers, we are now ready to host over 100 Tigers for a day of competition, food, and fun.

# Ice Scheduler R.I.C. Report

## The Group & Statistics:

- 16 Team Managers, 44 Referees, Hockey Alberta NE Regional Coordinator, Town Staffer, Shae, 9 Regional RIC's, 4 NEAHL Deputy Governors & VMHA Executive team
- One written complaint on a referee's performance, my first one in 7 years of doing an RIC role.
- Three R.C.M.P. interventions/interactions this season primarily due to abusive parents, all out of town teams.
- 14 Game incident Reports written this season in Vermilion.
- September 1, 2023-March 18, 2024 Statistics: 394 games played in the Stadium/Arena this season. 834 referee spots booked at a cost of \$50,521.32 less playoff weekends which is up 40% from last season. More teams, more tournaments, more demand.

# Improvements and recommendations for next season:

- Ice Scheduler/RIC needs to be part of the manager's meeting at the beginning of the season as all the NEW team managers need to understand the big picture of the scope of work required to balance the season schedule and make everything work.
- Electronic RAMP game sheet NOT used this season, it would greatly improve the abilities of the referees to do the job more effectively versus paper.
- Lastly, referee safety, especially junior refs 16 years old and under. The verbal abuse & lack of support from all parties when they are placed in a circumstance they didn't expect to have to deal with. It this is not addressed over the next few season it will only get worse and it has a life time effect on our kids mental health!
