#### **D.** BCLOA Rep Tyler Boyer:

Playdowns are completed and we only had a few slight hiccups with games being filled. A lot of travel was done by officials, especially for the U15 and U17 age groups. We may want to re-assess the feasibility of using Kerry Park as the major location for all playdowns if they don't have the suitably ranked officials to assist with filling higher level games. I utilized playdowns to get some officials some big pressure games and it sounds like they went off really well with some positive feedback given.

Congratulations to all the teams for a good season, and to those that won Islands and/or are heading to Provincials.

Our biggest issue moving forward will be recruitment and retention for the following seasons. This year we had to reschedule or cancel games due to a lack of officials more times than ever before. Specifically, we need officials in the Level 2 (18-22 year old) group. This has caused many headaches this year, especially once Sr/Jr season started. Recruiting officials to return after an absence would be ideal so we can increase our numbers and time to develop - it is easier to get back into the groove than learning it from scratch. We are going to need assistance from Associations, who I will be working with the Head Refs for this.

#### **A.** Alberni Valley:

We had many ups and downs this season; and unfortunately, most notably, an abrupt end to most of our teams' seasons with the Cameron Bluffs wildfire cutting off highway access to and from Port Alberni. We will have two long-time members of our Executive moving on to other pursuits in the fall - I look forward to transitioning to Past-President for the second and final time, and wish to thank our long-time Treasurer, Heather Newton, for her service and positive impact she has made on our association. Next year's crew will be awesome and we look

forward to helping grow the game in our small corner of the Island. Congrats and good luck to all of the Island teams who have participated and will be participating in Provincials!

#### **B.** Campbell River:

U17's are trying to clinch a wild card spot to get into provincials. Plans for our AGM underway. We will continue our Learn to play and free stick campaigns next season to continue building from the bottom up. Based on our numbers this year, joint competitive teams with Comox is something I believe should be investigated. We plan on modifying our constitution to include more language about parent behavior and expectations.

#### C. Comox Valley:

Our association is winding up a very successful season. We were able to field U9 and U11 teams for the first time since 2019. Most of the players at those levels were brand new to the sport this year and we hope to continue to grow numbers at these levels by continuing our elementary school "learn to play" sessions prior to next season.

Our competitive teams at U13 and U15 also had many new players and both qualified for provincials. We are still disappointed that we did not have the numbers to field a U17 team this season but that will change next year. We will be retaining most of our current board and have candidates in place to join at our AGM in the fall.

Comox would like to thank all of the division commissioners for their work this year and a special thanks to Adam Donald from Campbell River who stepped in and filled our head referee role this season.

#### D. Cowichan Valley:

#### G. Oceanside:

Our season is finished and we are in the process of recruiting more volunteers for next year. Our AGM will be held in late October. We are hosting a Lacrosse camp this summer with the RDN and are working on holding try it sessions with them this fall/winter.

#### H. Peninsula:

Our season is wrapping up with U15B and U17A2 headed to provincials. Our executive will see some turn over for next year as some of the long term members leave (players aging out)

Our new covered outdoor box is approved and in design stages no finished ETA yet but the plan is to have the roof on for next season and then replace the box and floor after the 2024 season. This way we don't lose the space for a whole season.

Lots of complaints and techy issues with RAMP. Overall the parents / managers weren't fans.

We had lots of challenges this season to overcome and still working through some of them but overall the athletes had fun which is all that really matters. I would like to discuss raising the pay scale for officials to get more online with hockey and other competitive sports. We all are feeling the struggles of Ref shortages and I think a significant pay increase would help.

#### I. Saanich:

Overall, the season has been a success. The Association has seen consistent player numbers since COVID. We believe there is a balance between new player recruitment and our ability to provide a quality sport experience. The greatest challenge continues to be dry floor space. We added a team this season and found that we were at capacity for practice times in our two outdoor boxes. Saanich Recreation continues to prioritize ice for the sole purpose of revenue generation, resulting in a very short period where we can access the dry floor.

Our select U11 team attended the Jack Crosby tournament.

Our three U13 teams attended the provincials. Next Fall is a good place to have a conversation about tiering and when we should decide to host a C division. We received negative feedback from many people about the C team being re-tiered back to C. The C team was 1 win, 2 losses. Their placement at provincials is a strong measure of what the provincial C caliber is and it's clear they are a C team. Off note no island teams were in the finals at U13 A, B or C.

We are co hosting the U15 Provincials with VELA and are looking forward to the opportunity, amidst the huge work load our key volunteers are carrying.

Our U17 B team secured a berth at the Provincials and our U17A team lost to JDF in an intense and suspenseful 3 game series, with JDF scoring with 47

seconds left in the 3rd period to win.

Spectator/ parent behaviour continues to be an issue at almost all levels. Something about plexiglass in front of people brings out language, gestures and comments that certainly would never be uttered in their professional workspace.

This is the U11 report for June, as of July 7/23:

- there were only 4 major penalties assessed 2 games were cancelled due to the Alberni highway closure.

There continued to be intermittent on-going challenges with RAMP.

#### C. U13 Geoff Garbutt

The U13 Season has wrapped and provincials have been completed.

Nanaimo was the Island and League A1 winner and represented the Island at provincials (I still need to get them their banners)

Saanich was the Island A2 winner - both Saanich and JDF represented the Island at provincials

Saanich B was the Island and League winner - both Saanich and Comox Valley represented the island at provincials

Saanich C was the Island winner and represented the Island at provincials

I wanted to say thanks to all of the associations for their patience as I took on the role as Interim U13 Commissioner and also to Tim, Stephanie and Doug for helping me as I was a little slow to the uptake in a few items and was away for part of the season for work.

My hats off to all of the VIMLC executive and commissioners for all of their hours

of work in support of the leagues. we couldn't enjoy the Creator's game without all of their efforts and leadership.

Overall from the game perspective it was a fairly uneventful season with a total of approximately 100 games played between the four divisions.

Unfortunately though we were directly impacted near the end of the season by the Highway 4 closure and this limited participation by Alberni Valley in approximately 4 league games but also prohibited their participation in playdowns. Our thoughts go out to their athletes who were unable to carry on and compete for the B division title. I wanted to highlight this and acknowledge that it was a real shame as they were very competitive in the league. Hopefully they were able to end the season as a team with something positive.

On the penalty front I don't know if it was an excessive year but was surprised by the number of majors (approx. 40) and match penalties (approx. 4) for this age group.

I was also disappointed to see the number of very serious coach/ref interactions that included one coach having physical contact with a ref while leaving the floor after being ejected. There were other quite serious altercations with refs by coaches with profanity and threats. This is beyond unacceptable and as a sport we simply must do better.

This was my first run as commissioner and it was an interesting few months, again thanks to all the team managers, presidents and the VIMLC Exec for their support.

#### D. U15 Andy Stuart

The U15 season went well with no major issues.

Comox - B League and Island Champion. Peninsula 2 also secured a berth to the provincials.

32 Player Suspensions, most for a Major in the last 10 minutes of the 3rd period 5 Coach Suspensions, all for Referee Abuse

Spectator behaviour at the playdowns was not great. Two spectators were banned from watching further games.

solutions to fix the problem.
